Action Required: Renew the Project

Reference: HMM-11879

1. On 28 June 1963 we pouched to Headquarters the renewal for Project LIMOTOR under HMA-21650. We had every reason to believe that after a plausible period of time that the Project was undergoing usual Headquarters processing for renewal. We were therefore astonished and disappointed to say the least to learn in Reference (which we received on 9 September, and the separate cover to which we received on 17 September) that on 1 August a Project Extension was requested and not a Project Penewal. In future instances we request that you notify the Station immediately when the usual steps for renewal have not been taken, particularly where Projects are only extended and where you expect the Station to reply three days after the receipt of a dispatch in order to allow for tirely Headquarters submissions about which the Station was belatedly notified. Other priorities have precluded earlier response to Reference.

2. In the interest of time and efficiency we propose to answer below the questions posed in puragraph 5 of attachment

to reference, and have Headquarters resubmit this information as an addendum to, or have it incorporated in the Renewal Pequest forwarded with HMW-21650.

3. The following sub-paragraphs are keyed to Paragraph 5 of attachment to Peferance:

a. During the past Project year, 1 August 1982 through 31 July 1953, the LIMOTOR complex produced 103 individual personality reports; 43 from Seymour D. THINNICH, 2 from LIMIROIL-2, 2 from IMPOTOR-14, 43 from LIMPOR-19, and 13 from LIMCTOR-22. These personality reports can be categorized as follows: personalities known or suspected to belong to or be identified with pro-communist political groupings or philosophies, including Americans; Soviet personalities (LITALON-3); potential operational loads; particularly as it concerns the LIMOTOR effort against the Mexican counterpart of ODACID (see VI. FLANS of the LIPOTOR Project Renewal already forwarded). These personality reports do not include the LIPUTOR coverent of UMAN lecture series given by known anti-American speakers (most of which originated with LIMOTOR-22) nor the regular list of UNAN School for Moreigners obtained by LIMOTOR-19). The LIMOTOR personality reports have not received dissemination, but are aids in terms of CI information and requests from local customers; specific reports are passed to area officers and have been found to be most useful.

b. During the project year 1 August 1962 - 31 July 1963, the LIMTUR complex produced 11 reports on elections held in the various faculties of UNAM (two from Sevensor D. TRIBNICH, 4 from HEPERCHAP, 1 from LIPCTOR-19, and 1 from LIPUTOR-22). These reports are considered excellent corroborative information to the efforts of LICOAX according to the Station KNACLF element. Directly related to the election reports are the reports on individual student party. activities about which LIMCTOR produced eleven reports which the Station's WOLP element is still most interested in receiving on a priority basis. During the period of the student riots and other activities connected with the ouster of Elijde Cortari Forelia, LIBOTOR produced three reports confinding Station efforts. Reports have also been produced on the LILIT-C, LIMPY Student group, and LICOAX, although not in the quantity desired. This explasis has been reflected in the present project year. LIMING-22 has also reported on LICOAX horesevent activities at UNAM and in one instance was a victim of same.

e. Through joint conversations between the KUKEP element and the LINOTOR staffers, more defined areas of interest and activity have been found to which LIMPTOR assets are now being directed. At the same tire LIMCTOR agents are being further trained to prepare their reterial in a more readily disseminable form on subjects of

sufficient interest to contoners. Through these efforts we hope to be able to produce more resitive intelligence disseminations from the LIFOTOR Project.

- d. The following are exemples of LIFOTOR information which was of value to Station case officers;
  - (1) For the KUADLP officers see sub-caragraph above.
  - (2) A check with ligadruarters PEDOX elegents will clearly roweal the contribution made by LIMPTOR-19 to the Buchick/BEFERMAVE couls. This was clearly pointedout in the Project Peneral subsission (please see II ASSETS, C. LIPOTOF-19). During the past project year LLICTON-19 substitted 12 written reports on her contacts with SECHICK. In addition several special meetings were held with her, THIVIICH and Phiness F. SLINKARD for the purrose of briefing and debriofing her on the BECHICT/BETHAVE case. Her most effective role in providing the Station with parallel developments in this important case has drawn the emattent praise of SLINKARD.
  - (3) Corald P. GENTETOER levied a requirement on the LINTER project to produce a lead of a person who could be used as access to a local Soviet known to be OFU and considered a METICAP possibility. Several reports on this lead were submitted by Seymour D. TRINVICH, however, this has not further developed to date. LINTOF-19 also substitled several reports on a Station lead who was a REDEOX candidate. This also did not materialise, but represented a special LIMDIOR effort for a Station case officer.
  - (4) During the surrer of 1963, the Station DIZTAG element in the person of Phiness P. SLINKAHD requested the LINCTOR complex to produce a lead into the local DIETAG cultural society and thus to the local DIETAG diplomatic installation. Although Seymour D. THEWHOL did produce several reports on such a candidate the lead never saterialized but was an example of its value to a Station officer.
- The following are the current outstanding LIPTOR terpeter
  - (1) Communist, pro-communist, and communist front organizations, individuals, and student groupings at the DIAM; the activities of these terrets.
  - (2) Soviet or Soviet bloc personalities known to attend; visit, or otherwise appear at the UNIM
  - (3) Activities of non-communist groups (as a check on our KUKCLF activities)

- (4) Students now attending a special school in Mexico City (separate and distinct from the UMAX) for the purpose of assessment and ultimate recruitment of personalities in the Fbxican equivalent of CDACID. Please see Project Rensel substanton VI. PLANS, 3.
- f. During the Project year 1 August 1962 31 July 1963 there were no commity, cover or control problems.
- g. We have not coordinated the LIMMOR Project with any local CDYCKE, hexican government, or non-vexican government groups. HEPINCH provided the Station with the lead and access to LIMMOR-22 which lead to his recruitment.
- h. The LIPUTOR Staff Agent spends about 2 1/2 hours weekly on each LIPUTOR field agent under normal circumstances, or about 7 to 8 hours weekly. In addition the LIPUTOR Staff Agent is almost constantly on the job living his cover, making contects, and writing-up there contacts. While he spends a good portion of his daily life on the job, it is almost impossible to cite a figure which could accurately state the number of hours he spends on FUBARK/LIPUTOR activities. The inside Case Officer expends an average of four hours weekly on LIPUTOR ratters under normal circumstances. Special activities such as project remember and this dispaton would be exceptions to the norms.
- 4. Concerning paragraph 4 of Reference, it should be quite chear to Headquarters by this writing that LIEPSYNI-2 has been incorporated into the LIEPSYNI Project. Please see 1574-20753, dated 19 Pebruary 1963, H464-11468 dated 12 April 1963, HAMA-21146, dated 26 April 1963; H444-11568, dated 17 May 1963; 1874-21649, dated 28 June 1963; and the LIESTER Project Fonewal substituted under HAMA-21650, dated 27 June 1963. At an appropriate time we will consider changing the LIEPSROIL-2 eraptonym but do not consider it a priority at this time.
- 5. We hope soon to propers a Propers Report on the LIMDROR Project, probably covering the period January—July 1963. Deginning with August 1963 we plan to have Watalie 5. HIGHORY prepare LIMDROR Progress Reports for regular three with periods.
