

THE LONDON THING

Our Capital is internationally recognised as one of the best cities in the world to visit. It is home to countless historic and modern attractions, from the Tower of London to the London Eye, many of which are either on or a short stroll away from a canal or river.



Restaurants and theatres are thriving and with London hosting the 2012 Olympics in the heart of the Bow Back Rivers, what better time to explore its waterways, see the sights and take in a show!

Whether you own a boat or are hiring one, cruising along London's waterways offers a superb range of vistas and attractions, from little-known stretches of beautiful scenery to vibrant centres of entertainment. All along the way you'll see wildlife, history and life, from the Regency splendour of Little Venice to bustling bars of Camden; the gleaming office blocks of Docklands to the rural tranquility of the River Stort and industrial backwaters of the Lower Lee.

British Waterways cares for 100 miles of canals and rivers and 110 acres of docks in London with visitor moorings at key sites offering perfect bases to stop, shop, dine and tour. This guide gives an overview of what's on offer with suggested journeys*, our top 10 mooring sites and a feel for what makes London so special.

^{*}All journeys start from Uxbridge in west London, all cruising times are approximate and miles rounded up.

Journey 1: TO THE HERTFORD UNION RING

- 6 days 52 miles
- 1. Uxbridge to Little Venice (17 miles, 1 lock, 6 hours)
- 2. Little Venice to Islington (4 miles, 4 locks, 3 hours)
- 3. Islington to Limehouse Basin (4 miles, 8 locks, 3 hours)
- 4. Limehouse Basin to Camden
 via Limehouse Cut and Hertford Union (8 miles, 12 locks, 7 hours)
- 5. Camden to Alperton (8 miles, 0 locks, 3 hours)
- 6. Alperton to Uxbridge (11 miles, 1 lock, 4 hours)



Highlights

- restaurants, pubs & cafes in & around beautiful Little Venice with Paddington Basin & Edgware Road shops & supermarkets close by, plus top attractions within easy reach
- Islington's Upper Street shops, restaurants, pubs & cafes, plus Sadler's Wells Theatre in easy reach
- Limehouse Basin just a stone's throw away from Docklands, Canary Wharf, West India Quay, Museum in Docklands, Billingsgate Market & a whole host of restaurants, shops & museums
- glimpse the historic mills at Three Mills Island, gateway to the Bow Back Rivers & Olympic Zone
- exotic markets, pubs, bars & restaurants in lively Camden
- · curry houses on Wembley High Street

Top Tips

- in Maida Hill & Islington tunnels boats may only pass through in one direction at a time so check for oncoming boats
- there are limited free BW visitor moorings at Limehouse

Journey 2: THE RIVERS LEE & STORT

- 11 days 127 miles
- 1. Uxbridge to Paddington Basin (17 miles, 1 lock, 6 hours)
- 2. Paddington Basin to Victoria Park (7 miles, 7 locks, 5 hours)
- 3. Victoria Park to Waltham Abbey (12 miles, 11 locks, 8 hours)
- 4. Waltham Abbey to Hertford (13 miles, 10 locks, 8 hours)
- 5. Hertford to Harlow (11 miles, 10 locks, 7 hours)
- 6. Harlow to Bishop's Stortford (9 miles, 9 locks, 6 hours)
- 7. Bishop's Stortford to Roydon (12 miles, 13 locks, 8 hours)
- 8. Roydon to Cheshunt (6 miles, 7 locks, 4 hours)
- 9. Cheshunt to Limehouse Basin via Limehouse Cut (15 miles, 9 locks, 8 hours)
- 10. Limehouse Basin to Islington (4 miles, 8 locks, 4 hours)
- 11. Islington to Uxbridge (21 miles, 5 locks, 8 hours)

Highlights

- Waltham Abbey, Royal Gunpowder Mills & Gunpowder Park
- · picturesque gazebos in Ware
- restaurants, pubs, antique shops & supermarket, plus castle & museum in historic Hertford
- · tranquility & remoteness of River Stort
- · circular walks at Harlow Mill
- ancient market town of Bishop's Stortford, with castle remains, medieval buildings, plus 16th & 17th century pubs
- timber fronted Tudor buildings & shops at Sawbridgeworth
- picturesque Roydon with 13th century church, village green with stocks & pubs up the hill
- riverside pub & access to Lee Valley Park walks at pretty Broxbourne

Top Tips

- at Stansted Lock on River Lee the swing-bridge must be swung open before using the lock
- winding for boats up to 70ft in Hertford above Folly Bridge
- width of River Stort locks is just 13ft so two narrowboats cannot fit side by side
- watch out for canoes below Burnt Mill Lock (No 6) on the River Stort & at Stonebridge Lock on the River Lee
- bridge 7 at Roydon on the River Stort can become impassable during very high water levels & flooding

Journey 3: THE LONDON RING

- 4 days 50 miles
- 1. Uxbridge to Little Venice (17 miles, 1 lock, 6 hours)
- 2. Little Venice to Limehouse Basin (8 miles, 12 locks, 7 hours)
- 3. Limehouse Basin to Brentford via the Thames (15 miles, 3 locks, 4 hours)
- 4. Brentford to Uxbridge (10 miles, 11 locks, 6 hours)

Recommended for experienced boaters only. Special arrangements required.

Highlights

- Regent's Park & Zoo see Snowdon's aviary and catch a glimpse of some of London Zoo's inhabitants
- Limehouse Basin once the hub of the canal system nationwide now full of boats from around the world
- River Thames a thrilling view of worldfamous landmarks & fascinating monuments including Tower Bridge, the Houses of Parliament & Somerset House
- Brentford home to a dense network of wharves, docks and bridges, shops & restaurants on the High Street, plus new riverside eateries
- Hanwell Flight of locks & Brunel's Three
 Bridges, both Scheduled Ancient Monuments

Top Tips

- plan carefully before going on to the River Thames
- contact British Waterways' lock keepers at Limehouse for lock & tide times
 T 020 7308 9930
- make sure you have all provisions for your Thames journey as there are no places to stop before Brentford
- stretch between Brentford gauging lock & Thames lock is tidal so be aware of limited headroom under Brentford High Street bridge. To check tides at Brentford





Attractions walking distance: Syon Park; Royal Botanic Gardens at Kew; Kew Bridge Steam Museum; Brentford High Street shops, Osterley Park & House & Boston Manor House & Park.

Short tube/bus journey: Madam Tussaud's & Planetarium; Royal Academy; National Gallery; West End theatres, shops & restaurants; Notting Hill; High Street Kensington; Hyde Park; Kensington Gardens & Palace.

Facilities: 24 hour visitor moorings; Elsan; pump-out; water; toilets; showers; rubbish disposal; laundry; groceries & pubs close by; BW keys & licences plus electricity & pump-out cards at marina office

South Mill Lock

Transport: Limehouse station, Docklands Light Railway

Attractions walking distance: Mile End Park; Three Mills; Ragged School Museum; Canary Wharf & West India Quay shops, restaurants, pubs; Museum in Docklands

Short DLR journey: Greenwich with Cutty Sark, Observatory, museums, markets, shops & restaurants.
