


Liverpool's canals and docks

Liverpool's canals and docks have brought the world into the city. They form a backdrop to one of the most vibrant and culturally diverse cities in Britain. Blending historical sights with cosmopolitan bars, shops, restaurants and galleries, Liverpool's canals and docks offer the best of a modern city: a heady mix of relaxation and activity, combined with a rich legacy of heritage and history.

Albert Dock

Named for Queen Victoria's beloved consort, heritage signs point the way toward historic Albert Dock. The South Docks comprise 10 networked docks, with Albert Dock its glittering centrepiece, opened by Prince Albert in 1846. Liverpool's most visited tourist hub attracts global attention – from Japanese and American Beatles aficionados to football followers from the soccer capitals of Europe. Take a daytime stroll and browse gift shops, cafés and contemporary restaurants. By evening it's a buzz of waterside activity, offering eclectic food and contemporary drinks in its burgeoning bars and restaurants.

Liverpool canal link

Water space lies at the heart of city tourism renaissance

British Waterways is fulfilling a key role in the continuing resurgence of Liverpool's water space — from constructing the stunning Pier Head Canal Link to carefully managing the entire South Docks

> As the world-class waterfront continues to grow in stature with Liverpool's cultural renaissance, British Waterways is on hand to ensure the city's unique waterway heritage continues to sit within the heart of this rejuvenation.

> Last year British Waterways opened the £22m Liverpool Canal Link welcoming visiting craft from across the country to take part in an epic journey from Leeds into Liverpool. The canal link completes a long-awaited water link which forms the final elusive piece in a canal jigsaw which dates back over 200 years.

For the first time in over a century canal boats can now navigate the 127 mile long Leeds & Liverpool Canal straight into the heart of Liverpool. This new link brings fresh economic benefits to Liverpool, echoing a time when the city's docks were an international hub for inland waterways freight.

From the very start, canal boats played the lead role in promoting the trade and wealth of this city, shipping raw materials into the manufacturing hubs of Lancashire and Yorkshire, returning with finished goods for export to the world's markets.

Now the wealth is being generated by another type of water traffic - the arrival of pleasure craft eager



to cruise via the canals and waterways of Britain right into the heart of this vibrant visitor destination.

The Leeds & Liverpool Canal is the longest man made waterway in the UK – a testament to the ingenuity and perseverance of those who laboured on its lengthy construction in the 1790s.

The ambitious £22m Liverpool Canal Link creates a long-standing dream: to forge the last link in a waterway chain ultimately joining this historic waterfront with the North Sea nearly 130 miles to

The 92 locks of the Leeds & Liverpool Canal tamed the forbidding Pennines in an astonishing feat of engineering. And forty years of hard labour and financial difficulty were to pass before this waterway helped fuel the expansion of this city and the prosperity of its booming population.

Today this motorway from a bygone era is serving another purpose as an open leisure space everyone can enjoy. It teems with wildlife, tranquil backwaters and stunning panoramic views as it snakes out of the city, north across the rural hinterlands of Merseyside, then east toward Yorkshire and the North Sea.

Anderton

If you fancy a trip out then a visit to the Anderton Boat Lift near Northwich is a great way to spend the day. Built in 1875, it provided a towering link between the ports of the mighty River Mersey and the industrial Midland heartlands. The huge structure still dominates the waterway landscape today, transferring water craft and the Edwin Clark trip boat effortlessly between the Trent & Mersey Canal and River Weaver 50 feet below as it has done for over a century. Now with a modern operations centre and interactive exhibition, the 'Cathedral of Canals' is in its ninth season since being reopened in 2002.

From the urban heartland of Liverpool's docks to the edge of rural Merseyside there's always something fun to do by the water. Simply follow the A59 from the city centre and you'll find a rural retreat on your doorstep.

Canalside towns

The canalside towns of Sefton, Maghull and Lydiate are a short distance from the centre of Liverpool and ideal for a countryside stroll or cycle ride to blow away the cobwebs. The area is a haven for wildlife, including red squirrels and natterjack toads, and keep your eyes open for rare plants such as the Dune Helleborine orchid.
