Brindleyplace

Ideal for a visit in all weathers, Brindleyplace lies just off the New Main Line Canal and only a short walk from the Worcester & Birmingham Canal. This is where you will find the National Sea Life Centre and the Ikon Gallery, as well as cafés, bars and restaurants.



The Mailbox

The Worcester & Birmingham Canal is an easy way to reach the Bullring's 140 shops, or The Mailbox – which includes Harvey Nichols amongst its retail attractions.



Jewellery Quarter

Leave the canal at Lock 11 of the Farmers Bridge flight, Ludgate Hill, and you're only a short walk from the diamonds and pearls of the famous Jewellery Quarter.

Gas Street Basin

Named because it was the first place in Birmingham to be lit by gaslights, Gas Street Basin was a busy canal terminal for the loading and unloading of coal, glass and chocolate crumb. It lies mostly on the New Main Line Canal – built by Thomas Telford to cut seven miles off the journey from Birmingham to Wolverhampton. The basin is still bustling, but now as the heart of the city's modern regeneration.

Art at the basins

Discovery Trail

A self-guided tour by map discovering the history of the basins, including research and archaeology unearthed during the recent restoration project. The trail explains the background to new interpretive landscape features.

Black Water, Brown Water

One of a number of arts pieces, this mystical sound walk immerses the listener in the worlds of Sabrina the Goddess for the River Severn and James Brindley the great Canal Engineer. Adds a fascinating experience to a visit to the canal basins. This sound walk requires an MP3 player which is available to borrow from the Windlass Café.

Hatton Locks

Originally built to link the industrialised Midlands with London, the canal from Warwick to Birmingham features a steep series of 21 locks at Hatton, taking it out of the Avon Valley, fondly known as the stairway to heaven by the boating community.

A walk on the wild side

The interpretive Nature Trail around Hatton Locks features six wildlife markers, positioned at specific locations, to help you spot the wide variety of wildlife living in the area.

Stepping out

There are three circular walks around Hatton Locks, which take in towpaths, public footpaths through fields, and some roads. You can follow the routes featured in the Hatton Circular Walks leaflet (available from the café or www.waterscape.com), or combine walks to create your own route.

Where to fish

Coarse fishing is available at nearby Blythe Waters, 10 miles from Hatton Locks. For further details contact enquiries.westmidlands@britishwaterways.co.uk

Access for all

The café is accessible for wheelchairs.

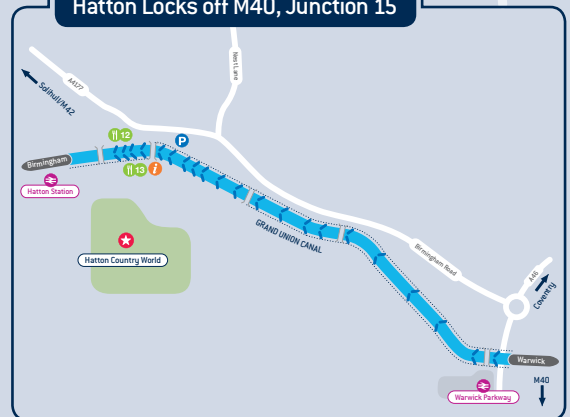
