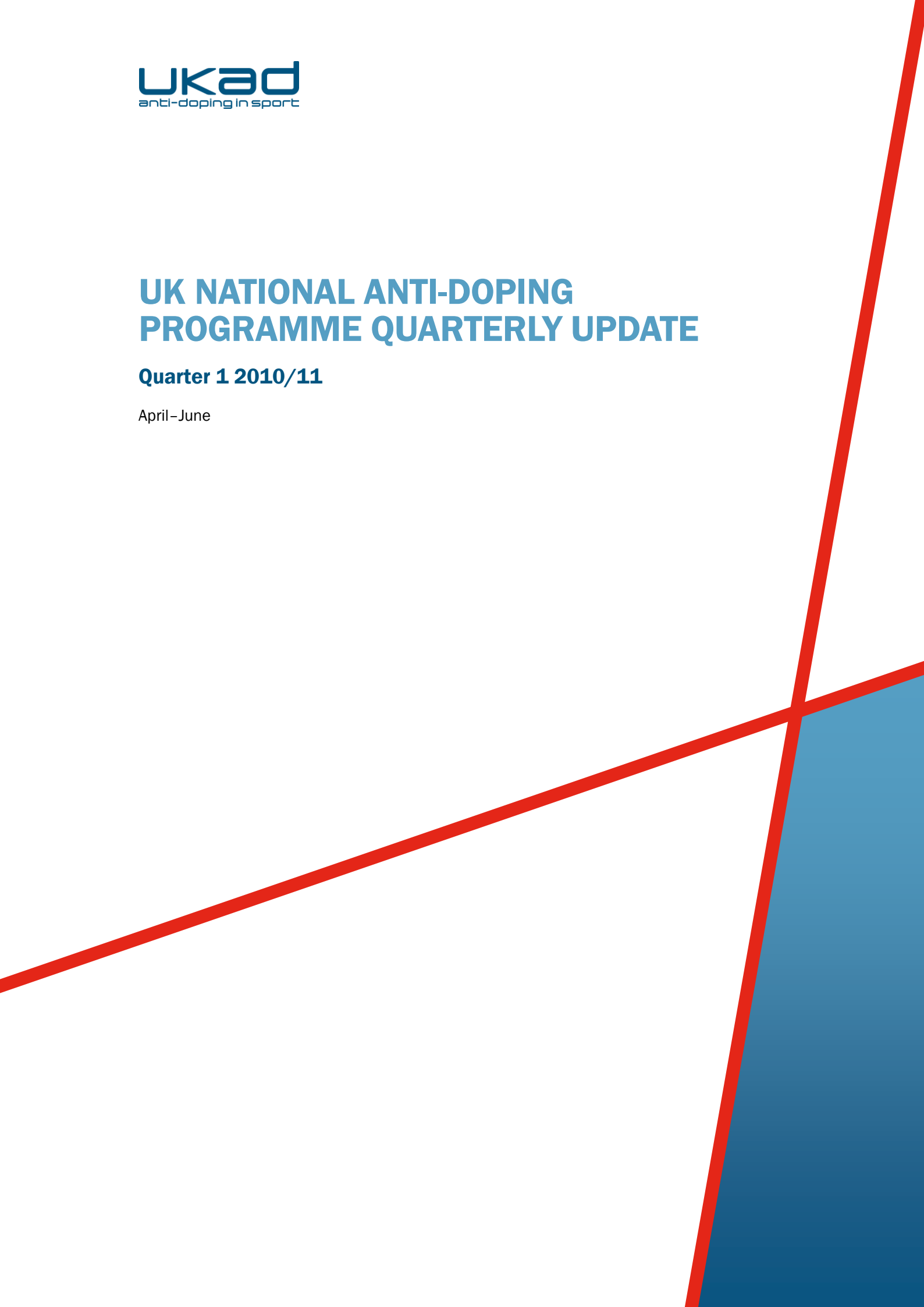

Table 1: Testing programme summary

The period under review in this report is 1 April–30 June 2010. During this time, the domestic and international Anti-Doping Testing Programme carried out 1,746 missions.

Of the 1,745 missions in quarter 1, 364 (20.9%) were attempted under the jurisdiction of an International Federation.

UK Anti-Doping’s agreement with the Department for Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) includes the following key commitment:

- Ensure at least 60% of Missions across the programme are no advance notice, out-of-competition tests.

In quarter 1 2010/11, 43% of missions fall into this category:

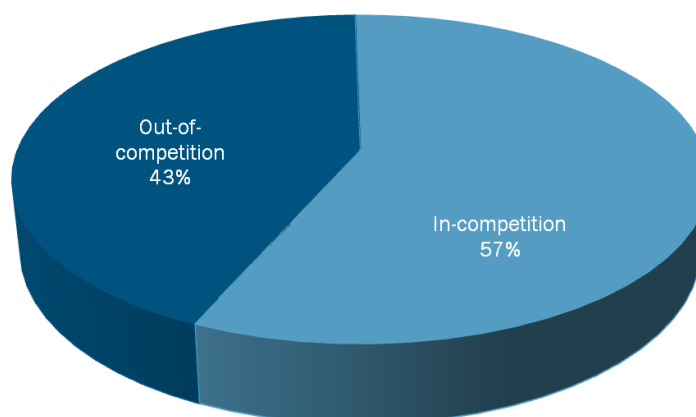


Table 3: Possible Anti-Doping Rule Violations – Summary of category of substance (closed cases, reported in the past 12 months)
