Who is Hannah Stodel? Despite being born without a right forearm, Hannah has adapted different techniques to overcome her disability. Having joined the RYA Mirror National Junior Squad in 1995, Hannah went on to become the first British woman to compete in a sailing competition at a Paralympic Games in the Sonar at Athens 2004 as well as winning back-to-back World Championships in 2005 & 2006.

She thinks the toughest part of the sport is the constant thought that goes into everything and the fact it's a never ending process to stay on top. She admits she always finds herself thinking of the next move and finds it hard to turn off from the sailing world.

Inspired by Dame Ellen Macarthur's sheer determination and can-do attitude, Hannah was named Yachting Journalists Association Young Sailor of the Year 1999. She says among her most embarrassing sailing experiences include having to wee on the boat with two guys as well as once stepping off the back and missing land!
