

Whether you want to ride big waves or sail whilst on holiday. windsurfing is exciting and great fun for everyone.

FAST FACTS

- You can sail in all sorts of places around the world both inland (on lakes, reservoirs and gravel pits) and on coastal waters.
- Did you know that speeds of 50 knots have been recorded on a windsurfer?

WANT TO LEARN?

- To learn to windsurf you will need minimal kit as most training centres and clubs will have boards and a wetsuit for you to use.
- You should try to take along sunglasses, sun block and maybe

a pair of wetsuit boots. Apart from this all you need is a towel, some trendy beach shorts and a rash vest!

- Getting the hang of windsurfing is simple; you will stand on the board and hold the sail with your hands and feet roughly shoulder width apart.
- Once you've mastered the basics you'll be able to learn tricks and turns to make you look even more cool!

Follow one of the RYA windsurfing schemes and you will quickly learn all the skills needed to sail fast and safely. The RYA offers a beginners 'Stage 1' course which teaches all the basics - find out more at www.rya.org.uk

In an emergency you need to be able to spell the name of your boat by phonetic alphabet. Practise your boat name until you can do it without thinking!
