HAVE FUN ON THE WATER THIS SUMMER!

There are loads of fun games you can play with your friends on or off the water this summer! Here are just two games: one for when you're out on a boat and one for when the weather's bad and you can't go sailing.

Here's a game called 'Tig' to play out on the water

- Set out a sailing area with marker buoys
- From the boat you're on, throw a large soft ball into the water. Whoever picks it up first is 'it' They must then 'Tig' another boat by hitting any part
- of that boat with the ball The boat that has been hit is now 'it' and has to
- 'Tig' another boat and so the game goes on It's a fun game which also helps you steer and
- sail close to other boats! ...and here's one for when you can't go sailing:

Port - Starboard Game

- Using a piece of chalk draw out a large boat on the ground,
- as if you were a bird looking down at it from the sky The game starts by everyone standing in the middle of the 'boat'
- One person calls out 'port' or, 'starboard', or 'bow' or 'stern'
- Everyone then has to run to that part of the boat
- Last one there is out!

Odd One Out

Here's what the other words mean...

Cleat: T-shaped piece of wood or metal to attach ropes
