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

11 The RYA Teaching Method – Adaptations for Multihulls

Using the righting line, both of the crew can the lean back, using their body weight to begin the righting process. The hull of the boat will have awing downwind of the rig. Consequently, the wind will now be biowing on the transposite to wind will now be biowing on the transposite to swung downwind of the rig. 


