Part 1 2012/13 RYA Volvo National Youth Squad Selection

1. Introduction

This document should be read in conjunction with the RYA YSG "Guidelines for Selection" which is available from the RYA website.

The RYA Volvo National Youth Squad (NYS) has two separate training periods, each with a distinct squad entry point. A main entry point in September and a review point in April. Each uses specified indicator events from which both results based places and discretionary selected places will be allocated. The timings and principles are outlined below:

2. Selection

Selection of the sailors will be determined by independent Selectors who are appointed by the RYA Youth Steering Group (YSG). Their remit is to select those sailors, who in their opinion have a combination of:

- 1. The best prospects of winning medals at World and European Championships now and in the future,
- 2. The best prospects of winning medals at the ISAF Youth Sailing World Championships,
- 3. The best prospects of successfully following an Olympic pathway.

Process:

A number of places will normally be allocated to the **highest ranked eligible sailors at the primary indicator event(s) using the process and criteria listed in appendices A, B, C, D and E.** Remaining places will be allocated at the discretion of the selectors using their interpretation of the criteria listed in 2.1 to 2.3 and in item 7. In exercising their discretion selectors will normally only consider performances at the primary and secondary indicator events which are listed in Appendix A and B respectively.

In exceptional cases sailors who are identified at other times may still be selected and invited to join the RYA Volvo National Youth Squad. This may involve being invited to train alongside the RYA Volvo National Youth Squad for one or more camps, and will usually be subject to delivering a satisfactory performance at the *nominated squad review event(s)*. Exceptionally, should there be no suitable squad review within a reasonable time frame, consideration may be given to other significant class regattas or training in order to confirm a full place in the squad.

Sailors, who are invited to train alongside on a trial basis, or regarding whom a decision is deferred (usually because in the opinion of the selectors they are on the periphery of squad selection), may subsequently be invited to join the squad at a later date.

3. Eligibility

Normally, to be eligible for selection, sailors must:

- 1. At the time of selection be eligible to compete for Great Britain at an ISAF sanctioned event as defined in ISAF Regulation 24.5.
- 2. For the International Competition period (i.e. April selection); be aged U19 on the 31 December 2012, or exceptionally U19 on the 1st September 2012 (see below).
- 3. For the **Main training period (i.e. September selection)** be U18 on the 31 December 2012, or exceptionally U18 on the 1st September 2012 (see below).
- 4. For **Laser Standard Sailors only**: be aged U21 on the 31st December 2012 for the International Competition period [April] or U20 on the 31 December 2012 for the Main training period [Sept], latterly this is in order to enable sailors to be eligible for U21 International Competition in 2013.

In exceptional circumstances, sailors who do not comply with 3.1 may nevertheless be eligible and selected if expressly confirmed by the RYA Racing Manager. Such sailors will be required to carry GBR on their sails and may be required to sign a written declaration of intent to comply with 3.1.

In order to help sailing partnerships stay together and allow sailors to progress at a rate consistent with the maturation of their 'academic' peers, sailors remain eligible for selection in all classes apart from the Laser Standard (where eligibility for international regattas is governed by the ILCA) for the international competition phase when one or both members of the team are aged U19 on the 1 September 2012, provided they were born between 1 September and 31 December inclusive. For the main training phase sailors remain eligible for selection when a member of the team is U18 on the 1 September 2012, provided their date of birth is between 1 September and 31 December inclusive. In both cases it is still necessary for the other member of the team to be eligible and comply with the eligibility criteria as listed in points 3.3 or 3.4 above.

Rationale: This helps older sailors, who in some cases may be in their final school year, to remain part of the programme. Previously they would not otherwise have been eligible due to their 'sailing' age.

Selection to the RYA Volvo National Youth Squad (NYS) is conditional upon a full commitment to all continuing to satisfy the criteria, complying with all terms and conditions within the squad contract, fulfilling all squad training requirements (unless dispensation has been sought) and adherence to a personal competition and training programme.

Sailors who wish to be considered for a place in the RYA Volvo National Youth Squad must be a member of the RYA and also apply on-line at www.ryaracingevents.org.uk.

4. Anticipated RYA Volvo National Youth Squad sizes

Appendices A and B outline the intended RYA Volvo National Youth Squad sizes, number of girl places, as well as the anticipated number of places which will be allocated from the results.

5. National Youth Squad Indicator Events

Appendices A and B also detail the three categories of events which contribute to selection decisions. These are:

- 5.1. **Primary**, which are used principally to allocate results based places.
- 5.2. **Secondary**, which are used in conjunction with **primary** indicators to make discretionary selections, and
- 5.3. Nominated squad review events which are used (exceptionally) to select additional sailors or to conclude the selections in the event that some or all selection decisions are deferred. These sailors would not normally have been invited initially from the primary and secondary indicator events. More commonly these will be used to review the performance of those sailors invited to train alongside the RYA Volvo National Youth Squad prior to confirming a full NYS status.

6. Selection Committee

The selection committee is appointed by the RYA Youth Steering Group, and currently comprises of the following group of individuals, none of whom will have eligible children within the class:

7. Selection Criteria

RYA Selectors will normally use one or more of the following criteria to select sailors in accordance with the YSG Guidelines for Selection:

- Performance at the *Primary Indicator event*.
- Performance at the Secondary Indicator event(s).
- Performance at *nominated squad review(s)*.

Additionally, at the discretion of the selectors the following may be taken into account where required:

- Performance at other identified squad review events.
- Age, height and weight.
- Performance at a significant international regatta.
- Performance at major national events/training.
- Future potential.
- Goals and aspirations.
- Attitude and behaviour at the events in the series and during previous training.
- Factors affecting results.
- Class ranking lists.
- Any other factors the selectors consider appropriate.

Selectors or their representatives may attend events during the year to gather information upon which to make their decisions. They may also review the data and information provided as part of the application process, and monitor the results and seek relevant reports from the *primary* and *secondary indicators* and *squad review events*. In making decisions they may also seek input from coaches and class association representatives.

8. Notification

Applicants will be notified in writing as soon as is practically possible after the completion of the final indicator event, and usually within 14 days. Successful sailor's names will be published on the RYA web-site once all attendance confirmation forms/contracts have been returned to the office – it is not our policy to publish this information before this time.

9. Part 2 - 2012 RYA supported international event/grant selection

Following the secondary entry point and NYS review in April the selectors will, where possible, allocate results based international travel grants and places within RYA teams as well as make any discretionary decisions using the criteria listed in items 2 and 7. The likely size of any RYA teams, the process, number of grants available and the likely notification date is outlined in Appendix C.

Unless otherwise stated, or unless the eligibility criteria for the regatta differs, where an age category is mentioned as part of the results based criteria this shall be assumed to be as of 1st September 2012. If any nominated age category grants are not awarded, usually because sufficient eligible sailors do not win places in teams via the class selection process then that grant will revert to being offered at the discretion of the RYA Volvo NYS selectors. This may result in that grant being offered in whole, in part or not at all depending on the selector's appraisal of the best way of fulfilling the remit of item 2.

Where results based places are highlighted in the appendix and there are no sailors fulfilling the age, gender or results criteria then the place may either be withdrawn or awarded on a discretionary basis.

Sailors may only accept a grant for a given regatta from either the Youth or Olympic programme, not both. Where a selected sailor has already been offered an ODS grant for that regatta then the grant may either be offered or another sailor or withheld entirely.

Additional support may be provided for other events identified later in the year as relevant international competition experience by the head coach. This will be dependent on funding at that time.

10. Part 3 – RYA Volvo Tailored Support (TS) Programme

The RYA TS programme aims to support those youth sailors with most potential to achieve success and medal at major international regattas now and in the future and progressing to the Olympic programme. It provides additional training for a small number of sailors supplementary to the core RYA Volvo National Youth Squad programme designed to enable the smoothest progression to Olympic class sailing.

Selected sailors will normally access the following support:

- Additional individual Strength and Conditioning information and advice.
- Access to relevant performance specialists.
- Additional Small group training.
- Additional international regatta support where international calendars allow.

11.TS Programme selections

TS Programme selections will be made by the selectors using the eligibility criteria and processes outlined in items 2, 3, 5, 6 and 7 and appendix D.

12. Anticipated TS Group sizes

The anticipated training group sizes, the processes which govern the allocation of places and the *primary* and *secondary* indicator events are outlined in appendix D.

A number of the TS training group places will be determined from the results of the primary indicator event; other places may be offered on the basis of performance at both the primary and secondary indicator events or from the identified squad reviews. Should there be no suitable squad review in a reasonable time frame; consideration will exceptionally be given to other significant class regattas/training.

13. Sailors who feel they may meet the eligibility criteria for Paralympic competition

The RYA endeavours to keep those sailors who feel they may ultimately be eligible for the Paralympics within mainstream race and race training programmes for as long as is practically possible, as we consider this the most effective way to facilitate their development. Sailors are then either transferred across to the Olympic programme or the Paralympic programme, or invited to participate in both of them in parallel should this be considered most effective. Sailors or parents who would like further advice or feel they may meet the relevant criteria are encouraged to discuss in more detail with the relevant RYA Manager.

15. Appeals

There will be no appeals against the published selection criteria or the actions of the selectors, provided they follow the selection criteria. By entering the selection process sailors agree to this condition. The grounds for appeal are limited to allegations of:

- I. Failure to follow due process
- II. Bias/undue influence
- III. Some other misconduct

The criteria for appeal may not include any alleged error of judgement of the selectors. Should an appeal still arise then it should be submitted to the Racing Manager within 5 days of the selection being announced. The full Appeals document is available on request from the RYA Racing Operations Manager.

16. Status

The Royal Yachting Association (RYA)'s policies and procedures are subject to change from time to time, including variations required to comply with Sports Councils' directions on the investment of National Lottery funds.

The RYA reserves the right to amend, supplement and/or discontinue at its absolute discretion, for whatever reason, any or all of its policies and procedures.

Grants will be repayable upon notification, if the competitor does not attend the regatta(s) for any reason. The RYA reserves the right NOT to provide international competition grants or withhold them for any reason.
