# Claritas' 2008 Demographic Updates

(In the Executive Summaries, "Current Year" is 2008; "Five Years From Now" is 2013.)

## **Population & Household Estimates**

The Claritas Demographic Estimation Program is in its fourth decade. Demographers now with Claritas did the industry's groundbreaking work in small area estimation. Neighborhood-level growth/decline is tracked from annual acquisition of current, small area data from across the nation.

The Claritas Demographic Estimation Program draws upon the strengths of five pioneering programs including National Planning Data Corporation; Donnelley Marketing Information Services; National Decisions Systems; Claritas and Market Statistics. Claritas is actively contributing to the planning of Census 2010.

## **Top-Down/Bottom-Up Methodologies**

Claritas estimates combine the strengths of top-down and bottom-up methods. Postcensus data for tracts and block groups drive the estimates at those levels, while Postcensus data for cities, counties, and states drive the estimates at those levels. The small area estimates are then adjusted to conform with the independent estimates for larger areas. This approach is common because it is designed to achieve maximum accuracy at all levels.

In a bottom-up approach Claritas identifies growth trends using small data sources such as USPS, local government agencies (where available), ADVO new construction data, and the Claritas Master Address File. The Master Address File contains over 135 million records and is informed by various household level sources such as Equifax, ADVO, InfoUSA, Targus, and TeleAtlas North America.

## **Rapid Population Growth or Decline**

Census tracts where data indicates dramatic growth or decline are reviewed individually through a process called the Rapid Change Review. This involves a closer examination of input data plus cross checks among alternative sources.

Effective with the 2008 Update, ADVO data on new housing units were introduced. This source provides a powerful indication of which small areas have experienced significant housing growth in recent years, and is making valuable contributions to the Rapid Change Review process.

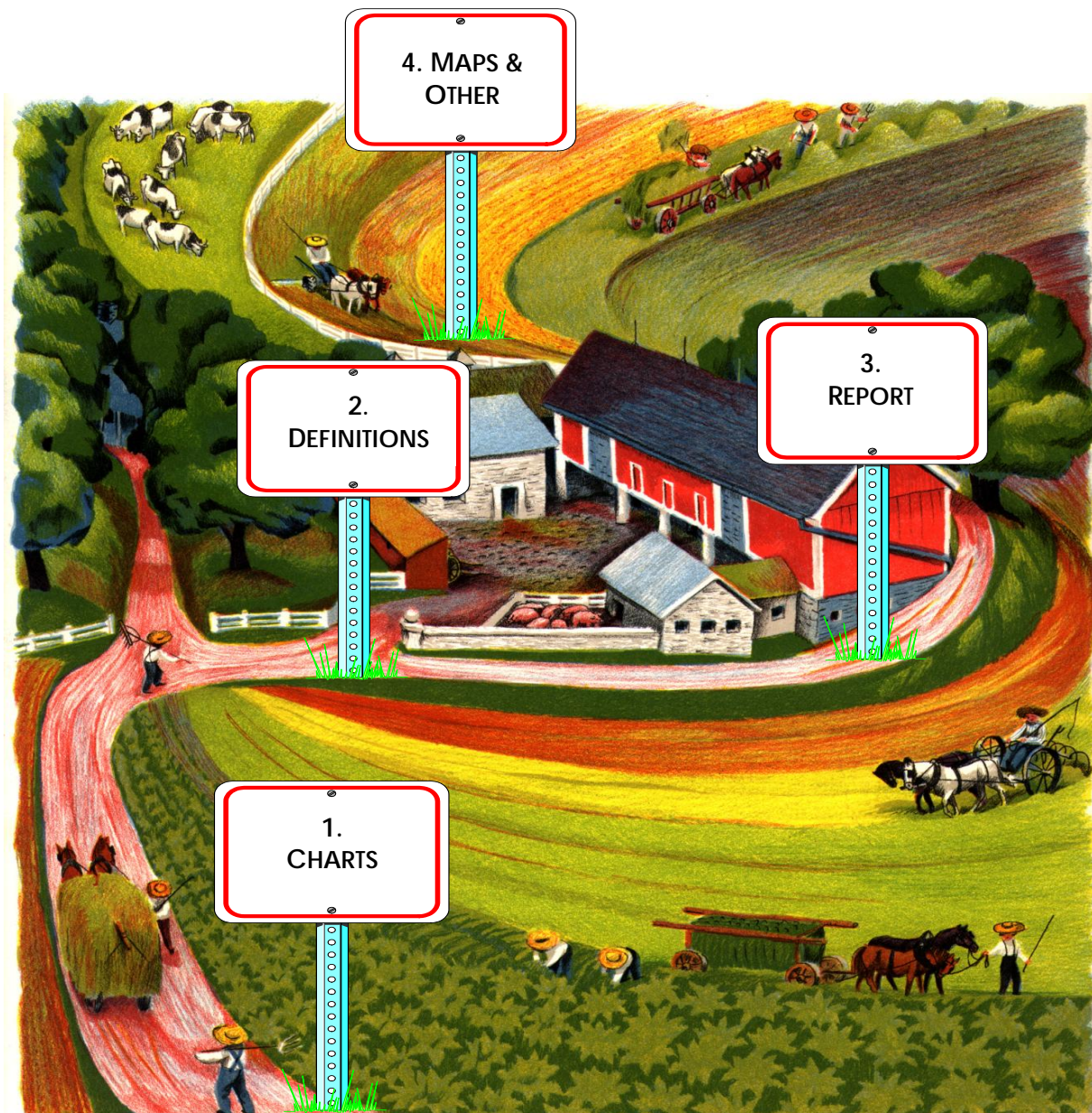

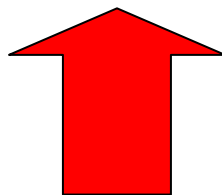
## ***A BRIEF NOTE ABOUT HEADERS, FOOTERS & RELEASE DATES***

**In March 2008, the Census Bureau released estimated components of population change for the period April 1, 2000 - July 1, 2007, at the COUNTY level.**

**In the CHARTS section of your report binder, the chart marked "COC1" in the bottom margin (the *footer*) contains this new information. The release date (March 2008) is shown in the top margin (the *header*). *If your ministry area is within a metropolitan/micropolitan area larger than one county, you will also have a chart marked "COC2" in its footer.***

**The chart marked "RHO1" in its footer contains July 2007 estimates for RACE/HISPANIC ORIGIN data, at the COUNTY level, which the Census Bureau released August 2008. (July 2008 estimates for this data will probably be released August or September 2009.) *If your ministry area is within a metropolitan/micropolitan area larger than one county, you will also have a chart marked "RHO2" in its footer.***

**Headers show the time period covered by the estimates AND the date the Census Bureau released that information to the public.**







## Comparing Race Data From Census 2000 With Race Data From Previous Censuses

“Data on race from Census 2000 are not directly comparable with those from the 1990 census and previous censuses due, in large part, to giving respondents **the option to report more than one race.**”

U. S. Census Bureau

For the first time--in Census 2000--respondents were given the option of reporting **more than one race.** The instructions read: “**Mark one or more races** to indicate what this person considers himself/herself to be.”

**Census 2000 race categories** were **1) White Alone; 2) Black or African American Alone; 3) American Indian or Alaska Native Alone; 4) Asian Alone; 5) Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander Alone; 6) Some Other Race Alone; and 7) Two or More Races.**

**Claritas Estimates and Projections** use the same race categories as above.

**Census 1990 race categories** were **1) White; 2) Black; 3) American Indian, Eskimo or Aleut; 4) Asian or Pacific Islander; and 5) Other race.**

According to the Census Bureau, in Census 2000 about 43 percent of Hispanics or Latinos classified themselves as “Some Other Race” and 97 percent of persons who reported as “Some Other Race” were Hispanic or Latino.



Hispanics may be of **ANY** race.

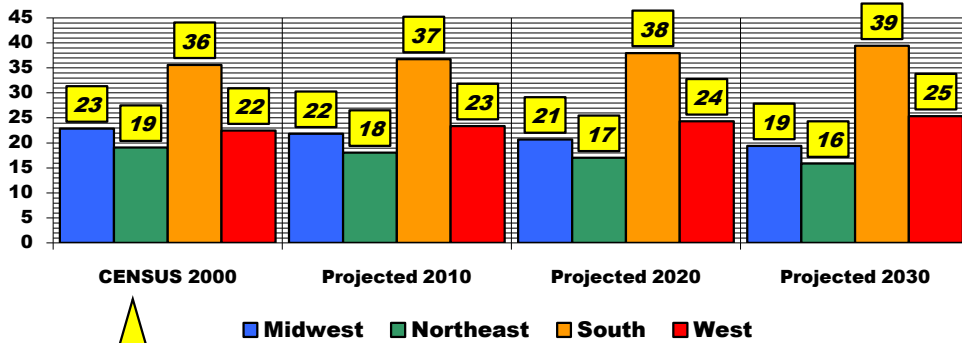

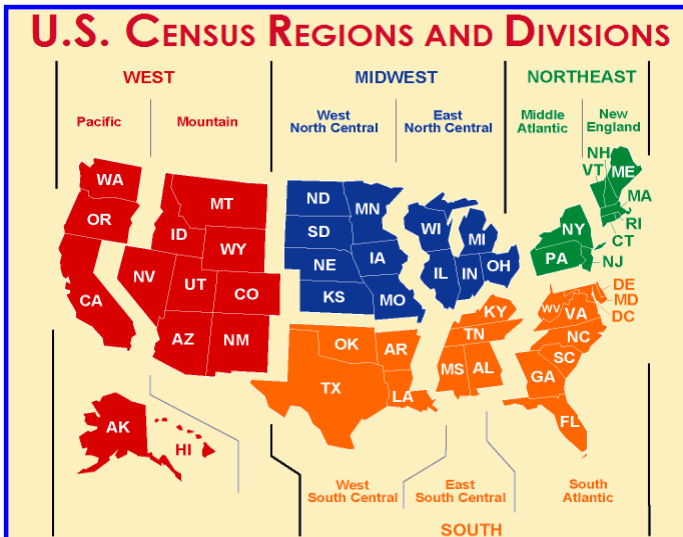
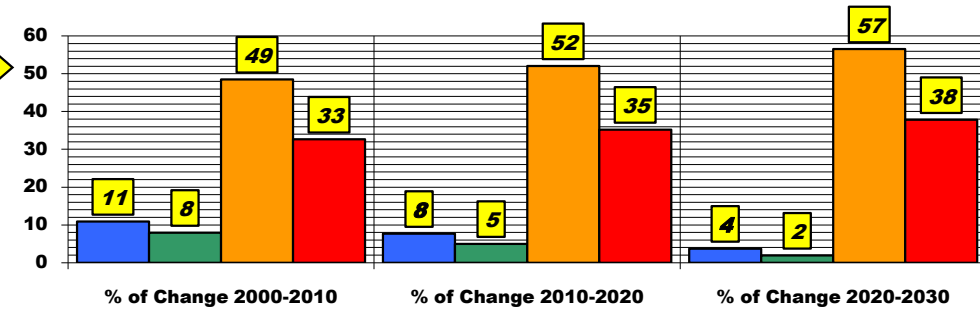

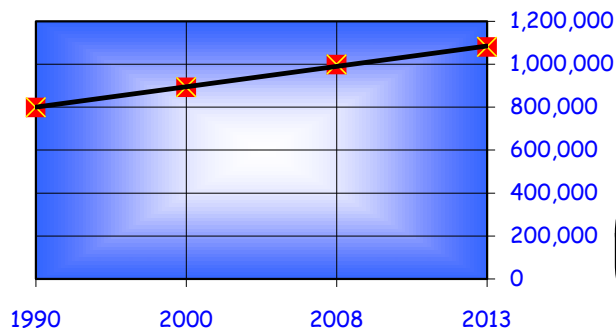

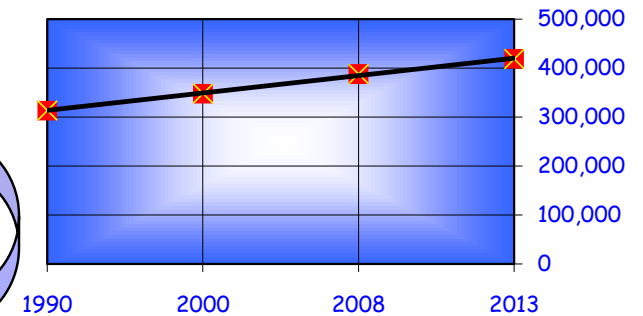

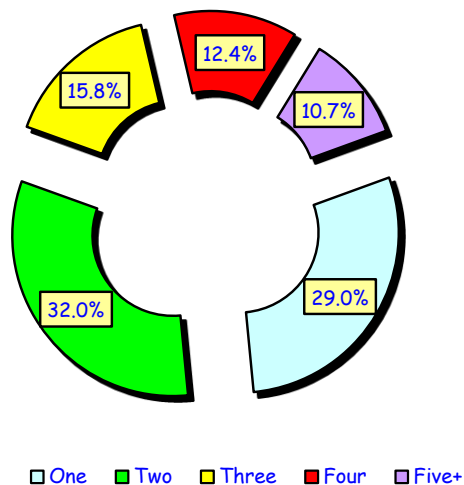

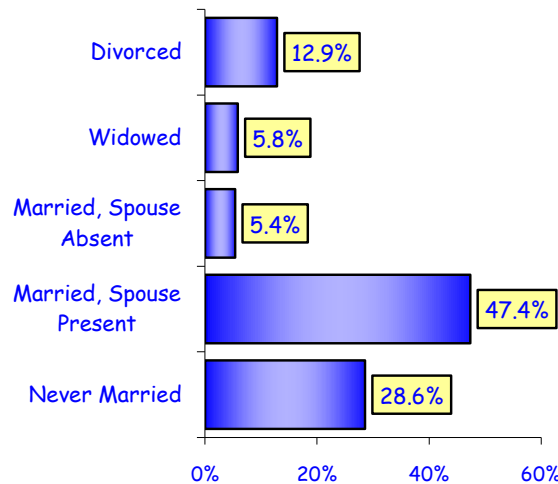

## 2008 Household Size, Marital Status, and 2008 Population by Age Group

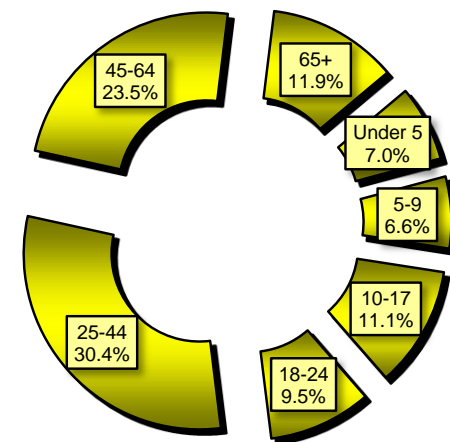
Households by Number of Persons

Population by Age Group





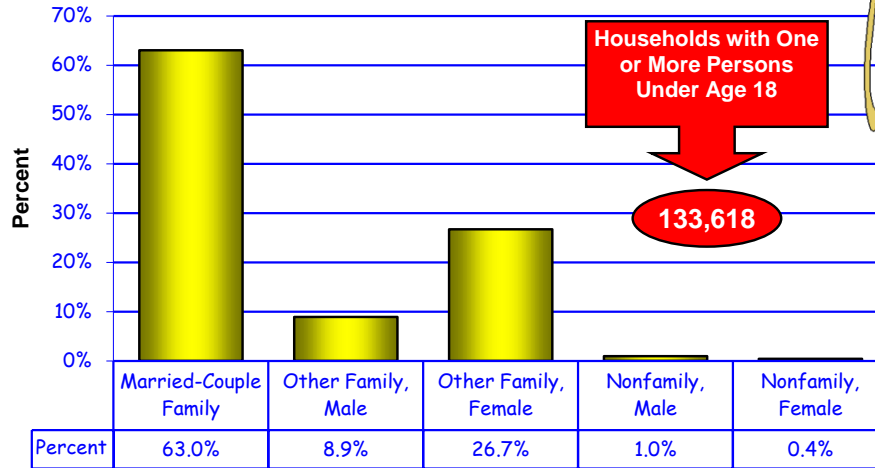

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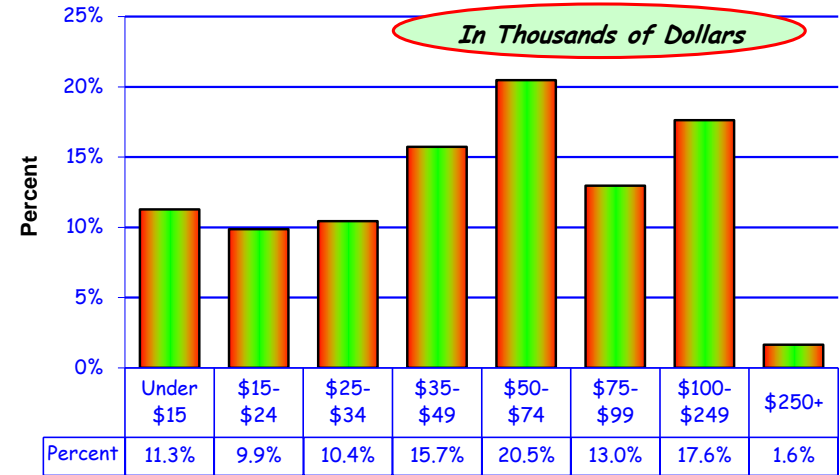

### 2008 Households With Person(s) Under Age 18

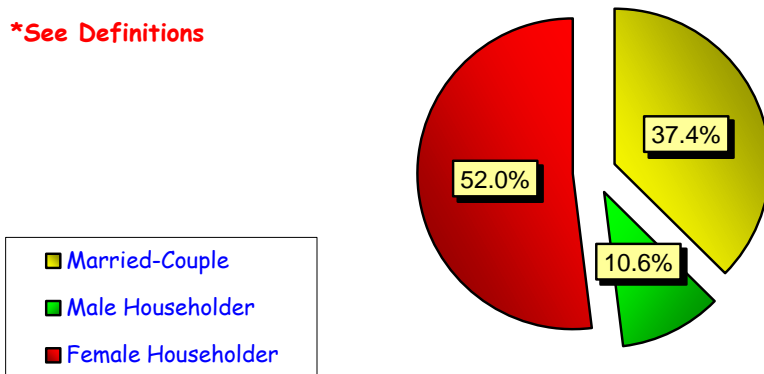


### 2008 Households by Household Income

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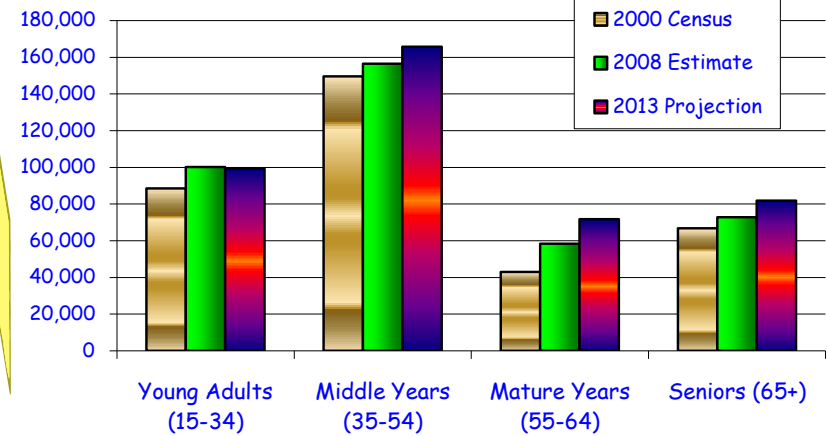

### 2008 Educational Attainment Population Age 25+



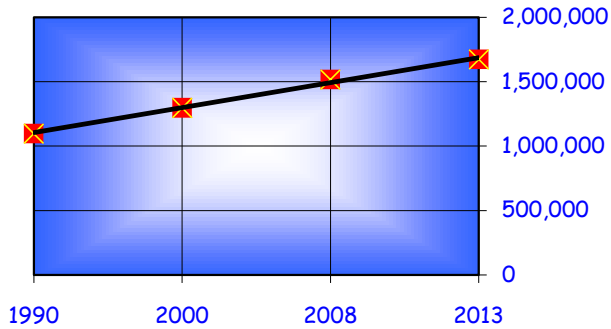

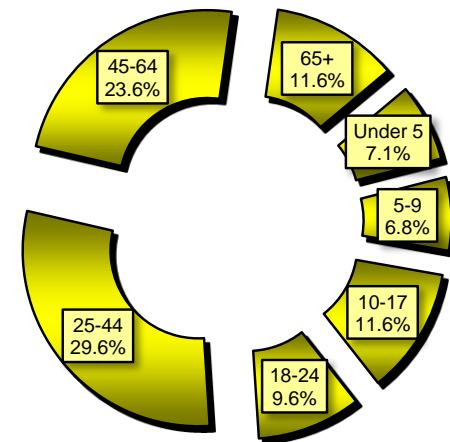

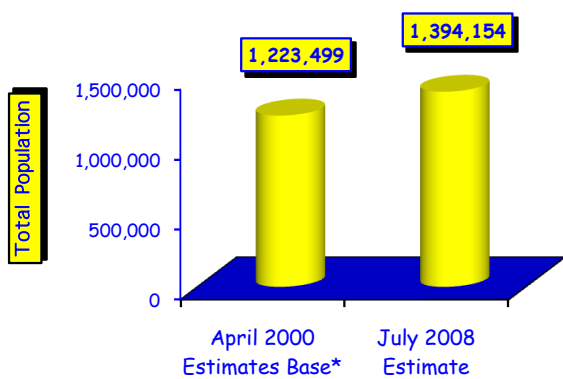
### 2008 Educational Attainment Population Age 25+

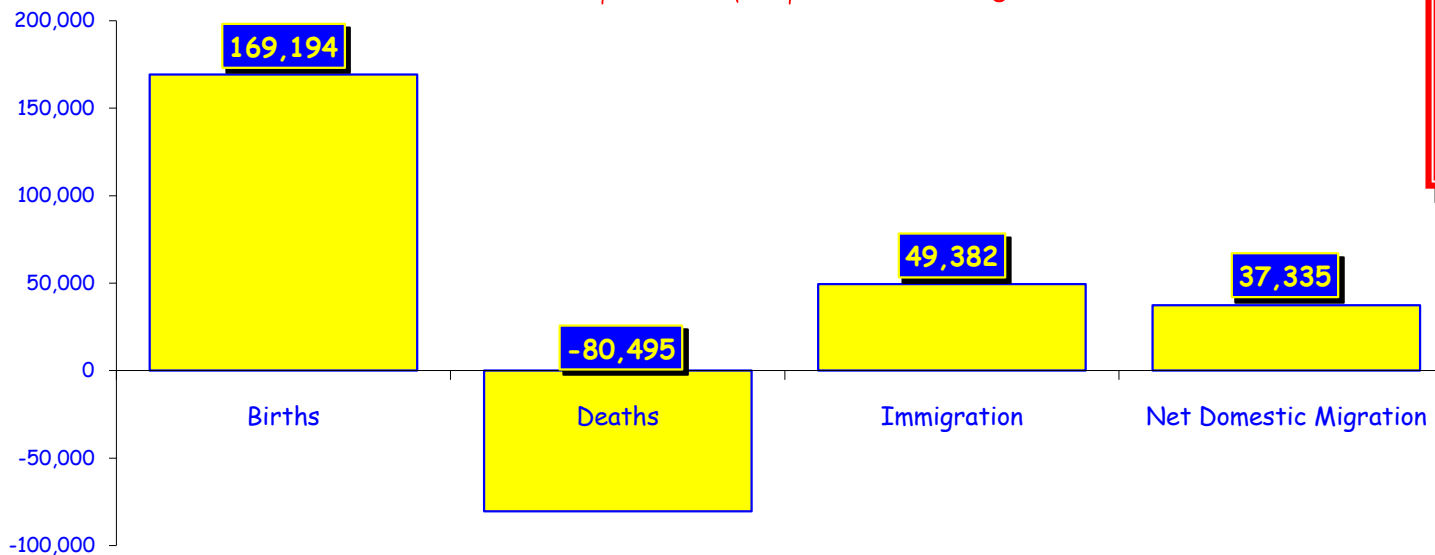

## **2. DEFINITIONS**



## ANCESTRY, RACE & HISPANIC ORIGIN TABLES; CITIZENSHIP & THE FOREIGN-BORN POPULATION

- Data on [ancestry](#) were derived from answers to the [long-form questionnaire](#). [Ancestry](#) refers to a person's ethnic origin or descent, "roots," heritage, or the place of birth of the person's parents/ancestors before their arrival in the United States.
- [Ancestry data are limited to groups that are NOT shown in detailed Race and Hispanic Origin tables](#). For example, since Korean is shown in detailed [Race tables](#), it is NOT shown in [Ancestry tables](#). Likewise, since Mexican is shown in detailed [Hispanic Origin tables](#), it is NOT shown in [Ancestry tables](#). Groups shown in detailed [Race and Hispanic Origin tables](#) are combined under "Other Groups" in [Ancestry tables](#).
- The hundreds of answers to the [ancestry](#) question include: Afghan, Belgian, Croatian, Dutch, English, Finnish, Guyanese, Hungarian, Irish, Latvian, Macedonian, New Zealander, Polish, Russian, Sudanese, Turkish, Ugandan, United States or American, Welsh, Yugoslavian, and Zimbabwean.
- The [citizenship status](#) question asked if the respondent was **1**) born in the United States; **2**) born in Puerto Rico or a U.S. Island Area; **3**) born abroad of American parents(s); **4**) a naturalized citizen; or **5**) not a citizen.
- [Foreign-born population](#) includes all people who were not U.S. citizens at birth. The foreign-born are those persons who indicated that they were either **1**) a U.S. citizen by naturalization or **2**) not a U.S. citizen.
- The [native population](#) includes people born in the United States, Puerto Rico, or the U.S. Island Areas. People who were born in a foreign country but have at least one American (U.S. citizen) parent are also included in this category. The [native population](#) includes everyone who was a U.S. citizen at birth.





## APRIL 1, 1995 RESIDENCE & FOREIGN-BORN POPULATION BY YEAR OF ENTRY



- Data on [April 1, 1995 residence](#) and [foreign-born year of entry](#) were derived from answers to the [long-form questionnaire](#). The [April 1, 1995 residence](#) data **PLUS** the [April 1, 2000 residence](#) data determine population movements—both [domestic migration](#) and [foreign immigration](#).
- [April 1, 1995 residence](#) data from persons who indicated they had lived in a different state are shown in reports under the [FOUR REGIONS](#) shown below. That is, reports show the [REGIONS](#)—but not the states within those regions. The [REGIONS](#) and the states within them are:
  - **NORTHEAST REGION:** Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, and Vermont
  - **SOUTH REGION:** Alabama, Arkansas, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, and West Virginia
  - **MIDWEST REGION:** Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, and Wisconsin
  - **WEST REGION:** Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming.
- *At the national level*, the [April 1, 1995 residence](#) data show that **A)** 54% of the population age 5+ had lived in the same residence they lived in April 1, 2000 and **B)** 43% had lived in a different residence in the U.S. Of those who had lived in a different residence in the U.S., 20% had lived in a different state.
- [Year of entry](#) data show the number of [foreign-born](#) persons who entered the United States during **A)** 1990-April 1, 2000, **B)** 1980-1989, **C)** 1970-1979, **D)** 1965-1969, and **E)** Before 1965.
- *At the national level*, [year of entry](#) data show that of the 31,107,889 [foreign-born](#) persons reported in Census 2000:
  - 42% entered from 1990-April 1, 2000,
  - 27% entered during the 1980's,
  - 15% entered during the 1970's,
  - 5% entered during 1965-1969, and
  - 11% entered before 1965.

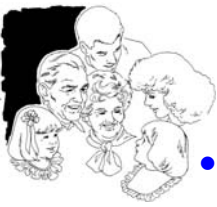

## FAMILY & NONFAMILY HOUSEHOLDS



- A [household](#) contains one or more persons--everyone living in a [housing unit](#) makes up a [household](#).



- One of the persons who owns or rents the residence is designated as the [householder](#).



- For the purposes of examining [family](#) and [household](#) composition, two types of [households](#) are defined: [family](#) and [nonfamily](#).



- A [family household](#) has at least two members related by blood, marriage, or adoption, one of whom is the [householder](#).



- A [nonfamily household](#) can be either a person living alone or a [householder](#) who shares the [housing unit](#) with [nonrelatives](#) only--for example, with boarders or roommates. [Nonrelatives](#) of the [householder](#) may be related to each other.



- [Family households](#) are maintained by married couples or by a man or woman living with other relatives--children may or may not be present. In contrast, [nonfamily](#) households are maintained only by men or women with no relatives of the [householder](#) at home.



- [Children](#) includes sons and daughters by birth, step-children, and adopted children of the [householder](#) regardless of the child's age or marital status.



- [Own children](#) differ from [children in data from the Census 2000 100% DATA in Summary File 1 \(SF1\)](#) in that they are under 18 years old. *In data from the Census 2000 LONG FORM--SAMPLE DATA in Summary File 3 (SF3)--own children* are under 18 years old **AND** they are never-married. Marital status was NOT collected in the 100% data (SF1).



- [Related children](#) includes **1)** sons and daughters by birth, step-children, and adopted children of the [householder](#) **AND 2)** all other persons under 18 years old, regardless of marital status, who are [related to the householder](#) (except the spouse of the householder).



- A [subfamily](#) does not maintain a [household](#), but lives in a [household](#) where the [householder](#) or [householder's spouse](#) is a relative. A [subfamily](#) consists of **A)** a married couple with or without [own never-married children under age 18](#) **OR B)** a single parent with one or more [own never-married children under age 18](#).





## INCOME, LABOR FORCE & POVERTY STATUS

- Data on [income](#), [labor force](#) and [poverty status](#) were derived from answers to the [long-form questionnaire](#).

- [Income](#) includes

- Wages, salary, commissions, bonuses or tips;
- Self-employment income from own non-farm or farm business, including proprietorships and partnerships;
- Interest, dividends, net rental income, royalty income, or income from estates and trusts;
- Social Security or Railroad Retirement income;
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI);
- Any public assistance or welfare payments from the state or local welfare office;
- Retirement, survivor, or disability pensions; and
- Any other sources of income received regularly such as Veterans' (VA) payments, unemployment compensation, child support, or alimony.

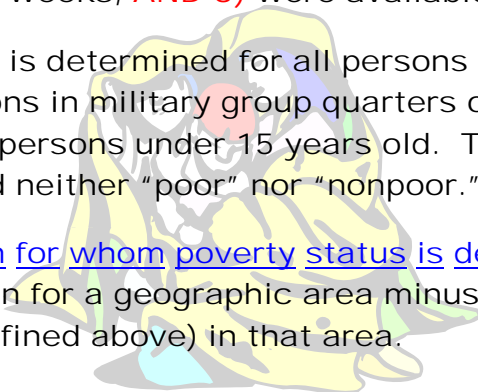
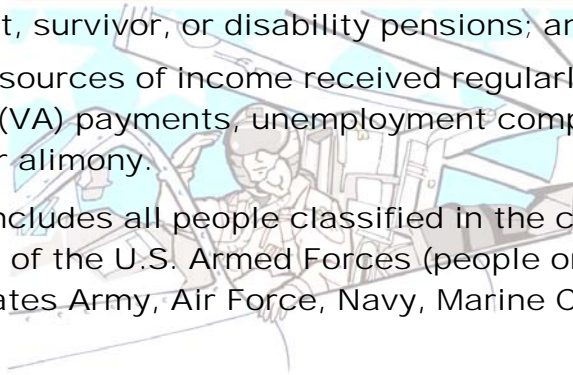
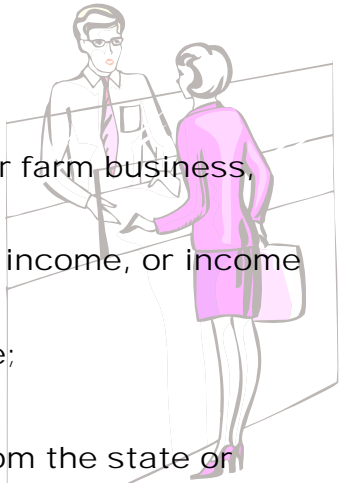
- [Labor Force](#) includes all people classified in the civilian labor force plus members of the U.S. Armed Forces (people on active duty with the United States Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard).

- The [Civilian Labor Force](#) consists of people classified as [employed](#) or [unemployed](#).

- [All civilians 16 years old and over](#) were classified as [unemployed](#) if they 1) were neither "at work" nor "with a job but not at work" during the full calendar week preceding the date the questionnaire was completed, AND 2) were actively looking for work during the preceding four weeks, AND 3) were available to accept a job.

- [Poverty status](#) is determined for all persons **EXCEPT** institutionalized persons, persons in military group quarters or college dormitories, and unrelated persons under 15 years old. These excluded groups are considered neither "poor" nor "nonpoor."

- The [population for whom poverty status is determined](#) equals the total population for a geographic area minus the number of excluded persons (as defined above) in that area.

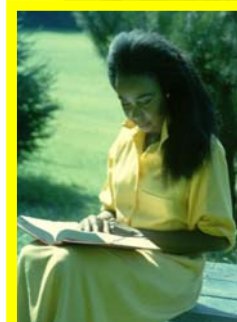






## LANGUAGE SPOKEN AT HOME, THE ABILITY TO SPEAK ENGLISH & LINGUISTIC ISOLATION

- Data on [language spoken at home](#) and the [ability to speak English](#) were derived from answers to the [long-form questionnaire](#). This data was collected in an effort to measure the current use of languages other than English. **Data were edited to INCLUDE ONLY the population 5 years old and over.**
- People who knew a language other than English but did not use the language at home or who only used the language elsewhere were excluded.
- People who reported they spoke a language other than English were asked to rate their [ability to speak English](#) in one of the following categories: "Very well," "Well," "Not well," or "Not at all."
- A household was classified as [linguistically isolated](#) if all members 14 years old and over 1) spoke a non-English language **AND 2) spoke English less than "very well" (had difficulty with English).**
- On April 1, 2000, **82%** of the population 5 years old and over spoke English only; **18%** spoke another language; and **8%** spoke English less than "very well."





## LIVING QUARTERS



- Data on [living quarters](#) were derived from answers to both the [short-form and long-form questionnaires](#).
- [Living quarters](#) are either [housing units](#) or [group quarters](#).
  - A [housing unit](#) may be a house, an apartment, a mobile home, a group of rooms, or a single room occupied as separate living quarters.
  - [Group quarters](#) include **1)** institutions such as nursing homes, prisons, jails, mental hospitals and juvenile institutions; and **2)** non-institutional facilities such as college dormitories, military quarters and group homes. **The remainder of this page refers only to [housing units](#).**
- [Contract rent](#) is the monthly rent that is contracted for and may include furnishings, utilities, meals, or fees.



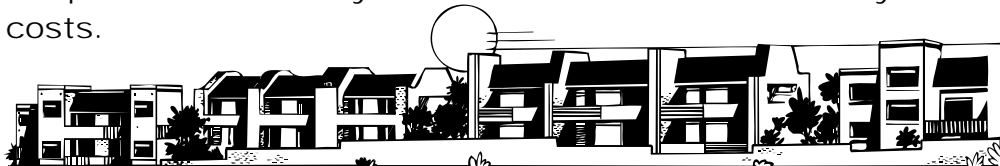
- [Median contract rent](#) divides all rents into two equal parts: One-half are below and one-half are above the [median](#) amount.
- For example, a [median contract rent](#) of \$548 means that 50% of all [contract rents](#) are below and 50% are above \$548.
- [Gross rent](#) is the [contract rent](#) **PLUS** the estimated average monthly cost of utilities and home heating fuels.



- [Median gross rent](#) divides all [gross rents](#) into two equal parts: One-half are below and one-half are above the [median](#) amount.
- [Gross rent as a percent of household income](#) is the percent of monthly household income consumed by [gross rent](#).
- [Selected monthly owner costs](#) **refer only to owner-occupied [housing units](#)**. [Monthly owner costs](#) include payments for mortgages, deeds of trust, contracts to purchase, home equity loans, or similar debts on the property; real estate taxes; fire, hazard, and flood insurance; utilities; home heating fuels; condominium fees; and mobile home costs such as site rent, etc..



- [Median monthly owner costs](#) divides all [monthly owner costs](#) into two equal parts: One-half are below and one-half are above the [median](#) amount.
- [Selected monthly owner costs as a percent of household income](#) is the percent of monthly household income consumed by these costs.

# About Metropolitan and Micropolitan Statistical Areas

The United States Office of Management and Budget (OMB) defines metropolitan and micropolitan statistical areas according to published standards that are applied to Census Bureau data. The general concept of a metropolitan or micropolitan statistical area is that of a core area containing a substantial population nucleus, together with adjacent communities having a high degree of economic and social integration with that core. Currently defined metropolitan and micropolitan statistical areas are based on application of 2000 standards [ [PDF](#) | [Plain text](#) ] (which appeared in the *Federal Register* on December 27, 2000) to 2000 decennial census data. Current metropolitan and micropolitan statistical area definitions were announced by OMB effective June 6, 2003.

Standard definitions of metropolitan areas were first issued in 1949 by the then Bureau of the Budget (predecessor of OMB), under the designation "standard metropolitan area" (SMA). The term was changed to "standard metropolitan statistical area" (SMSA) in 1959, and to "metropolitan statistical area" (MSA) in 1983. The term "metropolitan area" (MA) was adopted in 1990 and referred collectively to metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs), consolidated metropolitan statistical areas (CMSAs), and primary metropolitan statistical areas (PMSAs). The term "core based statistical area" (CBSA) became effective in 2000 and refers collectively to metropolitan and micropolitan statistical areas.

OMB has been responsible for the official metropolitan areas since they were first defined, except for the period 1977 to 1981, when they were the responsibility of the Office of Federal Statistical Policy and Standards, Department of Commerce. The standards for defining metropolitan areas were modified in 1958, 1971, 1975, 1980, 1990, and 2000.

### Defining Metropolitan and Micropolitan Statistical Areas

The 2000 standards provide that each CBSA must contain at least one urban area of 10,000 or more population. Each metropolitan statistical area must have at least one urbanized area of 50,000 or more inhabitants. Each micropolitan statistical area must have at least one urban cluster of at least 10,000 but less than 50,000 population.

Under the standards, the county (or counties) in which at least 50 percent of the population resides within urban areas of 10,000 or more population, or that contain at least 5,000 people residing within a single urban area of 10,000 or more population, is identified as a "central county" (counties). Additional "outlying counties" are included in the CBSA if they meet specified requirements of commuting to or from the central counties. Counties or equivalent entities form the geographic "building blocks" for metropolitan and micropolitan statistical areas throughout the United States and Puerto Rico.

If specified criteria are met, a metropolitan statistical area containing a single core with a population of 2.5 million or more may be subdivided to form smaller groupings of counties referred to as "metropolitan divisions."

As of June 6, 2000, there are 362 metropolitan statistical areas and 560 micropolitan statistical areas in the United States. In addition, there are 8 metropolitan statistical areas and 5 micropolitan statistical areas in Puerto Rico.

### Principal Cities and Metropolitan and Micropolitan Statistical Area Titles

The largest city in each metropolitan or micropolitan statistical area is designated a "principal city." Additional



cities qualify if specified requirements are met concerning population size and employment. The title of each metropolitan or micropolitan statistical area consists of the names of up to three of its principal cities and the name of each state into which the metropolitan or micropolitan statistical area extends. Titles of metropolitan divisions also typically are based on principal city names but in certain cases consist of county names.

## Defining New England City and Town Areas

In view of the importance of cities and town in New England, the 2000 standards also provide for a set of geographic areas that are defined using cities and towns in the six New England states. The New England city and town areas (NECTAs) are defined using the same criteria as metropolitan and micropolitan statistical areas and are identified as either metropolitan or micropolitan, based, respectively, on the presence of either an urbanized area of 50,000 or more population or an urban cluster of at least 10,000 but less than 50,000 population. If the specified criteria are met, a NECTA containing a single core with a population of at least 2.5 million may be subdivided to form smaller groupings of cities and towns referred to as New England city and town area divisions.

## Changes in Definitions over Time

Changes in the definitions of these statistical areas since the 1950 census have consisted chiefly of:

- the recognition of new areas as they reached the minimum required city or urbanized area population, and
- the addition of counties (or cities and towns in New England) to existing areas as new decennial census data showed them to qualify.

In some instances, formerly separate areas have been merged, components of an area have been transferred from one area to another, or components have been dropped from an area. The large majority of changes have taken place on the basis of decennial census data. However, Census Bureau data serve as the basis for intercensal updates in specified circumstances.

Because of these historical changes in geographic definitions, users must be cautious in comparing data for these statistical areas from different dates. For some purposes, comparisons of data for areas as defined at given dates may be appropriate; for other purposes, it may be preferable to maintain consistent area definitions. Historical metropolitan area definitions are available for 1999, 1993, 1990, 1983, 1981, 1973, 1970, 1963, 1960, and 1950.

## KEY TERMS

### METROPOLITAN AND MICROPOLITAN AREAS

**Census Designated Place:** A statistical area that is equivalent to an incorporated place, consisting of a locally recognized, unincorporated concentration of population that is identified by name.

**Central County:** The county or counties of a Core Based Statistical Area containing a substantial portion of urbanized area or urban cluster or both, and to and from which commuting is measured to determine qualification of outlying counties.

**Combined Statistical Area:** A geographical area consisting of two or more adjacent Core Based Statistical Areas (CBSAs) with employment interchange of at least 15 percent. Combination is automatic if the employment interchange is 25 percent and determined by local opinion if more than 15 but less than 25 percent.

**Core:** A densely settled concentration of population with an urbanized area of 50,000 or more population or an urban cluster of 10,000 to 49,999 population.

**Core Based Statistical Area (CBSA):** A geographical area consisting of a county or counties associated with at least one core, plus adjacent counties with a high level of integration as measured by commuting patterns.

**Employment Interchange Measure:** A measure of the ratio of employed residents in a smaller entity that work in the larger entity and the percent of employment in the smaller entity that is accounted for by worked who reside in the larger entity.

**Geographical Building Block:** The geographical unit, such as a county, that constitutes the basic component of the statistical area.

**Main County:** A county that acts as an employment center within a CBSA that has a core population of at least 2.5 million. Main counties serve as the basis for defining a metropolitan division.

**Metropolitan Division:** A county or counties within a CBSA that consists of one or more main/secondary counties that represent an employment center or centers, plus adjacent counties associated with the main county or counties through commuting ties.

**Metropolitan Statistical Area:** A CBSA associated with at least one urbanized area of at least 50,000 population. The central county plus adjacent counties with a high degree of integration comprise the area.

**Micropolitan Statistical Area:** A CBSA associated with at least one urban cluster with a population of at least 10,000. The central county plus adjacent counties with a high degree of integration comprise the area.

**Outlying County:** A county that qualifies for inclusion in the Core Based Statistical Area on the basis of commuting ties.

**Outside Core Based Statistical Areas:** Counties that do not qualify for inclusion in a CBSA.

**Principal City:** The largest city of a Core Based Statistical Area, plus additional cities that meet minimum standards.

**Secondary County:** A county that acts as an employment center within a CBSA with a population of at least 2.5 million.

**Urban Area:** The generic term used by the Census Bureau for urbanized area and urban clusters.

**Urban Cluster:** A central place and adjacent territory that together contain at least 2,500 people and an overall density of 1,000 per square mile. For CBSAs, only those urban clusters with a population of 10,000 or more are considered.

**Urbanized Area:** A central place and adjacent territory that contain at least 50,000 people and an overall density of 1,000 per square mile.

# About the Profile

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## NOTE TO ALL DATA USERS

To maintain confidentiality, the Census Bureau applies statistical procedures that introduce some uncertainty into data for small geographic areas. Data have not been adjusted for estimated net census coverage error based on the results of the Accuracy and Coverage Evaluation (A.C.E.). Census results contain nonsampling error. Researchers who create their own estimates using data provided by American FactFinder should cite the Census Bureau as the source of the original data only.

## SUBJECT DEFINITIONS

**Age** — The age classification is based on the age of the person in complete years as of April 1, 2000. The age of the person usually was derived from their date of birth information.

**Average Family Size** — A measure obtained by dividing the number of people in families by the total number of families (or family householders).

**Average Household Size** — A measure obtained by dividing the number of people in households by the total number of households (or householders).

**Average Household Size of Owner-Occupied Units** — A measure obtained by dividing the number of people living in owner-occupied housing units by the number of owner-occupied housing units.

**Average Household Size of Renter-Occupied Units** — A measure obtained by dividing the number of people living in renter-occupied housing units by the number of renter-occupied housing units.

**Child** — A child includes a son or daughter by birth, a stepchild, or an adopted child of the householder, regardless of the child's age or marital status.

**Family Household (Family)** — A family includes a householder and one or more people living in the same household who are related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption. All people in a household who are related to the householder are regarded as members of his or her family. A family household may contain people not related to the householder, but those people are not included as part of the householder's family in census tabulations. Thus, the number of family households is equal to the number of families, but family households may include more members than do families. A household can contain only one family for purposes of census tabulations. Not all households contain families since a household may comprise a group of unrelated people or one person living alone.

**Female Householder, No Husband Present** — A female maintaining a household with no husband of the householder present.

**Group Quarters Population** — The group quarters population includes all people not living in households. Two general categories of people in group quarters are recognized: 1) the institutionalized population which includes people under formally authorized, supervised care or custody in institutions at the time of enumeration (such as correctional institutions, nursing homes, and juvenile institutions) and 2) the noninstitutionalized population which includes all people who live in group quarters other than institutions (such as college dormitories, military quarters, and group homes).

**Hispanic or Latino** — People who identify with the terms "Hispanic" or "Latino" are those who classify themselves in one of the specific Hispanic or Latino categories listed on the questionnaire—"Mexican," "Puerto Rican," or "Cuban"—as well as those who indicate that they are "other Spanish, Hispanic, or Latino." Origin can be viewed as the heritage, nationality group, lineage, or country of birth of the person or the person's parents or ancestors before their arrival in the United States. People who identify their origin as Spanish, Hispanic, or Latino may be of any race.

**Homeowner Vacancy Rate** — The homeowner vacancy rate is the proportion of the homeowner housing inventory which is vacant for sale. It is computed by dividing the number of vacant units for sale only by the sum of owner-occupied units and vacant units that are for sale only, and then multiplying by 100. (For more information, see "[Vacant Housing Unit](#).")

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**Household** — A household includes all of the people who occupy a housing unit. People not living in households are classified as living in group quarters.

**Householder** — In most cases, the householder is the person, or one of the people, in whose name the home is owned, being bought, or rented and who is listed as Person 1 on the census questionnaire. If there is no such person in the household, any adult household member 15 years old and over could be designated as the householder (i.e., Person 1).

**Housing Unit** — A housing unit may be a house, an apartment, a mobile home, a group of rooms, or a single room that is occupied (or if vacant, is intended for occupancy) as separate living quarters. Separate living quarters are those in which the occupants live separately from any other individuals in the building and which have direct access from outside the building or through a common hall.

**Institutionalized Population** — The institutionalized population includes people under formally authorized, supervised care or custody in institutions at the time of enumeration. (For more information, see ["Group Quarters Population."](#))

**Married-Couple Family** — A family in which the householder and his or her spouse are enumerated as members of the same household.

**Median Age** — The median divides the age distribution into two equal parts, one-half of the cases falling below the median age and one-half above the median. This measure is rounded to the nearest tenth.

**Nonfamily Household** — A householder living alone or with nonrelatives only.

**Noninstitutionalized Population** — All people who live in group quarters other than institutions. Also included are staff residing at institutional group quarters. (For more information, see ["Group Quarters Population."](#))

**Nonrelative** — Any household member who is not related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption, including foster children.

**Occupied Housing Unit** — A housing unit is classified as occupied if it is the usual place of residence of the person or group of people living in it at the time of enumeration, or if the occupants are only temporarily absent; that is, away on vacation or business.

**Other Relative** — Any household member related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption, but not included specifically in another relationship category.

**Own Child** — A child under 18 years old who is a son or daughter by birth, marriage (a stepchild), or adoption. For 100-percent tabulations, own children consist of all sons/daughters of householders who are under 18 years of age. For sample data, own children consist of sons/daughters of householders who are under 18 years of age **and** who have never been married, therefore, numbers of own children of householders may be different in these two tabulations.

**Owner-Occupied Housing Unit** — A housing unit is owner-occupied if the owner or co-owner lives in the unit even if it is mortgaged or not fully paid for.

**Race** — The concept of race as used by the Census Bureau reflects self-identification by people according to the race or races with which they most closely identify. These categories are sociopolitical constructs and should not be interpreted as being scientific or anthropological in nature. Furthermore, the race categories include both racial and national-origin groups.

The racial classifications used by the Census Bureau adhere to the October 30, 1997, *Federal Register Notice* entitled, "Revisions to the Standards for the Classification of Federal Data on Race and Ethnicity" issued by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB). These standards govern the categories used to collect and present federal data on race and ethnicity. The OMB requires five minimum categories (American Indian and Alaska Native, Asian, Black or African American, Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and White) for race. The race categories are described below with a sixth category, "Some other race," added with OMB

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approval. In addition to the five race groups, the OMB also states that respondents should be offered the option of selecting one or more races.

If an individual could not provide a race response, the race or races of the householder or other household members were assigned by the computer using specific rules of precedence of household relationship. For example, if race was missing for a natural-born child in the household, then either the race or races of the householder, another natural-born child, or the spouse of the householder were assigned. If race was not reported for anyone in the household, the race or races of a householder in a previously processed household were assigned.

**White** — A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East, or North Africa. It includes people who indicate their race as “White” or report entries such as Irish, German, Italian, Lebanese, Near Easterner, Arab, or Polish.

**Black or African American** — A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa. It includes people who indicate their race as “Black, African Am., or Negro,” or provide written entries such as African American, Afro American, Kenyan, Nigerian, or Haitian.

**American Indian and Alaska Native** — A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America), and who maintain tribal affiliation or community attachment. It includes people who classify themselves as described below.

*American Indian* — Includes people who indicate their race as “American Indian,” entered the name of an Indian tribe, or report such entries as Canadian Indian, French-American Indian, or Spanish-American Indian.

*Alaska Native* — Includes written responses of Eskimos, Aleuts, and Alaska Indians as well as entries such as Arctic Slope, Inupiat, Yupik, Alutiiq, Egegik, and Pribilovian. The Alaska tribes are the Alaskan Athabaskan, Tlingit, and Haida. The information for Census 2000 is derived from the American Indian Detailed Tribal Classification List for the 1990 census and was expanded to list the individual Alaska Native Villages when provided as a written response for race.

**Asian** — A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian subcontinent including, for example, Cambodia, China, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippine Islands, Thailand, and Vietnam. It includes “Asian Indian,” “Chinese,” “Filipino,” “Korean,” “Japanese,” “Vietnamese,” and “Other Asian.”

*Asian Indian* — Includes people who indicate their race as “Asian Indian” or identify themselves as Bengalese, Bharat, Dravidian, East Indian, or Goanese.

*Chinese* — Includes people who indicate their race as “Chinese” or who identify themselves as Cantonese, or Chinese American. In some census tabulations, written entries of Taiwanese are included with Chinese while in others they are shown separately.

*Filipino* — Includes people who indicate their race as “Filipino” or who report entries such as Filipino, Philippine, or Filipino American.

*Japanese* — Includes people who indicate their race as “Japanese” or who report entries such as Nipponese or Japanese American.

*Korean* — Includes people who indicate their race as “Korean” or who provide a response of Korean American.

*Vietnamese* — Includes people who indicate their race as “Vietnamese” or who provide a response of Vietnamese American.

*Cambodian* — Includes people who provide a response such as Cambodian or Cambodia.

*Hmong* — Includes people who provide a response such as Hmong, Laohmong, or Mong.

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*Laotian* — Includes people who provide a response such as Laotian, Laos, or Lao.

*Thai* — Includes people who provide a response such as Thai, Thailand, or Siamese.

*Other Asian* — Includes people who provide a response of Bangladeshi, Burmese, Indonesian, Pakistani, or Sri Lankan.

**Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander** — A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands. It includes people who indicate their race as “Native Hawaiian,” “Guamanian or Chamorro,” “Samoaan,” and “Other Pacific Islander.”

*Native Hawaiian* — Includes people who indicate their race as “Native Hawaiian” or who identify themselves as “Part Hawaiian” or “Hawaiian.”

*Guamanian or Chamorro* — Includes people who indicate their race as such, including written entries of Chamorro or Guam.

*Samoaan* — Includes people who indicate their race as “Samoaan” or who identified themselves as American Samoa or Western Samoa.

*Other Pacific Islander* — Includes people who provided a write-in response of a Pacific Islander group such as Tahitian, Northern Mariana Islander, Palauan, Fijian, or a cultural group such as Melanesian, Micronesian, or Polynesian.

**Some Other Race** — Includes all other responses not included in the “White,” “Black or African American,” “American Indian and Alaska Native,” “Asian,” and the “Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander” race categories described above. Respondents providing write-in entries such as multiracial, mixed, interracial, or a Hispanic/Latino group (for example, Mexican, Puerto Rican, or Cuban) in the “Some other race” category are included in this category.

**Two or More Races** — People may have chosen to provide two or more races either by checking two or more race response check boxes, by providing multiple write-in responses, or by some combination of check boxes and write-in responses. The race response categories shown on the questionnaire are collapsed into the five minimum race groups identified by the OMB, and the Census Bureau “Some other race” category. For data product purposes, “Two or more races” refers to combinations of two or more of the following race categories:

- White
- Black or African American
- American Indian and Alaska Native
- Asian
- Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander
- Some other race

**Coding of Write-In Entries** — During 100-percent processing of Census 2000 questionnaires, subject-matter specialists reviewed and coded written entries from four response categories on the race item — American Indian or Alaska Native, Other Asian, Other Pacific Islander, and Some other race – for which an area for a write-in response was provided. The Other Asian and Other Pacific Islander response categories shared the same write-in area on the questionnaire.

**Rental Vacancy Rate** — The proportion of the rental inventory which is vacant for rent. It is computed by dividing the number of vacant units for rent by the sum of the renter-occupied units and the number of vacant units for rent, and then multiplying by 100.

**Renter-Occupied Housing Unit** — All occupied housing units which are not owner occupied, whether they are rented for cash rent or occupied without payment of cash rent, are classified as renter occupied. Housing units in “continuing care” or life care facilities are included in the “rented for cash rent” category.

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**Seasonal, Recreational, or Occasional Use Housing Unit** — Seasonal, recreational, or occasional use housing units include vacant units used or intended for use only in certain seasons, for weekends, or other occasional use throughout the year. Interval ownership units, sometimes called shared ownership or time-sharing condominiums are included in this category. (For more information, see "[Vacant Housing Unit.](#)")

**Sex** — Based on self-reporting of gender. Either male or female.

**Spouse** — A person who is married to and living with the householder. This category includes people in formal marriages, as well as people in common-law marriages.

**Tenure** — All occupied housing units are classified as either owner occupied or renter occupied. A housing unit is owner occupied if the owner or co-owner lives in the unit even if it is mortgaged or not fully paid for. All occupied housing units which are not owner occupied, whether they are rented for cash rent or occupied without payment of cash rent, are classified as renter occupied.

**Vacant Housing Unit** — A housing unit is vacant if no one is living in it at the time of enumeration, unless its occupants are only temporarily absent. Units temporarily occupied at the time of enumeration entirely by people who have a usual residence elsewhere are also classified as vacant. (For more information, see "[Housing Unit.](#)")

## DERIVED MEASURES

**Average** — See "[Mean.](#)"

**Interpolation** — Interpolation frequently is used in calculating medians based on interval data and in approximating standard errors from tables. Linear interpolation is used to estimate values of a function between two known values. This is the form of interpolation used to calculate median age.

**Mean** — This measure represents an arithmetic average of a set of values. It is derived by dividing the sum (or aggregate) of a group of numerical items by the total number of items in that group. For example, average family size is obtained by dividing the number of people in families by the total number of families (or family householders). (Additional information on means and aggregates is included in the separate explanations of many of the population and housing subjects.)

**Median** — This measure represents the middle value (if n is odd) or the average of the two middle values (if n is even) in an ordered list of n data values. The median divides the total frequency distribution into two equal parts: one-half of the cases falling below the median and one-half above the median. (See also "[Interpolation.](#)")

**Percentage** — This measure is calculated by taking the number of items in a group possessing a characteristic of interest and dividing by the total number of items in that group, and then multiplying by 100.

**Rate** — This is a measure of occurrences in a given period of time divided by the possible number of occurrences during that period. Rates are sometimes presented as percentages.

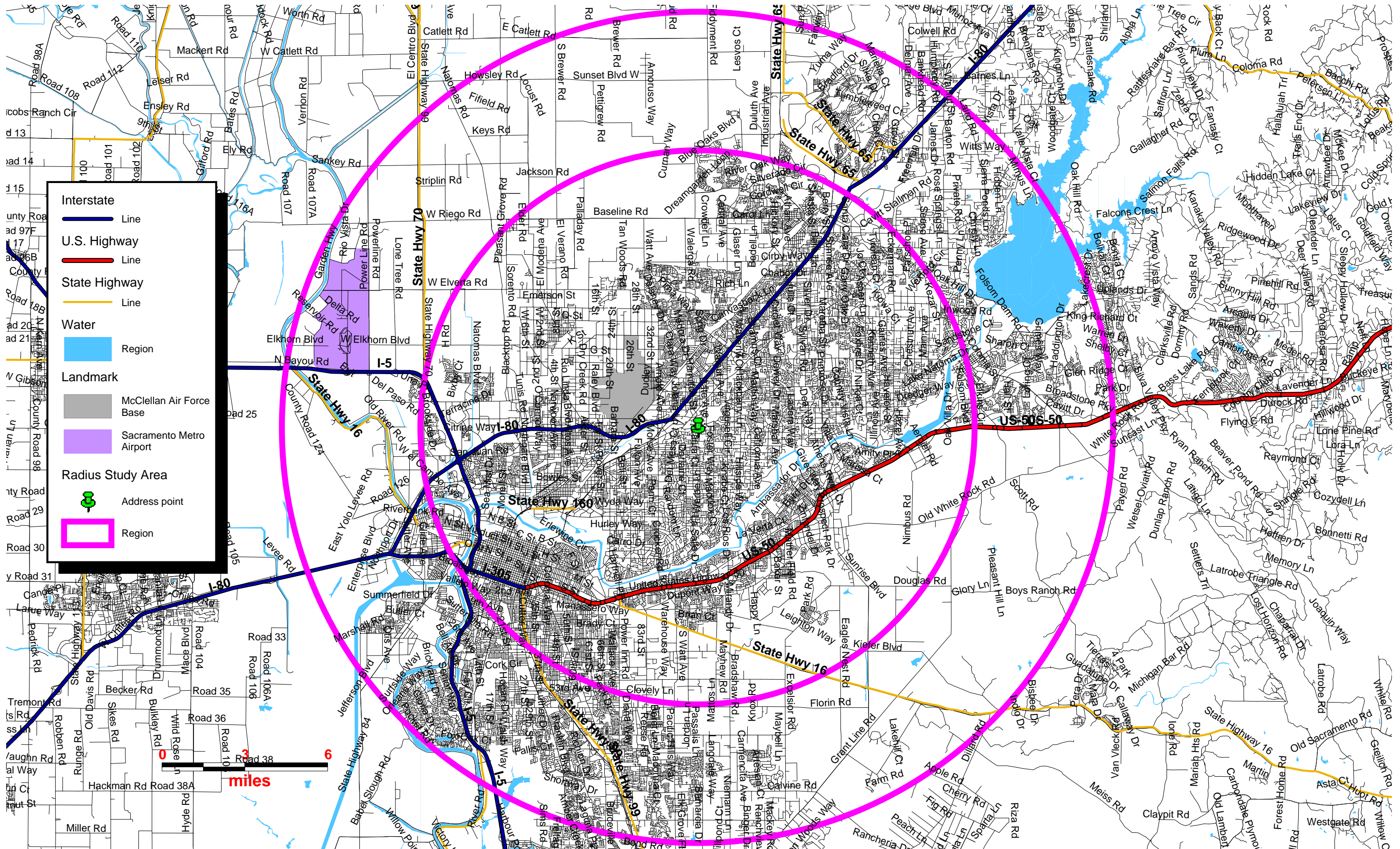
