Learn to Sail Boat Labels:

- Learn to Sail boats may require to have individually numbered Learn to Sail Programme labels affixed.
- Upon successful application ISAF will enter into an agreement with the manufacturer or class association whereby labels may be sold for each boat built. The label should be affixed at the time of manufacture. The fees for each label are as follows:
 - £2.50 - standard fee
 - £1.25 – for ISAF Classes.

For ISAF classes the fee will be add to the standard plaque fee. The plaque may be modified to include the boat label if requested by the manufacturer or class association.

There is an option for a label imprint on rotomould plastic boats upon request from the manufacturer or class association.
