
CALL FOR COMMENTS



To whom it may concern,

The publication during the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games of Version 1.1 of the International Sport Coaching Framework (ISCF) marks a watershed in the development of coaching globally. The International Council for Coach Education and the Association for Summer Olympic International Federations have prepared the document following a process of development and consultation that commenced in April 2011. This initiative signals a new and collaborative approach to recognising and supporting the role of coaches at all levels of sport across the globe. The ISCF has been published by Human Kinetics Publishers.

Under the joint chairs Marisol Casado (ASOIF) and Pat Duffy (ICCE) the Working Group on the International Sport Coaching Framework has developed a comprehensive document that will provide the basis for initial implementation and *further world-wide development and consultation*.

Version 1.2 will be published at the Global Coach Conference in South Africa in September 2013, following a period of further consultation and development. This process will include close engagement with the newly formed Education and Development Group within ASOIF. *All organizations and individuals with an interest in the development of coaching are encouraged to use and comment on the document.*
