

STRANGFORD LOUGH

Picturesque Portaferry and Strangford, linked by the ferry crossing the exceptionally beautiful and fast-flowing waters of the Narrows, are the setting for the 2014 Strangford Lough Maritime Festival.

Historic shorefronts, medieval tower houses, Queen's University Marine Laboratory, the shore, a historic graveyard and bell-tower a village green, and the Exploris aquarium and park are among the exceptional venues for family events spanning our heritage past and present.

This year the Vikings are back with ferocious battles, beautifully crafted long ships and lively trading in their market. For the first time you can witness and take part in a dramatic procession for a warrior slain in battle. His body and that of his wife will then be burned with his long-ship following the tradition of a Viking funeral.

This Festival is remarkable for the opportunity it provides to meet historians, archaeologists, scientists and other specialists who are delighted to share the wonders of this area. We thank them and all our local volunteers for their contribution.

Once more EnAlgae have helped to sponsor the Festival. Delve into their seaweed garden or take a trip out with them on a boat to see how they are growing seaweed on long-lines in the Lough.

En Algae brings together 19 partners and 14 observers from seven European countries. Their goal is to reduce CO2 emissions and fossil fuels dependence in the region. Academic, business and research centres are working altogether in the growing, harvesting and processing of algae, to turn it into biomass and bio fuels. En Algae is an INTERREG IVB funded North West European network with a pilot site at Queen's University Marine Laboratory, which is experimenting with growing kelp seaweed as a source of bioenergy.

Seaweed has historically been harvested in Strangford Lough, and combined with the Lough's prime location in Northern Ireland for developing marine renewable energy, it is the perfect place to test seaweed cultivation for commercial scale production – over 90% of people in Northern Ireland support seaweed biomass for bioenergy!

The Festival also marks the Turn O' The Tide programme of activities celebrating our maritime and coastal heritage, funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund.

VIKINGS!

The Lough was named 'Strangr Fjordr' by 9th century Vikings who rowed into the fierce currents of the Narrows in long ships.

They carried out short blitzkriegs in Strangford in the 9th and 10th centuries and established short-term settlements. Many interbred with the native Irish and settled here, setting up trade links with the homeland. Their longboats had a huge influence on boat design in Strangford, and their legacy lives on in the name Strangford.

The Magnus Viking Association authentically recreate the lifestyle and events of that turbulent time and share their own tremendous knowledge and love of all things Viking.

MARINE AND COASTAL LIFE

Strangford Lough is an internationally important Marine Protected Area. You can see amazing marine and coastal wildlife here any day of the year. Keep an eye out for seals and sometimes porpoise swimming past the shorefront and marvel at the diving skills of the elegant terns that have flown all the way from Africa to nest here. In June the coastal walks at nearby Killard Pt. and Ballyquintin Pt. uplift the soul with their their carpets of wildflowers.

2013 saw the sad loss of Dr Pat Boaden, former Director of Queen's University Marine Laboratory, Portaferry. On shore field trips, Pat advised his students to "Turn over another stone - you never know what you might find." An enquiring and creative mind carried into Pat's personal life and he was noted for composing music and poetry, playing the fiddle and encouraging young people in their endeavours.

He was a huge influence on many people over the years and he is honoured in this Festival with a new event "Turn Another Stone" - this combines a shore walk with a presentation on the area's wonderful marine life - crossing art and science and involving young people.

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MARINE ENERGY

The Narrows of Strangford Lough is a centre for renewable, sustainable energy experiments to provide a long term solution to our planet's future energy demands.

It really is fitting that Strangford Lough should provide the location for such revolutionary research as the world's oldest known tidal mill was built by monks at the northern end of the Lough at Nendrum.

You can see the black and red tower of the SeaGen Marine Current turbine which holds two impellor blades like windmills beneath the water.

The Minesto underwater sea kite is tethered to the seafloor and can work at lower water speeds. It is not visible on the surface but its location is marked by yellow buoys off Ballyhenry Island.

EnAlgae is a partnership project, locally based in Queen's Marine Lab Portaferry. Come and meet the scientists who aim to reduce the reliance on fossil fuels in NW Europe by developing algal biofuel technologies.

EnAlgae Boat Tours
