#### 1. Introduction

The overall aim of the Youth programme is:

"To develop sailors of the appropriate age and ability to win medals for the British Sailing Team at major international regattas at Youth and Olympic level...".

In order to acheive the above, we aim to select those individuals and teams who are most likely to excel at dinghy and windsurf racing to receive additional coaching and support from the RYA and thereby:

- 1. Accelerate individuals/team development.
- 2. Optimally feed the British Sailing Team Olympic, Paralympic and other Senior Development Squads.
- 3. Make best use of RYA, funding partner and sponsor support.

This document should be read in conjunction with the RYA Youth Steering Group "Guidelines for Selection", which is available from the RYA website.

The RYA UK Youth Squad has two separate training periods, each with a distinct squad entry point. A main entry point in September and an additional entry point in April which is intended principally to be a review, but all sailors should apply if they feel they may warrant inclusion or reapply as appropriate. Selection or reselection is based upon meeting the performance criteria at the relevant indicators, irrespective of previous squad membership. Each uses specified indicator events from which there are normally places allocated on the basis of results and age criteria and discretionary selected places. The timings and principles are outlined below:

#### 2. Selection

Selection of the sailors will be determined by an independent committee of selectors who are appointed by the RYA Youth Steering Group (YSG). Their remit is to select those sailors, who in their opinion have a combination of:

- 1. The best prospects of winning medals at World and European Championships, now and in the future.
- 2. The best prospects of winning medals at the ISAF Youth Sailing World Championships.
- 3. The best prospects of successfully following an Olympic pathway.

#### Process:

All selections are made at the discretion of the Selectors. However, in terms of process, a number of places will normally be allocated to the highest ranked eligible sailors at the *primary indicator event(s)* using the process and criteria listed in Appendices A, B, C, D and E. Any remaining places will be allocated at the discretion of the Selectors using their interpretation of the criteria listed in 2.1 to 2.3 and in section 7. In order to objectively compare sailors' performances at key events when exercising their discretion, Selectors will normally only consider performances at the *Primary and Secondary Indicator events*, which are listed in Appendix A and B.

In exceptional cases sailors who are identified at other times may still be selected and invited to join the RYA UK Youth Squad. This may involve being invited to train alongside the RYA UK Youth Squad for one or more camps, and will usually be subject to delivering a satisfactory performance at the *nominated squad review event(s)*. Exceptionally, in the event that there are no suitable squad review event(s) within a reasonable time frame, consideration may be given to other significant class regattas or training in order to confirm a full place in the squad.

Sailors who are invited to train alongside on a trial basis, or regarding whom a decision is deferred (usually because in the opinion of the Selectors, they are on the periphery of squad selection, and therefore the selection process is extended), may subsequently be invited to join the squad at a later date.

Any selection is subject to the prior compliance to and on-going conformance to any standards, expectations, charters and codes of conduct laid down by the RYA and its representatives.

#### 3. Eligibility

Normally, to be eligible for selection, sailors must:

- 1. At the time of selection be eligible to compete for Great Britain at an ISAF sanctioned event as defined in ISAF Regulation 19.
- 2. For the **International Competition period (i.e. April selection);** normally be aged U19 on the 31<sup>st</sup> December 2014 (individual event selections may differ to this), or exceptionally U19 on the 1<sup>st</sup> September 2014 (see below).
- 3. For the **Main training period (i.e. September selection)** be U18 on the 31<sup>st</sup> December 2014, or exceptionally U18 on the 1<sup>st</sup> September 2014 (see below).
- 4. For Laser Standard Sailors only: be aged U21 on the 31<sup>st</sup> December 2014 for the International Competition period [April] or U20 on the 31<sup>st</sup> December 2014 for the Main training period [Sept], latterly this is in order to enable sailors to be eligible for U21 International Competition in 2015.

In exceptional circumstances, sailors who do not comply with 3.1 may nevertheless be eligible and selected, if expressly confirmed by the RYA Racing Manager. Such sailors will be required to carry GBR on their sails and may be required to sign a written declaration of intent to comply with 3.1.

In order to help sailing partnerships stay together and allow sailors to progress at a rate consistent with the maturation of their 'academic' peers, sailors normally remain eligible for selection in all classes for the international competition phase when one or both members of the team are aged U19 on the 1<sup>st</sup> September 2014, provided they were born between 1<sup>st</sup> September and 31<sup>st</sup> December inclusive. For the main training phase sailors remain eligible for selection when a member of the team is U18 on the 1<sup>st</sup> September 2014, provided they were born between 1<sup>st</sup> September and 31<sup>st</sup> December 1<sup>st</sup> September and 31<sup>st</sup> December 2014, provided they were born between 1<sup>st</sup> September and 31<sup>st</sup> December 1<sup>st</sup> September and 31<sup>st</sup> December. In both cases it is still necessary for the other member of the team to be eligible and comply with the eligibility criteria as listed in points 3.3 or 3.4 above. The following exception to this

principle applies: if sailors born between 1<sup>st</sup> September and 31<sup>st</sup> December, are ineligible for Junior, Youth or under 21 International competitions because of age restrictions for major international regattas imposed and determined by the International Class Association then they will normally be eligible for RYA UK Youth Squad support (e.g. Laser standard U21 as of 31<sup>st</sup> December 2014).

**Rationale:** This helps older sailors, who in some cases may be in their final school year, to remain part of the programme. Previously they would not otherwise have been eligible due to their 'sailing' age.

Selection to the RYA UK Youth Squad is conditional upon: full commitment to the programme; continuing to satisfy the eligibility criteria; meeting the physical fitness benchmarks set by Youth programme staff; complying with all terms and conditions within the squad contract; fulfilling all squad training requirements (unless dispensation has been sought and granted) and adherence to a personal competition and training programme.

Sailors who wish to be considered for a place in the RYA UK Youth Squad must apply online at <u>www.ryaracingevents.org.uk</u>. Sailors who are offered a place must be a member of the RYA in order to accept their place.

#### 4. Anticipated RYA UK Youth Squad sizes

Appendices A and B outline the intended RYA UK Youth Squad sizes, number of places normally allocated to girls, as well as the anticipated number of places intended to be allocated on the basis of the results. For the avoidance of doubt: all selections, squad sizes and composition will be determined by the Selectors, however this document outlines the clear intent of the Selection Committee.

#### 5. RYA UK Youth Squad Indicator Events

Appendices A and B also detail the three categories of events which contribute to selection decisions. These are:

- 1. *Primary*, which are used principally to allocate any results based places;
- 2. **Secondary**, which are used in conjunction with *primary* indicators to make any discretionary selections, and;
- 3. **Nominated squad review** events which are used (where necessary at the discretion of the Selectors) to select any additional sailors or to conclude the selections in the event that some or all selection decisions are deferred. These sailors would not normally have been initially invited from the **primary** and **secondary** indicator events. Most commonly these will be used to review the performance of those sailors for whom selection has been deferred and/or they have been invited to train alongside the RYA UK Youth Squad prior to confirming a full RYA UK Youth Squad status.

#### 6. Selection Committee

The Selection Committee is appointed by the RYA Youth Steering Group and currently comprises of the following people, none of whom will have eligible children within the Youth classes:

- Chair of Youth Selectors
- RYA Performance Director
- RYA Youth Racing Manager
- RYA Single-handed Pathway Manager
- RYA Double-handed Pathway Manager

### 7. Selection Criteria

RYA Selectors will normally use one or more of the following criteria to select sailors, in accordance with the YSG Guidelines for Selection:

- Performance at the Primary Indicator event.
- Performance at the Secondary Indicator event(s).
- Performance at *nominated squad review(s*).

Additionally, at the discretion of the Selectors the following may be taken into account:

- Performance at other identified squad review events.
- Age, height and weight.
- Performance at a significant international regatta.
- Performance at major national events/training.
- Future potential.
- Goals and aspirations.
- Attitude and behaviour at the events in the series and during previous training.
- Factors affecting results.
- Class ranking lists.
- Likely classification for Paralymic sailing events.
- Any other factors the Selectors consider appropriate.

Selectors or their representatives, may attend events during the year to gather information upon which to make their decisions. They may also review any available fitness testing data, as well as data and information provided as part of the application process. They may also monitor the results and seek relevant reports from coaches and class association representatives about the *primary* and *secondary indicators* and *squad review events*.

#### 8. Notification

Applicants will be notified in writing as soon as is practically possible after the completion of the final indicator event, and usually within 14 days. Successful sailor's names will be published on the RYA web-site once all attendance confirmation forms/contracts have been returned to the office – it is not our policy to publish this information before this time.

#### 9. Part 2 - 2014 RYA supported international event/grant selection

Following the secondary entry point and RYA UK Youth Squad review in April the selectors will, where possible, allocate results based international travel grants and places within RYA teams as well as make any discretionary decisions using the criteria listed in items 2 and 7. The likely size of any RYA teams, the process, number of grants available and the likely notification date is outlined in Appendix C.

Unless otherwise stated, or unless the eligibility criteria for the regatta differs, where an age category is mentioned as part of the results based criteria for international events or grants, this shall be assumed to be as of 1<sup>st</sup> September 2014. If any nominated age category grants/places are not awarded, usually because insufficient eligible sailors win places in teams via the class selection process, then any grants will revert to being offered at the discretion of the RYA UK Youth Squad selectors. This may result in that grant being offered in whole, in part or not offered at all depending on the Selector's appraisal of the best way of fulfilling the remit detailed in item 2.

Sailors may only normally accept a grant/subsidy for a given regatta from either the Youth or Olympic programme, not both. Where a selected sailor has already been offered an **Version 1** Page 5 of 17

Olympic Podium Potential Squad grant for that regatta, then the Youth grant may either be offered to another sailor or withheld entirely.

Additional support may be provided for other events identified later in the year as appropriate and relevant international competition experience by the head coach. This will be dependent on available funding and resource at that time.

#### **10.** Part 3 – RYA Tailored Support Programme

The RYA Tailored Support (TS) programme aims to support those youth sailors the Selectors have identified as having the most potential to progress to the Olympic programme and win medals at major international regattas. It may provide *additional* international competition exposure, sports science/lifestyle support or domestic and international training for a small number of boats/sailors supplementary to the core RYA UK Youth Squad programme. Support associated with the Tailored Support programme is designed to increase the British Sailing Teams chances of winning medals at World and European Championships and enable the smoothest progression to Olympic class sailing.

#### 11. Tailored Support Programme selections

Tailored Support Programme selections will be made by the Selectors using the eligibility criteria and processes outlined in items 2, 3, 5, 6 and 7 and Appendix D.

#### 12. Anticipated Tailored Support group sizes

The anticipated training group sizes, the processes which govern the allocation of places and the *primary* and *secondary* indicator events are outlined in Appendix D.

A number of the Tailored Support training group places will normally be determined from the results of the primary indicator event; other places may be offered on the basis of performance at both the primary and secondary indicator events, or from the identified squad reviews. Should there be no suitable squad review in a reasonable time frame; consideration will exceptionally be given to other significant class regattas/training.

# 13. Sailors who feel they may meet the eligibility criteria for Paralympic competition

The RYA endeavours to keep those sailors who feel they may ultimately be eligible for the Paralympics within able-bodied racing and race training programmes for as long as is practically possible, as this has been proven to be the most effective way to facilitate sailor development. Sailors are then either transferred across to the Olympic programme or the Paralympic programme, or invited to participate in one or both of them in parallel should this be considered most effective. Sailors or parents who would like further advice or feel they may meet the relevant criteria are encouraged to discuss in more detail with the relevant RYA Manager.

#### 15. Appeals

There will be no appeals against the published selection criteria or the actions of the Selectors, provided they follow the selection criteria. By entering the selection process sailors agree to this condition. The grounds for appeal are limited to allegations of:

- 1. Failure to follow due process.
- 2. Bias/undue influence.
- 3. Some other misconduct.

The criteria for appeal may not include any alleged error of judgement of the Selectors. Should an appeal still arise then it should be submitted to the Racing Manager/Performance Director within five days of the selection being announced. The full Appeals document is available on request from the RYA Racing Operations Manager.

#### 16. Status

The Royal Yachting Association (RYA)'s policies and procedures are subject to change from time to time, including variations required to comply with Sports Councils' directions on the investment of National Lottery funds. The RYA reserves the right to amend, supplement and/or discontinue at its absolute discretion, for whatever reason, any or all of its policies and procedures.

Grants will be repayable upon notification, if the competitor does not attend the regatta(s) for any reason. The RYA reserves the right NOT to provide international competition grants or withhold them for any reason.
