ELIGIBILITY FOR THE RYA POWERBOAT INSTRUCTOR COURSE

Candidates must fulfil the following criteria before taking part in the 3-day instructor training course:

- Minimum age 16 (no candidates will be accepted for training under this age)
- At least 5 season's logged experience of powerboating, preferably in a range of boat types and sizes. For those who use powerboats as an integral part of their full time occupation this period is reduced to one season
- RYA National Powerboat Certificate Level 2
- Pass a Powerboat Instructor Skills Assessment
- Valid first aid certificate (either the RYA's First Aid Certificate, or one recognised by the Health and Safety Executive, covering the treatment of hypothermia and drowning, and a minimum of 6 hours course length)
- Existing Instructors wishing to teach the Safety Boat Course must hold that level of certificate themselves and send in a copy to the Certification Department at the RYA to record.
- Existing Instructors wishing to teach the Intermediate and Advanced courses must hold the Advanced Course Completion Certificate, the Advanced Certificate of Competence (Exam) themselves, and attend a two-day endorsement course. (Minimum age 17 years)
