What's been happening?

CIRCUIT – NEW CONCEPT RACING

THE FUTURE.....

After quietly working away, Circuit is about to introduce 'turn key' racing in the guise of two new classes:

SL90 & SL250 – SL90 is a 90HP Evinrude Etec green engine which is designed to replace the S:850 Class and the SL250 is a 250HP 3.3 Litre Evinrude Etec motor similar to he one that won the Rouen Endurance race in May earlier this year.

The boats are designed and built by Nigel Hall based on S:850 and NS:2000 concepts but modified to suit the new engines.

OFFSHORE – HOT NEWS FOR HOT BOATS

In an attempt to return to the "run what you brung" theory, there are two new classes in the offing for 2007:

They are the Hot Boat 600 (up to 650) and Hot Boat 1000 (up to 1100).

The minimum lengths of the boats still have to be agreed, but a suggestion is that the Hot Boat 600 has a minimum length of 23ft and minimum weight of 1500kg without fuel; the Hot Boat 1000 has a minimum length of 27ft, with a power to weight ratio to be determined. Boats to carry two crew (driver and co-driver).

Although the racing rules still have to be fine-tuned, it is intended to keep them as simple as possible to bring back all the 'veteran' boats which we are sure are still out there and which would like to return to basic and national

racing. ORC to discuss at their next meeting on 4 October.

OFFSHORE – NEW CLUB FOR CLASSIC BOATS

A new Powerboat Racing club is in the process of being formed to bring back Classic Boats. The organisers have plans for the future, which may involve the return of some classic events too – watch this space!

OFFSHORE – PETE LITTLE RECOVERING FROM FREAK ACCIDENT IN ITALY

Our best wishes go to Pete Little, who is suffering from burns after an extraordinary on land accident whilst working on his boat in Viareggio at the Europeans. The Italian organisers and hospital were superb and he was very well cared for.

This is 'second time unlucky' for Pete as he had a racing accident in the Channel Isles, where his new boat was damaged. Better luck next time Pete!

After an enormous amount of organisation by Echinops, assisted and advised by the RYA, the Red Sea Rally went ahead as planned. UIM GENERAL ASSEMBLY

This time the GA will be held in Kuala Lumpur between 5-11 November.

Circuit has submitted three UK Proposals for consideration.

The RYA is awaiting receipt of all Proposals so a decision can be made on which way to vote.

It is imperative that representation is continued from the UK as it is our only opportunity to make sure that decisions taken will not impact significantly on our national sport.

This is the time when all bids from all the national authorities for international events are considered. Organisers need to make sure that they have the funds in place to host the event and settle the UIM fees which are attendant to running and international race.

INTERNATIONAL PRIZE MONEY

As Circuit competitors are aware, international prize money allocations are made to the National Authority at the end of the season, for onward transfer to their bank accounts. It is a requirement for the NA to prove to the UIM that this transaction has taken place.
