

RYA TECHNICAL COMMITTEE

TERMS OF REFERENCE

PREAMBLE

The RYA Technical Committee (the "Committee") is a policy-forming committee of the RYA Council.

1. PURPOSE

- 1.1 The general purpose of the Committee is to identify and service the boat-related technical needs of the RYA.
- 1.2 The specific purposes of the Committee include to:-
 - 1.2.1 Identify requirements and demands for the RYA Technical Department;
 - 1.2.2 Investigate solutions to technical requirements of the RYA Technical Department;
 - 1.2.3 Consult with the Technical Manager regarding Technical Department priorities when necessary;
 - 1.2.4 Offer, promote and support the commercial services of the Technical Unit as appropriate.

2. AUTHORITY

- 2.1 The Committee is authorised to act on the RYA Council's behalf in pursuit of the above purposes.
- 2.2 The Committee has specific authority to:-
 - 2.2.1 Nominate RYA technical delegates to the ISAF in consultation with the Racing Committee;
 - 2.2.2 Appoint technical task forces as and when necessary:
 - 2.2.3 Nominate RYA technical delegates to other outside bodies as appropriate (RORC, BSi, BSS, MCA etc);
 - 2.2.4 Appoint RYA Technical operatives including Measurers, Boat Inspectors, Surveyors etc;
 - 2.2.5 Consult and work with ISAF Technical and other MNA technical units:
 - 2.2.6 Create and dissolve informal working groups for specific purposes;
 - 2.2.7 Offer technical consultation and/or representation to external bodies as and when appropriate;

Classes

- 2.2.8 Recommend and Approve Alterations to National Class Rules;
- 2.2.9 Administer and Publish National Class Rules;
- 2.2.10 Interpret National Class Rules;
- 2.2.11 Recommend alterations to Class Rules;
- 2.2.12 Advise on the appointment of UK builders of National and International classes;
- 2.2.13 Oversee the administration of the measurement and certification of National Class, delegated International Classes and other racing boats;

Measurement

- 2.2.14 Investigate measurement methods and equipment for measurement;
- 2.2.15 Train RYA Measurers:
- 2.2.16 Advise Class Associations on the method and standards for training measurers and to undertake such training where necessary;
- 2.2.17 Appoint Measurers for RYA events;

Safety & Standards

- 2.2.18 Monitor and advise on the development of national and international technical rules, standards and controls for safety;
- 2.2.19 Monitor and advise on UK, EU and International technical directives, legislation and codes of practice relevant to small craft, their equipment and their use;

Racing Rules

- 2.2.20 Monitor and advise on any technical or measurement aspects relating to the development of Racing Rules;
- 2.2.21 Recommend alteration to any technical or measurement items relating to Racing Rules;

British Ship Registration

2.2.22 Oversee the administration of measurement and certification of craft for tonnage and appoint RYA tonnage measurers;

Handicapping and Rating

- 2.2.23 Investigate empirical and analytical methods of handicapping;
- 2.2.24 Determine and disseminate the RYA Portsmouth Numbers;
- 2.2.25 Agree those rating or handicap rules, schemes or systems recommended for national application.

3. MEETING ARRANGEMENTS

- 3.1 The Committee shall meet at least [three] times each year at such times and venues as the Chairman may decide.
- 3.2 The Quorum for Committee meetings shall be 50% of the voting members of the Committee.

4. COMPOSITION

4.1 Chairman

Appointed annually by the RYA Council after appropriate consultation.

Term: Not more than four years in any period of five.

The Chairman shall be *ex-officio* the Committee's representative on the RYA Council in accordance with Article 16 of the RYA's Articles of Association.

4.2 Deputy Chairman

Appointed by the Committee, at its discretion, from amongst the Standing Members and Ex-Officio Members.

Term: Not more than one year in any period of two.

4.3 Standing Members

Up to eight members appointed by the RYA Council on the nomination of the Chairman, to ensure that the Committee has the competencies identified in Section 5 below.

Term: Three years, subject to a maximum of two three year terms. Maximum six years in any period of seven.

4.4 Ex-Officio Members

The chairmen of the Committee's sub-committees shall be Ex-Officio Members of the Committee.

4.5 Non-voting Corresponding Members

The Chairman may additionally co-opt as non-voting Corresponding Members any other person who appears to the Chairman to have expertise relevant to the Committee.

5. COMPETENCIES

- 5.1 Standing Members should, wherever possible, be appointed for their knowledge, skills and ability appropriate to the purposes of the Committee in the following areas:-
 - 5.1.1 Measurements of boats;
 - 5.1.2 Building of boats;
 - 5.1.3 Naval Architecture, yacht surveying, test methodology;
 - 5.1.4 Offshore racing yacht measurement;

- 5.1.5 Club and Class Associations;
- 5.1.6 Marine safety equipment.
- 5.2 The Chairman should seek to achieve a fair and representative balance of age, gender, ethnicity and disability amongst the membership of the Committee.
