

Rounding a Leeward mark








Keep Clear

A boat keeps clear of a right-of-way boat


- (a)if the right-of-way boat can sail her course with no need to take avoiding action and,
- (b)when the boats are *overlapped*, if the right-of-way boat can also change course in both directions without immediately making contact.
















Room

The space a boat needs in the existing conditions, including space to comply with her obligations under the rules of Part 2 and rule 31, while manoeuvring promptly in a seamanlike way.





Definition Room

Definition Mark-Room

- No transition from "to the mark" to "at the mark".
- Properly deals with passing marks, gates and the finishing line.
- Space while manoeuvring promptly in a seamanlike way.
- Room to tack only when the boat can then fetch the mark.





Mark-Room


Room for a boat to leave a mark on the required side. Also,

- (a) room to sail to the mark when her proper course is to sail close to it, and
- (b) room to round the mark as necessary to sail the course.

However, *mark-room* for a boat does not include *room* to tack unless she is *overlapped* inside and to *windward* of the boat required to give *mark-room* and she would be *fetching* the *mark* after her tack.












Rule 18.2, Giving Mark-Room

- (c) When a boat is required to give mark-room by rule 18.2(b),
- (1) she shall continue to do so even if later an *overlap* is broken or a new *overlap* begins;
- (2) if she becomes *overlapped* inside the boat entitled to *mark-room*, she shall also give that boat *room* to sail her *proper course* while they remain *overlapped*.
- However, if the boat entitled to *mark-room* passes head to wind or leaves the *zone*, rule 18.2(b) ceases to apply.








Rule 18.2(c)(2)












Rule 18.2, Giving Mark-Room

(e) If a boat obtained an inside overlap from clear astern or by tacking to windward of the other boat and, from the time the overlap began, the outside boat has been unable to give mark-room, she is not required to give it.












Rule 21, Exoneration

When a boat is sailing within the *room* or *mark-room* to which she is entitled under a rule of Section C, she shall be exonerated if, in an incident with a boat required to give her that *room* or *mark-room*,

- (a) she breaks a rule of Section A, rule 15 or rule 16, or
- (b) she is compelled to break rule 31.








Rule 21







Call D10

Penalize Y as she fails to give room.

Rule 11 also applies and requires B to keep clear of Y. However, B is exonerated under rule 21 because she was sailing within the room to which she was entitled when she broke rule 11.





Rule 18.3, Tacking in the Zone

If a boat in the *zone* passes head to wind and is then on the same *tack* as a boat that is *fetching* the *mark*, rule 18.2 does not thereafter apply between them. The boat that changed *tack*

- (a) shall not cause the other boat to sail above closehauled to avoid contact or prevent the other boat from passing the *mark* on the required side, and
- (b) shall give *mark-room* if the other boat becomes overlapped inside her.

Appendix D Changes

- Informal protest and redress hearings apply automatically to all team racing.
- A boat may take a penalty by retiring, [etc].
- Loophole allowing an umpire error to be recovered by abandoning the race is closed.
- When a supplied boat suffers a breakdown, rule D5 applies. This is not redress.





Appendix D Changes Protest Procedure

Rule D2.2, Protests by Boats

When a boat protests under a rule of Part 2 or under rule 31 or 42 for an incident in the racing area, she is not entitled to a hearing and the following applies:

- (a) She shall hail 'Protest' and conspicuously display a red flag at the first reasonable opportunity for each.
- (b) The boats shall be given time to respond. A boat involved in the incident may respond by promptly taking an appropriate penalty or clearly indicating that she will do so as soon as possible.
- (c) If no boat takes a penalty, an umpire shall decide whether to penalize any boat.
- (d) If more than one boat broke a rule and was not exonerated, an umpire may penalize any boat that broke a rule and did not take an appropriate penalty.
- (e) An umpire shall signal a decision in compliance with rule D2.4.
- (f) A boat penalized by an umpire shall take a Two-Turns Penalty.





Appendix D Changes

Rule D2.2, Protests by Boats

When a boat protests under a rule of Part 2 or under rule 31 or 42 for an incident in the racing area, she is not entitled to a hearing and the following applies:

(d) If more than one boat broke a rule and was not exonerated, an umpire may penalize any boat that broke a rule and did not take an appropriate penalty.





Appendix D Changes

Rule D2.3, Penalties Initiated by an Umpire


An umpire may penalize a boat without a *protest* by another boat, or report the incident to the protest committee, or both, when the boat

- (b) breaks a rule of Part 2 and makes contact with another boat on her team or with a boat in another race, and no boat takes a penalty;
- (e) clearly indicates that she will take a One-Turn Penalty, and then fails to do so;






No Penalty




Umpire Protest

Call E6 Q2


Rule 18.3 does not apply.

B has right of way throughout but, when the boats become overlapped while Y is subject to rule 13, rule 18.2(a) requires B to give Y mark-room. B fails to give mark-room.

However, because the overlap was created by Y tacking to windward of B, rule 18.2(e) applies.








Call F2 Q3&4

No penalty. When, after position 1, boats B and Y are at the obstruction A, rule 19 requires the outside boat B to give the inside boat Y room between B and A. However, at position 2, B is no longer required to keep clear of A and, as a result, A is no longer an obstruction. Because A is not an obstruction, rule 19 no longer applies between B and Y, and B is therefore no longer required to give Y room to pass to leeward of A. Y keeps clear of B and A as required by rules 11 and 12, respectively.








Call B4

A right-of-way boat changing course may comply with rule 16.1 by changing course further and thus giving the other boat room to keep clear.
