This week's event concentrated on practicing start line-ups with an eclectic fleet of Lasers, RS Q'ba's, RS Fevas, RS200s, RS Ventures and a Xenon taking to the water. Significant

improvements were seen across the fleet by the end of the third race and prizes were handed out accordingly by the club's Marine Department.

Get Racing Club participant Alex Taylor sailing in a club RS Venture commented, "I hope to do as many Get Racing Club events as possible; they are just such an amazing opportunity and free!"

Get Racing Club founder, Melvyn Cooper noted, "I'm so delighted by the response and support of the Get Racing Club initiative from both the HISC participants and the club mentors. It's fantastic to see so many people getting involved with this new club racing initiative; sailors taking part in GRC events have met other members for the first time and sailed together in the club RS Ventures; it's become a very sociable event!"
