ONE MONTH AFTER HISTORIC FLOODING IN IOWA MASSACHUSETTS-BASED HANDS ON DISASTER RESPONSE COMMITS TO ANOTHER 3 MONTHS OF RELIEF EFFORTS

Organization extends Cedar Rapids flood response project to late October.

CEDAR RAPIDS, IA 7/16/08 – Hand On Disaster Response (HODR) is a volunteerdriven certified 501(c)3 non-profit organization, currently deployed in Iowa after recent record-breaking flooding. The organization's Project Cedar Rapids is coordinating volunteer efforts to meet the needs of flood-affected residents and has recently announced the extension of its efforts to October 25, 2008. HODR has been serving the Cedar Rapids area through volunteer services since June 23, 2008.

In Palo, IA, a community of 500 homes, approximately 470 were flooded. In Cedar Rapids, Iowa's second largest city, more than 5,000 structures were affected. There are still thousands of homes to be gutted. HODR has extended Project Cedar Rapids in response to the unfaltering need for volunteer resources.

Volunteers are helping with removing flood-soaked home contents and gutting out drywall and flooring, along with other services. All volunteer labor provided by HODR is free of charge. In the 3 weeks of the organization's efforts in the Cedar Rapids area HODR has coordinated more than 550 volunteers from 28 states, including New York, and as far away from devastated Cedar Rapids as Washington, New Mexico and Florida. Volunteers, ranging in age from 10-years to 81-years, have gutted more than 70 homes in Cedar Rapids and Palo, bringing families one step closer to rebuilding.

"The flood affected so many people, many without insurance to cover repairs. There is a lot of work to be done and we are here to help, to continue to support this community in its recovery," says Bill Driscoll Jr, Project Cedar Rapids Operations Director.

Project Cedar Rapids is HODR's 9th deployment including recent responses to tornadoes in Missouri and Arkansas, and to Cyclone Sidr in Bangladesh. HODR was founded by businessman David Campbell, a resident of Carlisle, MA, as a result of the devastating effects of the tsunami in December, 2004, when his one week volunteer visit in Thailand turned into a one month stay. To date, HODR has mobilized more than 3,000 volunteers from 30 countries through its projects around the world assisting in recovery after natural

disasters. HODR provides volunteers with housing, meals, tools and organized work at no charge to the volunteer.
