We highly support the use of Kattack GPS tracking devices. We were exposed to Kattack as a device to review the racing, and it was very informative and well received by the sailors. An unexpected safety feature was that on one foggy day, as navigation in unfamiliar waters became difficult, the sailors were able to use the devices for safe return to the harbour.
