



# Rule 10 – OPPOSITE TACKS Rule 62.1 - REDRESS

When boats are on opposite *tacks*, a *port-tack* boat shall *keep clear* of a starboard-tack boat.

C

Although Yellow capsized, not all of the conditions for redress in rule 62.1 were met – in this case, there was no injury or physical damage because of the action of a boat that was breaking a rule of Part 2. Therefore, Yellow was not entitled to any redress.

Disqualify Blue and award no redress to yellow.




## Rule 13 – WHILE TACKING Rule 10 – ON OPPOSITE TACKS Rule 18.2 – GIVING MARK-ROOM

Blue tacks ahead of Yellow and, whilst doing so, is subject to rule 13; hence, once she passes head to wind, she shall *keep clear* of Yellow. When she is on her close-hauled course, she is on port tack and subject to rule 10. Yellow has to alter course to keep clear of Blue.

Blue was initially entitled to *mark-room* from Yellow after entering the *zone* (rule 18.2(b)), but this ceased to apply once she passed head to wind (rule 18.2(c)).

**Disqualify Blue.** 




#### Rule 16.1 – CHANGING COURSE

Neither rule 18 (Mark-room) nor rule 19 (Room to pass an obstruction) applies when boats are approaching a starting mark to start. Blue is therefore not required to give Yellow room to pass the committee boat.

However, rule 16.1 requires Blue to give Yellow room to keep clear when she changes course. When Blue changes course at position 3, she fails to give Yellow room to keep clear.

**Disqualify Blue.** 



The fleet are sailing down the run looking for the leeward gate. One mark is clearly visible, but the other one cannot be seen. The competitors see a race committee boat that is to port of the leeward mark and is displaying the illustrated flag. This means:

The mark is missing and the fleet should pass between the boat and the remaining mark.

 The mark is missing and the fleet should round me and sail straight to the finish.

A. This race committee boat is licensed in Scotland.

Races not started are *postponed*. No more racing today.

#### **Rule 34 – MARK MISSING**

If a *mark* is missing or out of position, the race committee shall, if possible ......

(b) substitute an object displaying flag M and make repetitive sound signals.

The mark is missing and the fleet should pass between the boat and the remaining mark..
