Many thanks to Roger McAll who has been very helpful in trying to identify who's got what in the boat park. This huge task is now appearing a little more manageable!

34th AMERICA'S CUP JULY TO SEPT 2013 SAN FRANCISCO HARBOUR

This is 'World Cup' of sailing held every 3 years. It started in 1851 in the Solent when the Yacht America beat the British entry and retained it until 1983. Since then the cup has been held intermittently by Australia, New Zealand, and in 1994 landlocked Switzerland. Racing is on yachts determined by the holding nation and this year racing is on 72 ft foiling wing sail (hard - like an aircraft wing) catamarans that sail at 50 mph.



Racing commenced on the 6th July 2013 in San Francisco with the Louis Vuitton Cup to determine which country will challenge the current cup holders, USA, in September. Sweden, Italy and New Zealand are fighting it out to challenge USA in September.

The teams are:

- USA (defender) Oracle
- Sweden (Artemis)
- Italy (Luna Rossa)
- New Zealand (Emirates Team New Zealand)

Sailing these speed machines are the top sailors in the world including Ben Ainslie - Oracle, Nathan Outteridge (2012 49er Olympic gold medalist) - Artemis, Tom Slingsby (2012 Laser gold medalist) - Oracle, Iain Percy (2012 UK Star Silver medalist) – Artemis. The favourite helms are Jimmy Spithill who won the last America's cup for the USA in 2009 and Dean Barker who won in 2000 for NZ. Ainslie will crew for the USA and has desires to run a British team in the 2017 Cup. At £10m per boat and £50m to run an America's Cup campaign, raising the cash is a sizeable challenge and usually only done with the help of indulgent corporate billionaires.

Sky Sports is the UK broadcast partner and Channel 4 broadcast a magazine show each Wednesday 2.30am (record it!) but the racing is best viewed live/replay on youtube: www.youtube.com/user/AmericasCup. PBSC SUMMER CAMP 2013

This year's sailing camp at Chichester Harbour is due to run from Saturday 27 July until Sunday 4 August. It has been a regular part of the sailing programme for many years and is one of our biggest sailing events in terms of participation and time on the water.

Chichester Harbour is a fabulous setting and provides the perfect venue for a week of sailing as a group visiting the various creeks, villages and sailing clubs round in the area. The campsite is in the grounds of Cobnor House close to the waters edge with toilets and showers nearby.

Unfortunately this year some of the regular organisers are not around to help and there has been some doubt as to whether the camp will continue. However there is still a lot of interest from club members in attending and the club committee have been keen for the event to continue but in a simpler format to reduce the organisation required.

The main changes are:-

- 1) This years camp will be self catering and those attending will have to bring their own cooking facilities or cater in small groups.
- 2) The club will be charging a contribution towards wear and tear on club boats and so there will be a two tier pricing structure covering those
 - With their own boats (that must be capable of keeping up with the main fleet) i)
 - Per Day Activity Adult Camping/Sailing Club Boat £13.00 Child Camping/Sailing Club Boat £10.00 Adult Camping/ Sailing Own Boat £9.00 Child Camping/ Sailing own Boat £7.50 Adult Sailing only £8.00 Child Sailing only £7.50 Adult Camping only £5.00 £2.50 Child Camping only All prices subject to confirmation of current charges from the Cobnor Estate
 - ii) Those without their own boats

Other features of camp such as the use of Kellie, the camp fire and the marguee will still be there.

Space will be limited by the boat capacity so please let me know as soon as possible at rogerjhumphries1@aol.com if you wish to attend.
