
Bringing up the rear.

Well, we started Sunday racing again on the 23rd March with half a dozen sailors and this has built up steadily as the weather got warmer each week. We endured a horrid southerly on the weekend of the 26/27 April meaning that we could not launch either the safety boats (training new helms) or the dinghy fleet on the Sunday. In contrast the following weekend we held cadets and safety boat training on the Saturday and the first of our series of pursuit races on the Sunday. Both days were blessed with fine weather and a F1-3. For those of you that don't know, a pursuit race is a timed max. 90 minute race, launching off the beach on a staggered basis with the slowest boat starting first, the fastest last. If the handicaps are correct, at the end of 90 minutes when the positions are recorded the theory is that all boats should have caught up with each other. Invariably they don't, due to the different sailing abilities and conditions on the day. Well done to Gary and Harry Pearson in their souped-up Wayfarer for coming first. Next pursuit race 3rd August.

Wealden District Council have now put out their swimming area marker buoys approximately 200m off shore, towards the Pevensey side of the sailing area. Please do not either sail or race on the land side of these. Please note in races you will be disqualified if you do. On the same tack please note that a fisherman can throw a lead line 250m (member Richard Taylor dutifully informs me) and can penetrate hull and body alike. Do please be aware and where feasible avoid the fisherman's lines – we wish to enjoy our respective sports in harmony.

Federation Cup Sunday 15th June

The East Sussex County Sailing Federation (Rye to Newhaven) is putting on its annual Federation Cup on Sunday the 15th June. This event is an established sailing competition between six East Sussex coastal sailing clubs and is held once a year and moves each year to the next easterly sailing club in the Federation. The event consists of two races, one in the morning and one in the afternoon. There are four classes of boats.
