Our Royal History

The Savill Garden was created by Sir Eric Savill, grand master of the woodland garden, in the 1930s with the support of King George V and Queen Mary. Since that time, the Garden has continued to develop under Royal Patronage, with most recently HM The Queen opening the Rose Garden.

Our Plant Hunting Heritage

Great Britain has a strong tradition of plant hunting. This practice began in Victorian times with intrepid plant hunters carefully choosing plants from all over the world to introduce into their own country. Our Keeper of the Gardens, Mark Flanagan, follows in the footsteps of plant hunters like Ernest Wilson as he continues the search for interesting new additions to bring to The Savill Garden.

Our National Collections

Eight National Collections are represented in the Garden including Magnolia, Rhododendron Species and Mahonia. Affiliation to this scheme has had the dual benefit of not only protecting important garden plants against the dangers of extinction but has also meant that we are able to showcase these plants for our visitors to enjoy throughout the year.

Our Champion Trees

A Champion Tree is the nationally recognised accreditation for the tallest tree or example with the largest girth within each type of tree in the UK. We have more than twenty Champion Trees in The Savill Garden.

Windsor Castle



Virginia Water

First damned and flooded in 1753, Virginia Water was, until the creation of the great reservoirs, the largest man made body of water in the British Isles.

Visitors can admire the ornamental cascade from the 18th century, a 'Roman Temple' built from ruins from the ancient city of Leptis Magna in the early 19th century, and a towering 100 foot high Totem Pole.

The Valley Gardens

A pleasant one mile walk or escorted coach trip from The Savill Garden brings visitors to The Valley Gardens. These world renowned gardens, also landscaped by Sir Eric Savill, are set in the deep lakeside valleys that give them their name.

They are a delight at any time of year, but reach the peak of perfection from March to June. Groups can enjoy the Azalea display from late April in the Punchbowl for which the Gardens are famous. Please call for details of escorted trips to The Valley Gardens.


How to get to The Savill Garden

- The Savill Garden is a mile from Englefield Green and 4 miles from Windsor Castle.
 Approach via the A30 from the south and west, and by the A308 from the east and north. It is also close to the M25 (J13), M4 (J6) and M3
- The Savill Garden is less than 10 miles from Heathrow airport and an hour from Gatwick via the M23 and M25
- The Savill Garden coach park is ONLY accessible from Wick Lane, and visitors from all directions should follow the brown tourist signs saying 'The Royal Landscape', 'The Savill Garden' or depicting a flower symbol
- For sat navs, please use postcode TW20 OXD to guide you to Wick Lane and the coach entrance to The Savill Garden. Please be aware that some satellite navigation devices have misinformed visitors of the route to the garden and as such, should not be relied on to direct you to the coach park


Accessibility for disabled visitors

- The Savill Building and The Savill Garden offer good accessibility for disabled visitors
- Non-motorised wheelchairs are available on a first come, first served basis
- Assistance dogs are welcome to all parts of The Royal Landscape
- There are good all weather paths around The Savill Garden, allowing access for wheelchair users
- Carers accompanying disabled visitors enjoy free entry into The Savill Garden
- The garden has some slight inclines and dips, we therefore suggest that there are some sections of the garden that may require an able bodied carer to assist when using a non-motorised wheelchair
- The Valley Garden by its very nature, is less easily accessible for visitors with restricted mobility
