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Redress – Working with the Current Rule

- Considerable debate may be had on the extent of the current redress rule, but that is for another day.

- In Miami last week 32 out of 43 cases were redress.
 - Giving help under 1.1 Generous or not?
 - Damage after Part 2 49er tiller extensions?
 - Race Committee
 - OCS, BFD
 - Moving mark redress on redress whole fleet
 - Protest Committee decision
 - Who should hear?





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Restricting Redress

This SI shall not be grounds for redress.
 Changes RRS 62.

 This SI shall not be grounds for a redress claim by a boat. Changes 60.(b)





An interesting debate

- 62.1(b) Physical damage or injury
 - If there is damage or injury as required for redress how much redress is appropriate?
 - For the time lost caused by time taken to effect repairs or loss of speed?
 - For the whole incident
 - For example, if a boat is entangled in an incident for 3 minutes and then takes 2 minutes to repair the damage. How much redress?
