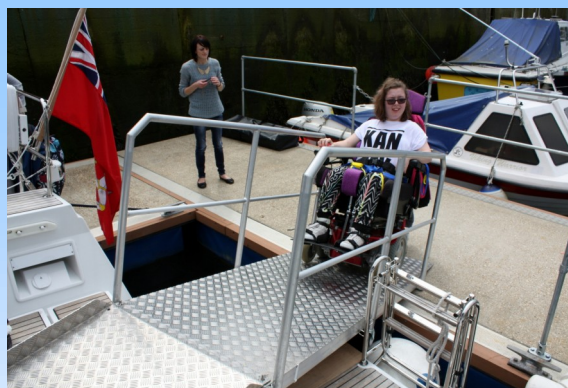
Having no sailing experience is not a barrier to joining us and with the support of our able bodied members you will be able to experience the magic, and varied nature, of being under sail. We believe that disability should not be a barrier to any person sailing. With adaptations, our boat allows those with mobility problems, including wheelchair users, to be able to join our sails.



ABOUT PRIDE OF MANN III

Our current vessel is a Beneteau Oceanis 48 cruiser named Pride of Mann III, purchased new in September 2014.

She has some special adaptations to suit our needs and these include a moveable cockpit table to provide additional space, and a lift platform to assist those with mobility problems to go below. These, together with stern boarding and a ramp, allow wheelchair users to be accommodated.



She is comfortably furnished with ten berths in five cabins and has three toilets: up to 14 people can be carried on a sail. The cockpit is protected from the elements by an enclosure. She is equipped to a high standard, with the latest electronic navigation aids and safety equipment.



FUNDING

Our members pay an annual membership fee and raise money through flag days, fundraising events, and collection boxes. Other funding comes from our corporate members and sponsors, charitable trusts and private donations. Every contribution is greatly valued and help with fund raising is always needed.
