### Club House Extension

We are considering how we can improve our club facilities.

Currently, the committee are considering options to extend the club house, to improve training facilities and to make the most of the space available. So far extension to the ground floor, to create another training room and a balcony out of the front of the building and an extensions to the side of the club house to increase the upstairs room size are two options being investigated. Any views or ideas on this would be welcomed.

The committee agreed to insulate the roof of the clubhouse, to make winter socials and meetings a warmer affair. We have also agreed to install Internet facilities at the club. Initially, this will be purchased on a pay as you go basis. This will mean that if it's not used we don't have to pay, usage can be monitored and initial set up costs can be kept at a minimum.

## **Summer Training Weeks**

Two full training weeks are being run 4th—8th July and

8th—12th August.

These courses are run using the Royal Yachting Association (RYA) Learn to sail program, which enables sailors to progress through stages from beginner to advanced levels and onto racing.

With a range of boats including Oppies, toppers, Laser Picos,

Mirrors and GP 14s

These courses cater for all age groups and abilities.

Our boats are great for learning and developing skills.

Signing up early helps the Senior Instructors to organize groups and boats to ensure that each attendee gets the most out of their training. So, if you know of anyone who is interested, please get them to sign up as soon as possible.



#### Club Boat Renewal

Our club boats are a vital resource for the club, providing a variety of boats for all ages and abilities to learn to race and sail in. In recent years we have been following a plan for renewal and boat maintenance.

In the last year we have been successful in receiving grant funding to support our plans. This has meant that we have managed to:

Increase our fleet of Picos to 6; Purchase 3 race standard Optimists; Replace old boat covers and buy a new Club Mirror. We have also bought new sails for our training Op-

pies.

We are now considering how to develop our fleet for families and adult training.

## **Racing Program Changes**

We have a full racing program from March to November.

Again, the club championship will be based on all handicap races throughout the year, except for the one day trophy events. This gives a maximum of 50 races. This year we have extended the number of races that can be discarded. Competitors

will be able to discard up to 20 of their worst results.

The Class Championships will be based on the Thursday evening Class race results. One discard will be awarded for every four races completed.

The Helm Handicap will be run on a coached race basis. Competitors will

have the option of being coached before, during and after the race, if they wish.
