



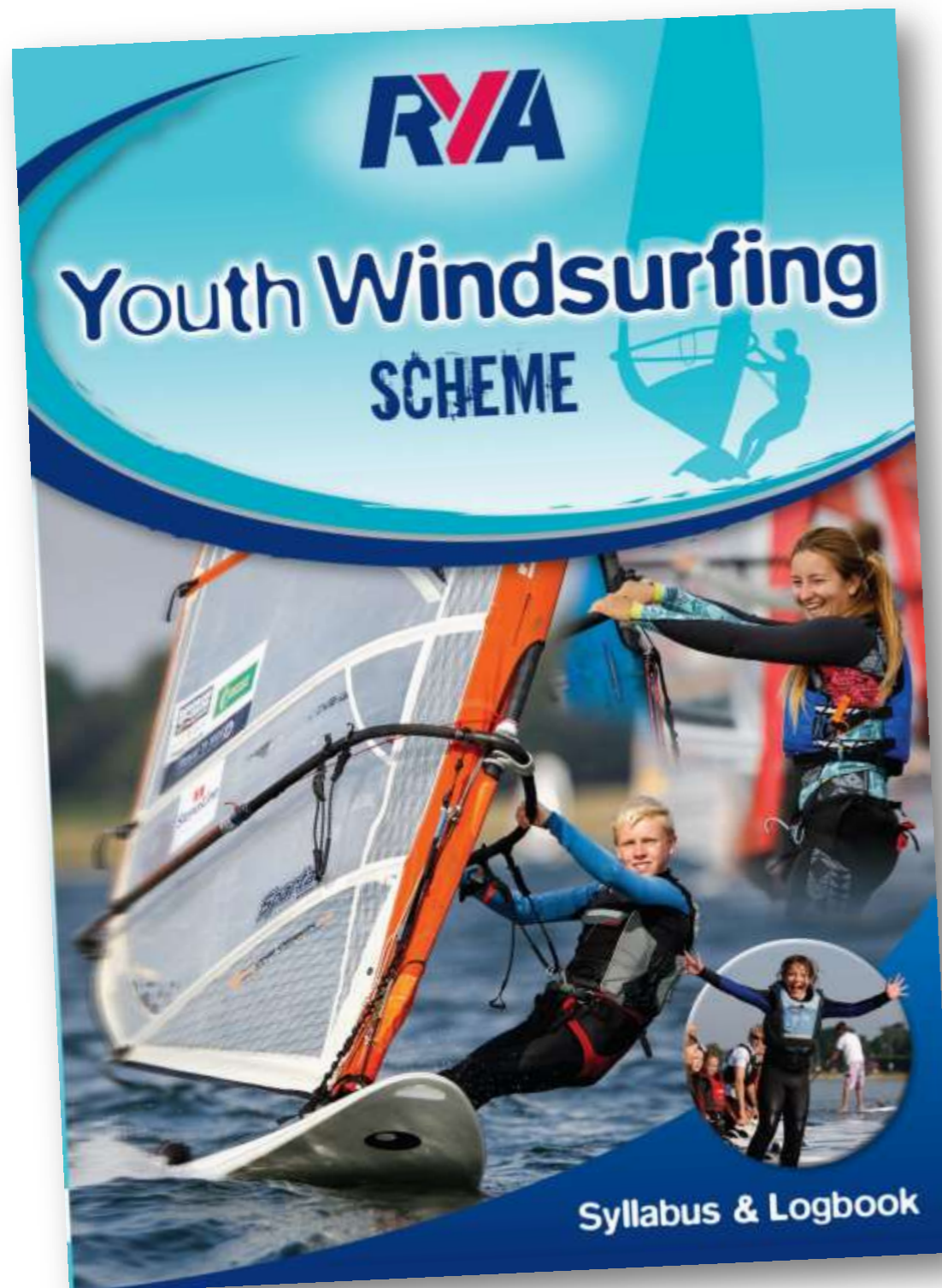

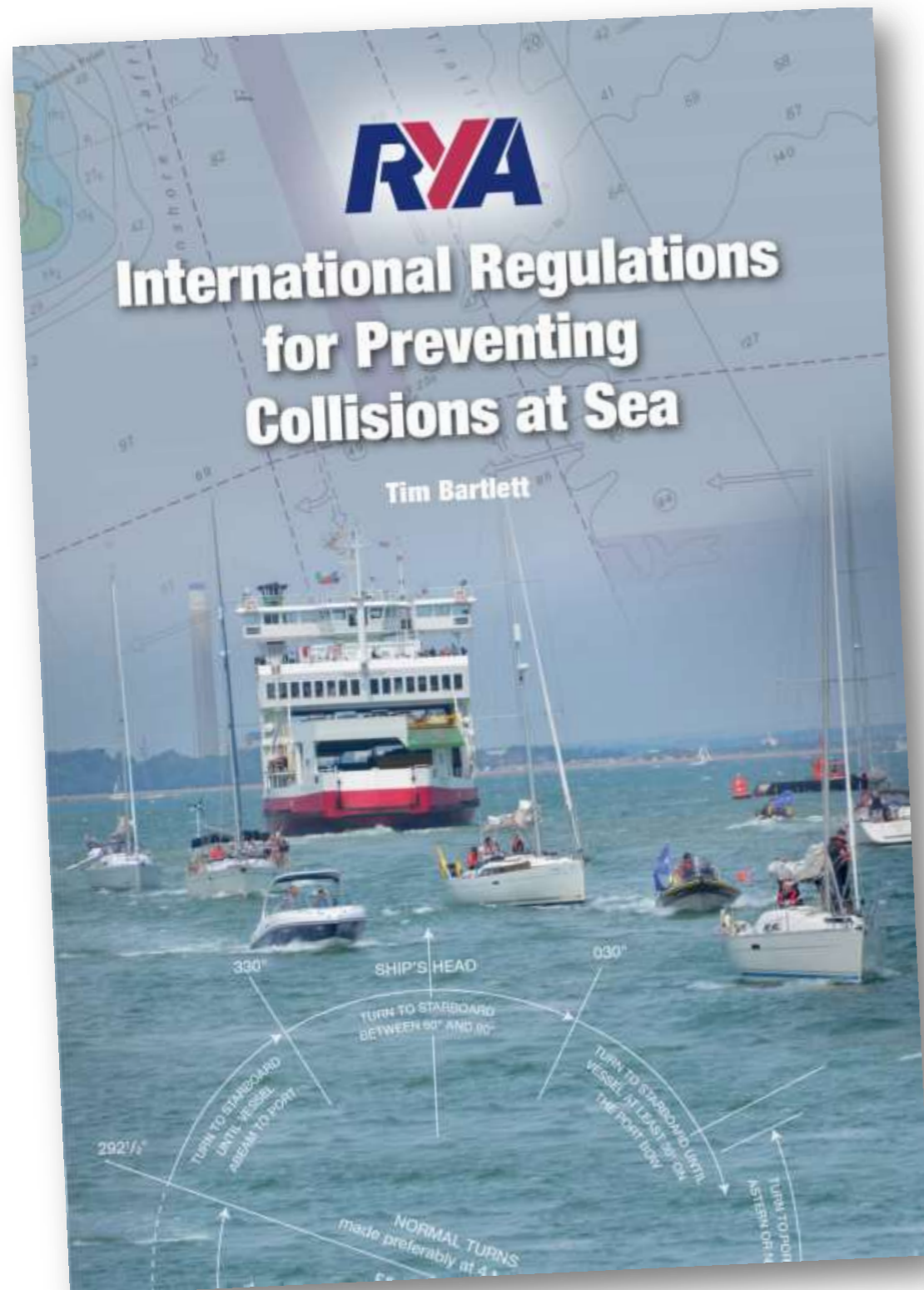

Restructured to rule order and split into themes (i.e. restricted visibility).

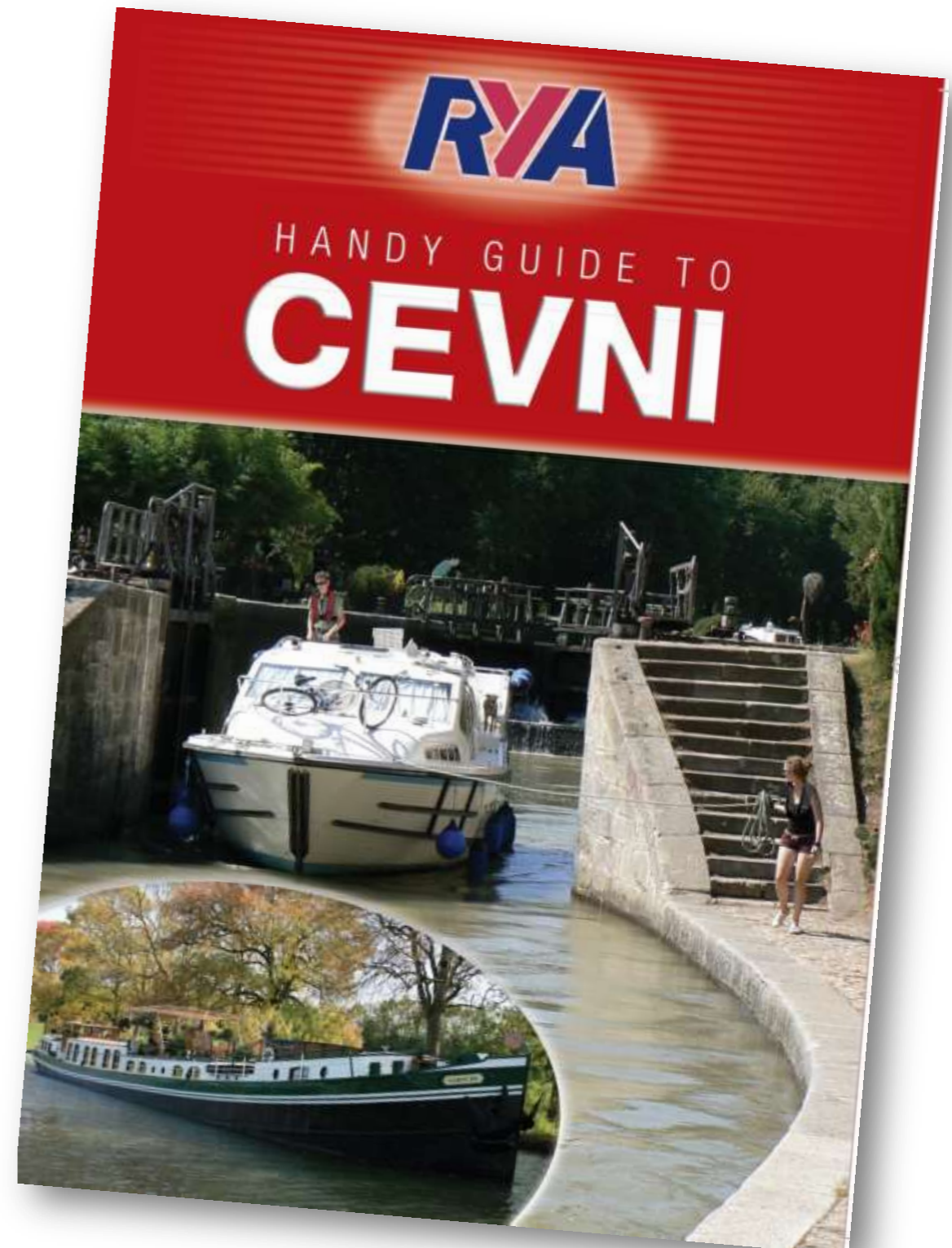
Illustrations enhanced and eBook includes interactive 360° tool.

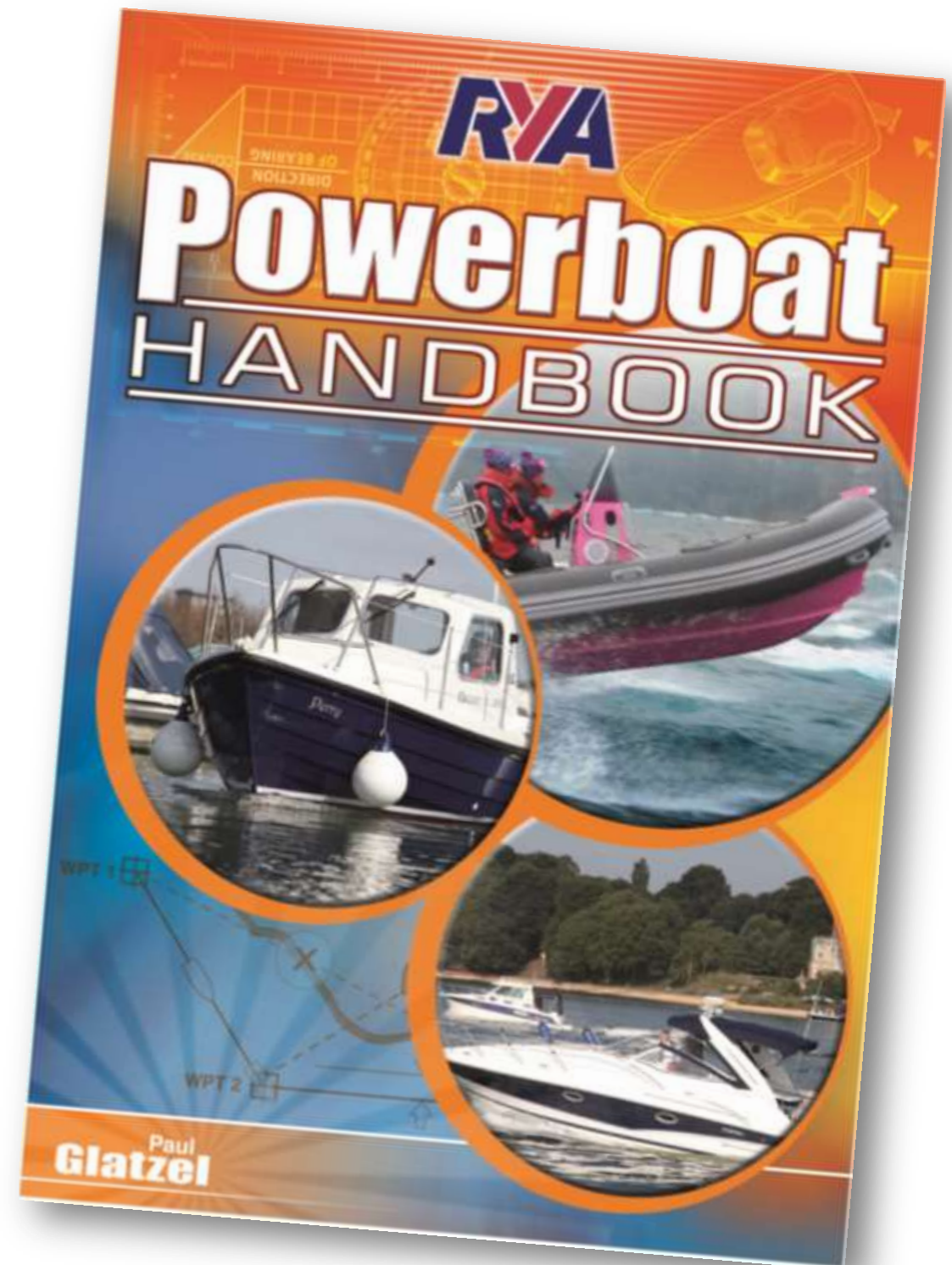

Content Evolution

Rules 23 to 31: Who shows what?
 Rules 23 to 31, and their predecessors, have blighted the lives of generations of Cadets and Midshipmen! Accounting for almost a third of the Colregs' word-count, they list every light and shape for every kind of vessel from a rowing dinghy to a supertanker – including seaplanes and submerged objects under tow!

In fact, the Rules are less complicated than they seem. In general, and with very few significant exceptions:

- any vessel that is moving shows sidelights and a sternlight
- any vessel that is proceeding under its own power shows masthead lights
- any vessel that is claiming special status shows additional all-round lights.

The most common problem is usually picking out the navigation lights from a mass of deck and accommodation lights.

Rule 23: Power-driven vessels underway

(a) A power-driven vessel underway shall exhibit:

- a masthead light forward;
- a second masthead light abaft of and higher than the forward one; except that a vessel of less than 50 metres in length shall not be obliged to exhibit such light but may do so;
- sidelights;
- a sternlight.

(b) An air-cushion vessel when operating in the non-displacement mode shall, in addition to the lights prescribed in paragraph (a) of this Rule, exhibit an all-round flashing yellow light.

(c) A wing-in-ground vessel when operating on the surface shall, in addition to the lights prescribed in paragraph (a) of this Rule, exhibit an all-round flashing yellow light.



Power-driven vessel under 50m

A power-driven vessel of less than 50 metres in length carries the four basic lights: a green starboard sidelight; a red port sidelight; a white sternlight, and a white masthead light.



Power-driven vessel probably over 50m

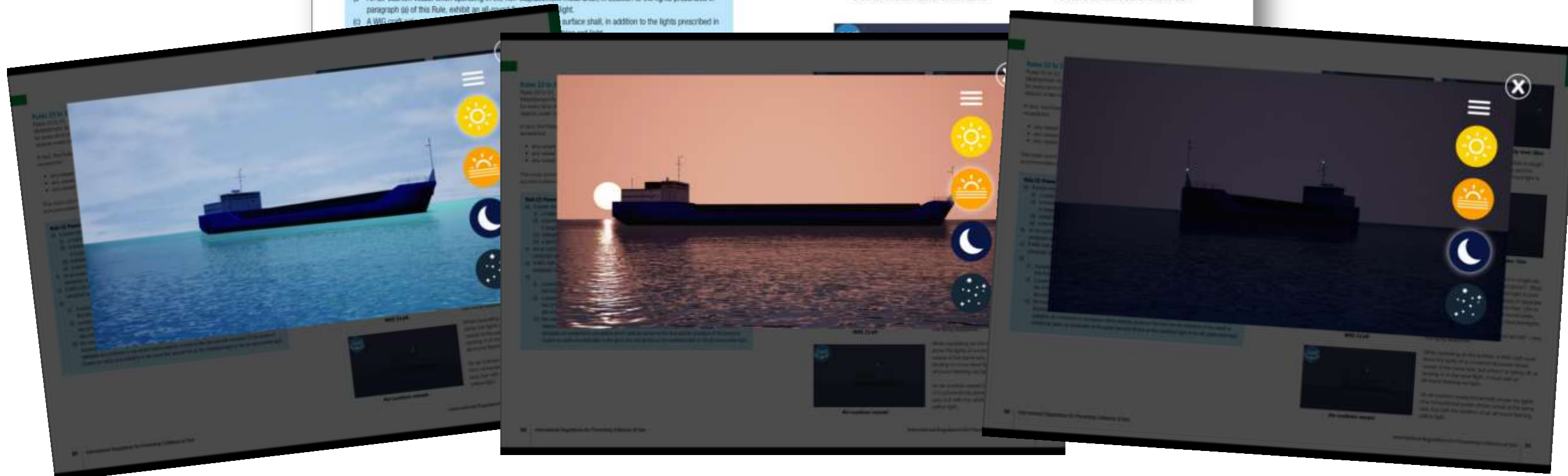
A power-driven vessel over 50 metres in length carries the four basic lights, plus a second masthead light. The forward masthead light is always the lower of the two.

Power-driven vessel under 12m

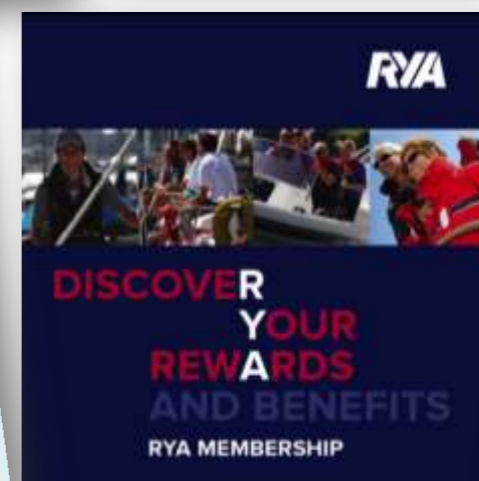
