Choose environmentally friendly cleaning and maintenance products. Avoid those containing chlorine, bleach and phosphates. Check out The Green Directory www.sailingnetworks.com/green

Hull

Choose anti-foul with the lowest levels of copper and biocide suitable for your boat. Take care to avoid spills when applying. Dispose of any waste materials used for boat maintenance correctly, using recycling or hazardous facilities as appropriate.

Trailer

Avoid spreading non native invasive species; wash down your dinghy and trailer before towing and launching in other areas. Use a hose trigger to shut off water supply when not in use.
