Universal LLIN Distribution report for the week: 23rd – 27th March 2015 – Week 1

Concern Universal (CU) in conjunction with Dowa District Council, with funding from Against Malaria Foundation (AMF), is conducting a Universal Coverage Long Lasting Insecticide Treated Nets (LLIN) distribution as part of the National Malaria Control Programme's (NMCP) 2015 Mass Distribution Campaign. CU received 396,900 nets from AMF to cater for the Dowa district coverage. The project commenced in October 2014 with pre-distribution activities such as, community and stake holder sensitisations, beneficiary registration, data entry and beneficiary verification exercises.

SUMMARY OF THE WEEKS ACTIVITY

During the week of the 23rd to 27th March 2015 the following were carried out.

- Ferrying the nets from the warehouse in Mponela to the following health facilities: Thonje, Mvera Mission, Mvera Army, Chezi and Chankhungu.
- Sensitising the community on net usage.
- Making communications to relevant stakeholders on the LLIN distribution schedule.
- Distributed 56,261 Nets to beneficiaries under Thonje, Mvera Mission, Mvera Army, Chezi and Chankhungu.

During the first week of distributions, we distributed LLIN in the planned eight health facilities of Thonje, Mvera Mission, Mvera Army, Chezi and Chankhungu.

Distributions were conducted in all the 62 villages under Chezi health centre and 83 villages under Mvera Mission, however we did not conduct distributions to one village each under Thonje, Mvera Army and Chankhungu Health facilities. The villages that we did not conduct the distributions were Chambadzana with 64 net demand under Thonje, Nkhambe village with 138 net requirements under Mvera army and Mlenga village with 77 net requirements under Chankhungu health facility. The beneficiaries for the said villages did not turn up on the distribution days hence their nets were returned to the warehouse, however we will consider them when conducting the mop up distributions.

During the first week we managed to distribute 56,261 nets of the planned 56,913 nets, hence covering 98% of the planned weeks' distributions and 14% of the District.

Challenges and lessons learned

The major challenge we encountered during the distribution was the breaking down of our distribution vehicles, which forced us to interrupt the distribution for almost one month to have them fixed, as some spare parts could not be sourced locally.

The good coordination with all the stakeholders contributed to the smooth and timely distributions.

- Distributed 50,371 Nets to beneficiaries under Dowa and Dzaleka health facilities.

During the second week of distributions, we distributed LLIN in the two planned health facilities of Dowa and Dzaleka. Distributions were conducted in all the planned villages under the two health facilities hence we managed to reach for all the planned 238 villages. However, there was a considerable number of nets returned from Dzaleka health facility, mainly from the refugee camp villages of Kawale 1, Kawale 2, Likuni 1, Likuni 2 and Zomba, with respectively 486, 121, 92, 64 and 58 nets not received. Some beneficiaries didn't show up as they were attending a clothing items distribution on the same day. The fact that most inhabitants of the said villages are refugees from Rwanda, Burundi or Somalia caused identification challenges, preventing individuals claiming nets on behalf of the beneficiaries from receiving the nets. These beneficiaries will be considered during the mop up exercise.

During the second week of distributions we distributed 50,371 of the planned 51,294 nets, representing 98% of the weeks' planned coverage. To date we have distributed 106,632 nets representing 27% of the whole district's coverage.

During the third week of distributions, we distributed LLIN in the three planned health facilities of Mtengowanthenga, Dzoole and Kayembe. Distributions were not conducted in ten of the planned villages under the three health facilities due to funerals hence we deferred distribution and managed to reach for the 493 of the 503 planned villages. However, arrangements will be made at a later date when we will reach them and conclude the distributions in the deferred villages hence their nets have been currently taken back to the warehouse for safe keeping. The above mentioned villages are: Msaka, Kancheri, Chimbalanga Mononga and Nkhota villages from Mtengowanthenga health facility with, respectively, 20, 100, 201, 91 and 49 nets returned; Masiya, Sintala 2, Mulode 2 and Mgoli from Dzoole health facility with a nets requirement of 42, 274, 26 and 84 nets respectively and Mphinda village under Kayembe health facility with a requirement of 140 nets.

During the third week of distributions we distributed 77,922 of the planned 79,270 nets, representing 98% of the weeks' planned coverage. To date we have distributed 184,554 nets of a total of 391,608 nets required, representing 47% of the whole district's coverage.
