1.0 INTRODUCTION

This quarterly report covers activities that were conducted from April to June, 2014. The planned activities in this quarter includes; Monitoring LLITNs utilization, Community sensitization, Monthly meetings with MCAs, Advocacy meetings with Ministry of Health, Project Management meetings and distribution of nets.

The major highlights in this quarter are that a total of 11,852 households were visited by MCAs. This is a great increase in household monitoring from the previous 836 recorded in the first quarter. This improvement indicates that the MCAs were indeed just affected by the rainy season in the first quarter.

Furthermore, Reports from the MCAs indicate that 4,068 (93%) pregnant women out of 4,352 regularly slept under LLITNs while children under 5 years 15,658 (95%) out of 16,473 regularly sleep under LLITNs. The reports also indicate that 26, 724 (72%) of the general population out of 37,214 regularly sleep under LLITNs. This shows that in the ZAC areas of operation, adherence to the correct and consistent usage of LLITNs by the vulnerable groups is good. This can also be attributed to the strategies of household monitoring and checking of correct hanging of nets.

Monthly MCA meetings have also continued to be held with program managers. Furthermore, a total of 39, 270 adults were sensitized on the correct and consistent use of nets as well as on the importance of IPT for pregnant women.

2.0 DETAILED REPORT

Outline of activities for the quarter

The report brings out activities that were carried out in the second quarter of this year in all the areas mentioned above. They include the following:

- Monitoring LLITNs utilization
- Community sensitization
- Monthly meetings with MCAs
- Advocacy meetings with Ministry of Health
- Project Management meetings
- Distribution of nets

2.1 MONITORING USE OF LLITNS

Monitoring the correct and consistent use of LLITNs at household level in all the 5 dioceses remains a major activity in the NetsforLife Program. In the quarter under review, 474 MCAs in all the 5 Dioceses managed to visit a total of 11,852 households, that is, on average each MCA managed to visit 25 households.

Reports from the MCAs indicate that 4,068 (93%) pregnant women out of 4,352 regularly sleep under LLITNswhile children under 5 years 15,658 (95%) out of 16,473 regularly sleep under LLITNs. Furthermore, a total of 39, 270 adults were sensitized on the correct and consistent use of nets as well as on the importance of IPT for pregnant women.

The reports also clearly indicate that a total of 4,318 nets were found but not hanging. Further enquiry revealed that those that were not hanging were for temporal bed spaces. The MCAs have continued to sensitize the people on the importance of net usage even on temporal bed spaces.

2.2 Distribution of LLITNs

The summary table clearly indicates that 474 MCAs managed to distribute a total of 76,781 LLITNs in all the 5 dioceses during the period under review. Net distribution was a house to house distribution. This was done so as to avoid giving a household more than the number of the nets it requires. Further analysis shows that Kitwe had the highest number of nets distributed while Kafue had the least number of nets distributed. Also note that ZAC continues to source for LLITNs from local stakeholders particularly Ministry of Health. Under this review period, ZAC has not successfully sourced for any nets but will continue to do so. The table below shows summary data on Households visited, LLITNs distributed, number of people in households, conditions of nets, net usage as well as the number of adults

- There were some errors in recording the numbers and verification of all other numbers has been done
- The anomalies in the reporting and checking of conditions of nets have been noted and is attributed to the non-reporting and/or misreporting of the conditions of nets by some of the MCAs in project sites but this is currently being worked on as they have now been urged to record everything concerning nets when they go in the fields.

3.0 Community Sensitization

Community sensitisation reached 39, 270 adults on basic facts about malaria such as the importance of net usage and malaria prevention in pregnancy as shown in the summary table above. Out of the total number of adults sensitized, 20,420 were women and 18, 850 were men. It also imperative to note out of the total number of women sensitized, 4,351 were pregnant women. Most of the adults were reached more than once specially during the monthly home visits by MCAs.

It is imperative to note that to avoid duplication; the MCAs only recorded the number of adults sensitized once.

ZAC continues to use strategies such as one-on-one discussions with beneficiaries during home visits and drama performances to sensitize the community on the basic facts of malaria.

4.0 MEETINGS

4.1 Monthly Project Management Meetings

The monthly project meetings held in the period under review continued to focus the strategies bordering on volunteer motivation, details on the kind of

information that should be adequately collected as well as feedback from the beneficiaries.

Under this quarter, 13 Project management meetings were held in all the 5 Dioceses between 1st April, 2014 and 30th June, 2014. During the Management meetings, the issues of support in LLITNs sourcing and net distribution strongly came out though it was discussed in the previous quarter.

ZAC continues to use these project management meetings to review stakeholder meeting updates, review any new strategies and involvement in national programs.

4.2 Monthly meetings with MCAs

The monthly MCAs meetings were held in all Dioceses which were coordinated by Programmes Managers who provided technical support on report representation and sharing experiences. The major issue that came out of the meetings again was the issue of volunteer supplies such as T-shirts and new identity cards. However, the MCAs are pleased with the supply of

reporting forms to monitor households. They also reported that they are receiving them on time.

Other issues that came out but are in the process of being addressed are:

- MCAs being co-opted in net distribution at district and health centre level
- When the MCAs will be oriented on the new strategies to approach malaria cases in communities
