Implementation activities: DFID - Integrated Control of Schistosomiasis and Intestinal Helminths in sub-Saharan Africa (ICOSA)



SCI was appointed in 2010 as "service provider" to the £25m DFID ICOSA 6 year programme to deliver 75 million treatments in 8 African countries (Crown Agents £14.5m SCI £10.5m)

The target is to reduce schistosomiasis and STH in 8 selected African countries, working in close collaboration with national governments and other donor and international agencies involved in the control of NTDs.

A six year contract from October 2010 to March 2016.

SCI - £10.537 million (with Liverpool CNTD as sub contractor)

Commodities (drugs and equipment) to be procured under the project will be **up to** £14.5 million (Crown Agents)


A total annual spend ceiling of £5 million

Phase II In January 2012 DFID announced their intention to award additional funding for ICOSA from 2013 – The timetable is :

Funding is in place to continue the national treatment campaigns in Burundi for the next 2 years.

Total budget £1,205,001, received via IC Trust

Rwanda End Fund


Funding is in place to continue the national treatment campaigns in Rwanda for the next 2 years from the ENDFUND

Total approved budget is US\$ 1,643,507 over 3 years starting 01.03.12. First two tranche of funds received in the sum of US\$ 608,562.

82% of these funds will go to the country for implementation.

Implementation activities - other



- END fund Yemen, SCI have been awarded a grant for £85,713 for 2013 to support the national Mass Drug Administration program in Yemen
- VITOL have awarded SCI £110,339 for Cote D'Ivoire, integrated mapping & ICT activities.
- NTDs were highlighted on Red Nose Day in March 2013, and so Comic Relief have award their first ever grant to control NTDs in Malawi, Total award £105,496
- Sightsavers, have signed a technical assistance agreement for £85,000

Research subcontracts have been executed with RISEAL Niger and Catholic University of Mozambique


Total Anticipated SCORE funds 2010 to 2015 - US\$1.245 million.

Initial 3 year budget funding has been spent.

The final 2 year extension for Mozambique has recently been agreed in the sum of \$368,229 Niger presently being finalised with SCORE, anticipated c \$430,017.



In November 2012, SCI, were awarded a 3 year contract from CIFF:

TITLE: To assist the development of WHO policy regarding the delivery of deworming control programmes on Uganda, Liberia and Malawi.

P.I.s Prof Joanne Webster & Dr Wendy Harrison

The start date was 1st November 2012.

The agreed budget is £1,110,000 for 3 years.


The first 18 months (Nov12-Apr14) approved budget is £508,500

Publicity, advocacy and fund raising



- SCI has so far retained its position as a top rated charity by "Giving what we can" www.givingwhatwecan.org
- SCI is one of the top three international charities recommended by <u>www.givewell.org</u> in USA (they review their recommendation annually)
- These recommendations have led to a core group of supporters
- These recommendations have highlighted SCI internationally, illustrated financial transparency and led to increased donations. See recent Guardian article

- However it is imperative for the future of SCI that we continue to perform and be transparent if we want to retain our recommendations from these evaluation sites.



Donations

- SCI receives some donations into the Imperial College Trust (formerly Queen's Gate Trust) which is a registered charity (Registered Charity number 273071).
- SCI then draws down the funds for specific identified purposes into a College account by submitting proposals to the IC Trustees
- As at mid June 2014, SCI has reserves in the sum of £846,181 available to draw down from the Trust.
- Imperial College has provided SCI with a ring fenced account (L24009)
 specifically for private donations received direct to SCI. To date some £3.8 million
 of unrestricted private donations have been received into this account since it was
 set-up in Feb 2012. SCI claims Gift Aid where allowable.
- These unrestricted funds have been used mainly for small scale interventions or "seed money" in emerging countries e.g. Mozambique, Mauritania, Niger, Senegal & Cote D'Ivoire. The largest commitment was £500,000 spent for mapping activities in Ethiopia.
