

This is to ensure when staff start to return to work, they will be able to work safely within the guidelines. To enable this to happen various items of office furniture have been identified as not compliant within the guidelines. These items will be identified 'Not for use' or removed so that members of staff, contractors or visitors will be within an environment compliant with the guidelines. Face masks are available for staff and visitors who wish to wear them who do not have their own. Home working continues for all members of staff who can do so Introduction of one-way pedestrian routes within all our facilities Reduction of persons within the below areas: • Open planned office areas • CEO's office • Photocopier room • Meeting rooms • Kitchens • Toilets • Lift • Smoking shelter • Cycle shelter • Company cars – 1 person only unless from the same household All users of both buildings have an obligation and responsibility under the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 (HASAWA) that requires you to take reasonable care for the health and safety of yourself and other people at work. Ask for doors to be left open where possible Ask for documents to be emailed to you rather than touching paper copies Keep your own waste and dispose of this at home. Spreading of the coronavirus by air circulation by the air conditioning systems	Members of staff, contractors and visitors	The air conditioning systems within both buildings are regularly serviced as part of the RYA's planned maintenance program, this is to help maintain hygiene and service standards of the equipment. In line with current recommendations to help reduce the spread of airborne particles the air conditioning systems have been serviced. Where possible in line with the current guidance to help with the dilution of any possible coronavirus in the atmosphere the fresh air circulation and refresh rates have been significantly increased to help dilute any potential hazard. RYA Reception	Members of staff, contractors and visitors	To help maintain social distancing guidelines within this area for all that use it, signage will be displayed informing the procedure for staff, contractors and visitors. Reception staff will be distanced from other users and receptionists will sign guests in and out. As the main point of entry to RYA House, a non-contact infrared thermometer is located to help monitor the temperature of people entering the building. If a staff member feels unwell whilst at work their temperature can be taken to help access if they have a high temperature of <u>38.7C</u> or greater. If the persons temperature is 38.7C or greater they need to follow the follow the Government/NHS guidance on isolation and track and trace system. Reception is also the starting point and finishing point of the one-way systems around the building. When exiting reception social distancing guidelines need to be adhered to.	Y
