Why is Immediate and Continuous Stage 1 Child Care so Important?

- Two generational approach to ending poverty
 - It benefits both the parents and their children
 - Quality uninterrupted child care fosters children's development
 - Stable child care allows parents to focus primarily on tending to their family's needs



Immediate and Continuous Stage 1 Child Care in a Snapshot

- 1. **Immediate** authorization of child care
- 2. Continual service for **12 months with no interruption**
- Expanded list of program activities for which full-time child care should be authorized
- 4. Full-time child care, unless parent prefers part-time
- 5. Child care security **before** the county schedules any required activities or welfare appointments (county must verify family has child care)
- 6. A new child care request form (CCP-7)



Deep Dive into Immediate and Continuous Stage 1 Child Care

- What does immediate child care mean?
 - Stage 1 from day 1!





Deep Dive into Immediate and Continuous Stage 1 Child Care

- What does continuous child care mean?
 - Once child care is authorized, children receive child care services for 12 months or until transfer to Stage 2, even if:
 - Activity stops, changes or hours change
 - Parent stops participating or is sanctioned
 - Changes in income occur, so long as it doesn't go over 85% of the State Median Income (SMI)





Deep Dive into Immediate and Continuous Stage 1 Child Care

Expanded Approved Program Activities

Program activities for which full-time immediate and continuous Stage One Child Care should be authorized include, but are not limited to: any WTW activity, orientation, appraisal, assessment, job search, job club, domestic violence services, court appearances, housing searches and classes, homeless support programs, shelter participation requirements, eviction proceedings, mental health services, including therapy or personal counseling, home visiting, drug and substance abuse services, parenting classes, and medical or education-related appointments for the participant or their dependents (WIC Section 11323.2(c)). This expanded list of program activities applies to recipients expected to be referred to WTW, mandated participants, exempt volunteers, and sanctioned individuals.



Who is eligible for Stage 1 Child Care?

If you answered yes to all 3 questions, you can get stable, fulltime child care at low or no cost



How do Student Parents ask for Stage 1 Child Care?

- ☐ If they are already receiving CalWORKs Cash Aid:
 - They can contact their CalWORKs worker and tell them that they need child care to attend school
 - Parents' CalWORKs worker should give them a Child Care Request Form (CCP 7) or parents can ask for one



How do Student Parents ask for Stage 1 Child Care?

- ☐ If they are applying for CalWORKs Cash Aid:
 - Once parents apply for CalWORKs Cash Aid, their worker must ask
 them if they need child care
 - Parents will fill out a Child Care Request Form (CCP 7)



Student Parents Get to Choose Their Provider!

- Once approved, parents can call their local child care resource and referral agency for help finding the best child care option for their situation
- What are my options?
 - Child Care Center
 - Family Child Care Provider
 - License Exempt Provider



License Exempt Providers

- This term refers to family, friends and neighbors
- License-exempt child care is a valid parental choice
- The good news is that these providers can get paid by whoever administers Stage 1 Child Care in their county
- TrustLine Registration is required for these providers



The TrustLine Registry Process

- Call Trustline at 1.800.822.8490 to get an application or visit their website to fill out a request form
- Get fingerprints scanned
 - Fingerprints must be submitted with the application and must be sent electronically through a Live Scan submission form
- Pay fees
 - Total is around \$135 \$170
- Mail the application packet with your Live Scan Form, and a check for the fees



Key Takeaways

- Immediate, continuous Stage 1 Child Care creates stability for families and helps children thrive
