CalWORKs Welfare-To-Work Domestic Abuse Resources Guide

The purpose of this guide is to provide domestic abuse (DA) resources for CalWORKs Welfare-To-Work (WTW) participants experiencing domestic abuse.

The COVID-19 pandemic has likely caused domestic abuse reporting availability to decrease while simultaneously increasing time spent with an abuser. Disease mitigation strategies such as stay-at-home orders, social distancing protocols, and job loss have likely resulted in WTW participants and their children experiencing domestic abuse to have less contact with others such as county staff, school/after school staff, medical personnel or other mandated reporters of abuse, thereby decreasing the ability for DA victims to reach out to those most in a position to assist them in escaping domestic abuse.

This guide provides state, population specific, and regional resources for WTW and CalLearn participants and their children who may need DA resources and assistance.
