# MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN DEPARTMENT PUBLIC HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES DIVISION OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND UNIVERSITY OF GUAM, CENTER FOR EXCELLENCE IN DEVELOPMENTAL

THIS MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (MOA), is entered into by and between the **DEPARTMENT**OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES, DIVISION OF PUBLIC HEALTH, (hereinafter referred to as DPHSS-PH) as an agency of the Government of Guam, located at 590 S. Marine Corps Drive, Suite 219, Tamuning, Guam 96913 and the UNIVERSITY OF GUAM, CENTER FOR EXCELLENCE IN DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES EDUCATION, RESEARCH, AND SERVICES (hereinafter referred to

as Guam CEDDERS) located at House #29 Dean Circle, 303 University Drive, UOG Station,

WHEREAS, DPHSS-DPH has previously utilized the services of Guam CEDDERS which extended to collaborative partnerships in the development of the Guam Preschool Development Grant Birth to Five a grant application submitted to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families;

WHEREAS, DPHSS-DPH is the recipient of the Guam Preschool Development Grant Birth to Five grant period December 31, 2019 – December 30, 2020;

WHEREAS, DPHSS-DPH intends to utilize the services of Guam CEDDERS to provide technical assistance and support in the facilitation Guam's Early Childhood Island-wide Needs Assessment on the on the state of Guam's B-S mixed delivery system including but not limited to governance, personnel/workforce, data systems, accountability, quality improvement, quality standards, and finance.

WHEREAS, DPHSS-DPH intends to utilize the services of Guam CEDDERS to provide technical assistance and support and based on the findings in the needs assessment to develop a comprehensive strategic plan in collaboration with the B-5 mixed delivery system.

The appropriate terms and conditions concerning closeout of the award are as follows: The sub-recipient has 30 days after the completion of the project or the term (December 30, 2020) to submit all financial, performance and other reports as required by the terms and conditions of the award. Extensions requested by the sub-recipient may be approved by the pass-through entity.

The pass-through entity will close-out the award when it determines that all applicable administrative actions and all required work of the award have been completed by the sub-recipient. All closeout actions should be completed no later than ninety days after receipt and acceptance of all required final reports.

- 18. DPHSS-DPH and Guam CEDDERS agree to comply with and require each of its contractors and subcontractors employed in the completion of the project to comply with 2 CFR §200.322, "procurement of recovered materials," and section 6002 of the Solid Waste Disposal Acts, as amended by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act: to include procuring only items designated in guidelines of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) at 40 CFR part 247 that contain the highest percentage of recovered materials practicable, consistent with maintaining a satisfactory level of competition, where the purchase price of the item exceeds \$10,000; procuring solid waste management services in a manner that maximizes energy and resource recovery; and establishing an affirmative procurement program for procurement of recovered materials identified in the EPA guidelines.
- 19. Sub-recipient (Guam CEDDERS) agrees to insert into its contracts procured with these subaward funds all applicable contract clauses described in 2 CFR § 200.326, Appendix II.
- 20. The terms and conditions of Federal awards (including this part [2 CFR Part 200]) flow down to subawards to subrecipients unless a particular section of this part or the terms and conditions of the Federal award specifically indicate otherwise. This means that non-Federal entities must comply with requirements in this part regardless of whether the non-Federal entity is a recipient or subrecipient of a Federal award. All applicable terms, conditions, provisions, and agreements set forth in Federal Award Number 90TP0073-01-00 included herein as Appendix A and are hereby incorporated in this MOA by reference with the same force and effect as though fully set forth herein. To the extent that any of the terms set forth in this MOA are inconsistent with any of the applicable terms, provisions, or conditions of Federal Award Number 90TP0073-01-00, the terms of the Federal Award shall govern.
- 21. Sub-recipient agrees to comply with all applicable requirements of 2 CFR Part 200. All applicable terms, conditions, provisions, and agreements required by 2 CFR Part 200 are hereby incorporated in this MOA by reference with the same force and effect as

- 22. The subrecipient will receive the funds in accordance with the allowable types of payments under 2 CFT Part 200. Payments are based on meeting specific requirements of the Federal Award.
- 23. This MOA subaward may only be amended, modified, cancelled for lack of funds, or terminated in accordance with the terms and conditions of Federal Award Number 90TP0073-01-00 and the provisions of 2 CFR Part 200.
- 24. Subrecipient agrees to comply with The National Policy Requirements, including the Governmentwide Requirements for Drug-Free Workplace of CFR Part 182. This includes the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession, or use of a controlled substance, as defined and listed in Schedules I through V of the Controlled Substances Act (21 U.S.C. 812), and as further defined by regulation at 21 CFR 1308.11 through 1308.15, in order to comply with 2 CFR Part 200 and 2 CFR Part 182.
- 25. The Federal Awarding Agency or DPHSS-DPH may terminate (de-obligate) Guam CEDDERS subaward for the following reasons:
  - a. Failure to make satisfactory progress towards the goals, objectives, or strategies set forth in the Scope of Work for this project;
  - Failure to adhere to the requirements in the agreement, standard conditions, or special conditions of this MOA;
  - c. Filing of a false certification or other report or documents;
  - d. Failure to submit quarterly reports, invoices and the final report by the due dates indicated in Section I and Section IV below.
- 26. This subaward is subject to the requirements of Section 106 (g) of the Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000, as amended (22 U.S.C. 7104).
  - 1. The Subrecipient and its employees may not:
    - a. Engage in severe forms of trafficking in persons during the period of time that the award is in effect:
    - b. Procure a commercial sex act during the period of time that the award is in effect: or
    - c. Use forced labor in the performance of the award or subawards under the award.
  - 2. The federal awarding agency may unllaterally terminate this award, without penalty, if the Subrecipient:
    - a. Is determined to have violated a prohibition in #26.1 of this award term;

Imputed to you or they subrecipient using the standards and due process for imputing the conduct of an Individual to an organization that are provided in 2 CFR part 180, "OMB Guidelines to Agencies on Governmentwide Debarment and Suspension (Nonprocurement)," as implemented by our agency at 2 CFR part 376.
- 27. Consistent with 45 CFR 75.113, the Subrecipient agrees to disclose, in a timely manner, in writing to the DPHSS-DPH, with a copy to the Health and Human Services (HHS) Office of Inspector General (OIG), all information related to violations of federal criminal law involving fraud, bribery or gratuity violations potentially affecting this federal award. Subrecipient also agrees to report certain civil, criminal, or administrative proceedings to <a href="https://www.sam.gov">www.sam.gov</a>. Failure to make required disclosures can result in any of the remedies described in 45 CFR 75.371. Remedies for noncompliance, including suspension or debarment (2 CFR parts 180 & 376 and 31 U.S.C. 3321).
- 28. Subrecipient agrees in any grant-related activity in which family, marital, or household considerations are, by statute or regulation, relevant for purposes of determining beneficiary eligibility or participation, will treat same-sex spouses, marriages, and households on the same terms as opposite-sex spouses, marriages, and households, respectively.
- 29. Subrecipient agrees to comply with the Standards for Privacy of Individually Identifiable Health Information (the "Privacy Rule"). The Privacy Rule implements the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) of 1996, 42 U.S.C. 1320 et seq., which governs the protection of individually identifiable health information.
- 30. Subrecipient is aware of the strictures of the Medicare and Medicald anti-kick statue (42 U.S.C. 1320a 7(b) and are both cognizant of the risk of criminal and administrative liability under the grant award, specifically under 42 U.S.C. 1320 7(b) illegal remunerations which states, in part, that whoever knowingly and willfully: (a) solicits or receives (or offers or pays) any remuneration (including kickback, bribe, or rebate) directly or indirectly, overtly or covertly, in cash or in kind, in return for referring (or to induce such person to refer) an individual to a person for the furnishing or arranging for the furnishing or any item or service OR (b) in return for purchasing, leasing, ordering, ore recommending purchasing, leasing, or ordering, or to purchase, lease, or order, any goods facility, services, or item.

31. Provisions covered in HHS Grants Policy Statements Parts I through III include, but not limited to, are: Suspension and Debarment, Delinquency on Federal Debt, Lobbying, and the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.

NOW, THEREFORE in consideration of the foregoing, the parties hereto agree as follows:

#### **SECTION I - GUAM CEDDERS SHALL:**

- A. Provide technical assistance and support in the development, implementation, and monitoring of the Guam Preschool Development Grant Birth through Five to support the training and technical assistance, data systems, continuous quality improvement and grant management for the period of date of the Governor's signature through December 30, 2020. (See Appendix B: Scope of Work).
- B. Submit quarterly reports due on or before the following dates:
  - 1st Report Due three months from the date of the Governor's signature
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> Report August 30, 2020
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> Final Report December 10, 2020

#### SECTION II - DPHSS-DPH SHALL:

- A. Designate a liaison to serve as the DPHSS-DPH Chief to act as a point of contact for all communication between Guam CEDDERS and DPHSS-DPH.
- B. Conduct monitoring activities to ensure compliance with Scope of Work, Budget and Justification Summary of this MOA.

- B. The parties may, at any time, mutually agree to make changes in the services performed hereunder. Any alternations, variations, modification or waivers of provisions of this agreement shall be valid only when they have been produced in writing, duly signed and attached to the original of this agreement.
- C. The headings under this agreement are for convenience only and are not a substantive part of this agreement.
- D. All equipment purchased hereunder shall be and remains the property of DPHSS-DPH and may be used by DPHSS-DPH without any additional cost to DPHSS-DPH.
- E. That DPHSS-DPH and Guam CEDDERS shall abide by all Guam local and federal laws and regulations governing the Guam Preschool Development Grant Birth through Flve, as such are applicable to each including guidelines developed by the Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families, and such as laws and regulations are constituted and amended during the term of this agreement.
- F. BFHS assumes no liability for any accident or injury that may occur to the contractor, its employees, agents or personal property.
- G. Except otherwise set forth in this agreement, Guam CEDDERS shall not be liable for any loss suffered by providers and its employees because of Guam CEDDERS's action or non-action, if such as or non-action was not negligent and was made in good faith.
- H. All notices or other communications required or permitted under this agreement shall be considered duly given if sent by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, to the party at the last known address.

#### SECTION IV - PAYMENT PROCEDURE

- A. This MOA and any subsequent agreements are subject to and contingent upon the continuing availability of federal funds for the purpose hereof. The MOA is to be paid, reimbursed or otherwise compensated with grant funds provided to Guam. In the event that such funds or parts thereof are not received by Guam, Guam may immediately terminate any MOA executed without liability, including liability for termination costs.
- B. Subject to the availability of funds through the Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families, DPHSS-DPH shall pay Guam CEDDERS the total amount of \$275,000.00.
- C. DPHSS-DPH shall compensate Guam CEDDERS by progressive payments based upon delivery of approved work submittal as follows:

Time is of the essence for the completion of the work described in this MOA and that any delay in the completion of the work described herein shall constitute a material breach of this MOA.

#### **SECTION V - FORCE MAJEURE**

A. Neither party shall be responsible for delays or failures in its obligations herein due to a cause beyond its reasonable control. Such cases shall include, but not be limited to, strikes, lockouts, riot, sabotage, rebellion, insurrection, acts of war or the public enemy, unavailable raw materials, power or telecommunications, fire, flood, earthquake, epidemics, natural disasters, and acts of God.

**SECTION VI - SCOPE OF AGREEMENT**

A. This agreement supersedes any and all other agreements, either oral or writing, between parties hereto with respect to the retainment of Guam CEDDERS or by the Government and contains all of the covenants and agreements between the parties with respect to such retainment in any manner whatsoever. Each party to this agreement acknowledges that no representation, inducements, promises or agreements, orally or otherwise, have been made by any party, or anyone acting on behalf of any parties, which are not embodied herein, and that no other agreement, statement, or promise not contained in this Agreement shall be valid or binding. Any modification of this agreement will be effective only if it is in writing signed by the party to be changed. For the purposes of this paragraph and of the entire agreement, the signature of the Governor of Guam is the only signature that will bind the agreement.

#### **SECTION VII - NONDISCRIMINATION**

This agreement shall be performed in accordance with the provision of Title VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and of Title V of the National Rehabilitation Act of 1973. No person shall, on the grounds or race, color, age, national origin, sex or handicap, be subject to discrimination under the Program.

#### SECTION VIII - DISPUTE RESOLUTION

In the event a party of the Agreement is unable to perform its responsibilities under this Agreement consistent with the respective party's statutory and regulatory mandates, the affected party shall immediately provide a written notice to the Department of Public Health and Social Services to establish a date for mutual resolution of the conflict.

#### **SECTION IX – RESTRICTION AGAINST SEX OFFENDERS**

Guam CEDDERS warrants that no person in its employment who has been convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 of the Guam Code Annotated, or of an offense defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28 of Title 9 of the Guam Code Annotated, or who has been convicted of an offense with the same elements as heretofore defined in any other jurisdiction, or who is listed on the Sex Offender Registry, shall provide services on behalf of Guam CEDDERS's while on government of Guam property, with the exception of public highways. If any employee of Guam CEDDERS is providing services on government property and is convicted subsequent to an award of an agreement, the Guam CEDDERS warrants that it will notify the Government of the conviction within twenty-four hours of the conviction and will remove immediately such convicted person from providing services on behalf of the government agency. If Guam CEDDERS is found to be in violation of any of the provisions of this paragraph, then the

Government will give notice to Guam CEDDERS to take corrective action. Guam CEDDERS shall take corrective action within twenty-four hours of notice from the Government, and Guam

CEDDERS shall notify the Government when action has been taken. If Guam CEDDERS fails to take corrective action within twenty-four hours of notice from the Government, then the Government in its sole discretion may suspend temporarily any contract for services until corrective action is taken.

#### **SECTION X - GOVERNING LAW**

The validity of this agreement and of any it's term or provisions, as well as the rights and duties of the parties to this agreement, shall be governed by the laws of Guam.

#### **SECTION XI - SEVERABLE PROVISIONS**

If any provision of this agreement shall be deemed by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, then such provision shall be deemed stricken from the agreement and the agreement shall be enforced according to its validity and subsisting terms and provisions

#### SECTION XII - ASSIGNMENT OF AGREEMENT

Guam CEDDERS may not assign this agreement, or any sum becoming due to Guam CEDDERS under the provisions of this agreement, without the prior written consent of the government.

#### SECTION XIII - NO GRATUITIES, KICKBACKS, AND/OR FAVORS

Guam CEDDERS represents that it has not and will not violate the prohibition against gratuities, kickbacks and/or favors set forth (Gratuities and Kickbacks) in 5 GCA, Chapter 5, Article 11, Ethics in Public Contracting and Section 11.7 (Gratuities and Kickbacks and Favors) of the UOG Procurement Manual.

#### **SECTION XIV - ETHICAL STANDARDS**

Guam CEDDERS represents that it has not knowingly influenced and/or promises that it will not knowingly influence a government employee to breach any of the ethical standards set forth in 5 GCA, Chapter 5, Article 11, and in Chapter 11 (Ethics in Public Contracting) of the UOG Procurement Manual.

10% Administrative Fee for Projects that do not include the University of Guam's

Federally Negotiated Indirect Cost Rate

Effective July 1, 2018, the University of Guam (UOG) will charge a 10% administrative fee for all projects, grants, memoranda of agreement/understanding and contracts run through the UOG Business Office that do not include the University's federally negotiated indirect cost rate of 41% of modified total direct costs, or other indirect rate as mandated by the federal award, unless otherwise instructed by the federal agency.

The 10% fee covers professional services related to project management including procurement. budget management and oversight, financial reporting and accounting processes, and check preparation and distribution among other activities. Grant and contract work comes with associated costs and therefore it is reasonable for the University of Guam to require compensation for administrative expenses undertaken as a direct result of management of funds related to grants, contracts, memoranda of agreement/understanding, and other projects.

Contracts, memoranda of understanding, grants and other projects must include a 10% administrative fee in their budget to cover administrative costs associated with managing contract funds.

Principal investigators are encouraged to include administrative fees as part of their proposal budgets to support contract management functions. As a general rule, projects that do not incorporate administrative fees may be rejected. Exceptions to this rule may include USDA Hatch, Multi-state Hatch, McIntire-Stennis, Smith-Lever grant funding and Department of Interior grants which do not include IDC or other charges as part of their federal mandate.
