OLMSTEAD ANNIVERSARY – JUNE 2014

The 15th anniversary of the Supreme Court decision Olmstead v. L.C. is June 2014. To commemorate the anniversary, the Department of Justice (DOJ) has planned to develop a short compilation video highlighting individuals with disabilities who have benefited from Olmstead.

In Olmstead v. L.C., 527 U.S. 581, 119 Supreme Court 2176 (1999) ("the Olmstead decision"), the Supreme Court construed Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) to require states to place qualified individuals with mental disabilities in community settings, rather than in institutions, whenever treatment professionals determine that such placement is appropriate, the affected persons do not oppose such placement, and that the state can reasonably accommodate the placement, taking into account the resources available to the state and the needs of others with disabilities. The DOJ regulations implementing Title II of the ADA require public entities to administer their services, programs, and activities in the most integrated setting appropriate to the needs of qualified individuals with disabilities.

LONG-TERM CARE OMBUDSMAN POSTER REQUIREMENTS

Welfare and Institutions Code Section 9718 requires that the Long-Term Care Ombudsman poster be placed in a conspicuous location in all RCFEs. The poster notifies residents, family members, friends and facility staff of the local Ombudsman Program telephone number and of the toll-free CRISIS line number. The poster and

ADMINISTRATOR CERTIFICATION SECTION

Reminder: Please be sure to post mark completed applications for administrator certificate renewals no less than 30 to 90 days prior to the expiration date on the certificate. This will allow the Administrator Certification Section (ACS) staff to process your application prior to the expiration date and give ample time to make corrections or submit any missing documents for incomplete applications prior to the expiration date. Remember the delinquency/late fee of \$300 applies if ACS does not have a complete application packet that is postmarked on or prior to your expiration date. DESIGNATED ADMINISTRATORS

All RCFE licensees are reminded that if the facility administrator is temporarily absent, there must be a designated person who is qualified to act as an administrator and operate the facility in their absence. The designated administrator must meet qualifying criteria as described in regulations section 87405 RCFE, and 85064 for Adult Residential Facilities: Administrator qualifications and duties which may be found at: http://www.ccld.ca.gov/res/pdf/RCFE_ADM.pdf and http://www.ccld.ca.gov/res/pdf/ARF_ADM.pdf

SAFETY AND BED RAILS

Providers are reminded that the use of bedrails can be helpful or harmful to residents in care. Bedrails can only be used when their use is compliant with regulatory requirements. When bed rails are used, an assessment of the mattress and bed frame should be completed. The bed should be checked for gaps to ensure there are no gaps large enough for a person to fit their head or body through. In addition, it is also important to make sure the bed rails are installed according to the manufacturer's instructions. It is critical for staff to ensure that the use of all assistive devices, including bedrails, are monitored to ensure the safety of residents in care, especially in cases where residents may lack hazard awareness.
