ADULT and SENIOR CARE PROGRAM COVID-19 UPDATE

Mission: To optimize the health and safety of adults and seniors in community care settings

The Adult and Senior Care Residential Licensing Program licenses Adult Day Programs (ADP), Adult Residential Facilities (ARF), Adult Residential Care Facilities for Persons with Special Healthcare Needs (ARFPSHN), Enhanced Behavioral Supports Homes (EBSH), Community Crisis Homes (CCH), Residential Care Facilities for the Chronically III (RCFCI), Residential Care Facilities for the Elderly (RCFE), and Social Rehabilitation Facilities (SRF) in an effort to ensure that they provide a safe and healthy environment for all persons in care.

A Note from Pamela Dickfoss, Deputy Director

I want to extend my sincerest thanks for your response to the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) outbreak. Because you care for some of the most vulnerable Californians, we here at Community Care Licensing Division (CCLD) understand how much this worldwide health crisis impacts you, your facility operations, people in care, along with families and friends.

There are a number of unprecedented measures taking place as a result of COVID-19 that restrict and limit certain gatherings which include funerals, weddings, births, and other celebrations. While we are all doing our part with social distancing and self-isolation, it is important to find creative ways to engage with others in and out of the home, find activities inside or outside, and to take time for self-care. We may be physically distant, but we must remain spiritually, emotionally, socially connected. People can survive individually, but we thrive collectively.

It is important that you and your team utilize resources available, and stay informed as things are continuing to evolve, and guidance can change from day to day. The Department will update guidance as needed and continues to provide additional important information as it becomes available on our CCLD website.

CCLD has also published multiple Provider Information Notices (PINs) which are available on our CCLD website and there is a dedicated email CCLCOVID-19INFO@dss.ca.gov to receive public inquiries related to COVID-19. Immediately contact your resident's health care provider for instructions if you suspect they may be infected and notify your Iocal health department along with your local Adult and Senior Care Regional Office if you have someone with a confirmed case of COVID-19.

COMMUNITY CARE LICENSING DIVISION (CCLD PINs)

PIN 20-11-CCLD- Community Care Licensing Division Online Resources on Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)

This PIN announces a dedicated COVID-19 landing page on the Community Care Licensing Division website where all licensees, certified and approved homes, providers, and the public can access online resources related to COVID-19. Also in Spanish and Chinese.

PIN 20-10-CCLD- Waiver of Administrator Certification Program Fees, License Fees, and Home Care Aide Registration Fees as a Result of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)

This PIN discusses the authority of the California Department of Social Services to waive application, license, home care aide registration fees, and administrator certification program fees for individuals or licensees experiencing economic hardship as a result of the COVID-19 emergency. Also in Spanish and Chinese.

<u>PIN 20-09-CCLD</u> – Updated Statewide Waivers for Licensing Requirements Due to Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVD-19)

The situation surrounding the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) continues to rapidly change. This PIN provides updated or additional statewide waivers for certain licensing requirements applicable to ASC, HCO, and HCA settings, and the Administrator Certification Program, without the need for providers to make an individual request, and subject to the waiver terms and conditions set forth in this PIN. Also in Spanish, Chinese and Tagalog.

<u>PIN 20-08-CCLD</u>- Guidelines for Providers Requesting Stores to Waive Supply Limitations Due to Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19)

This PIN provides guidance for licensed facilities on how to approach local stores who may be limiting purchases of supplies due to COVID-19 in California. Also in Spanish, Tagalog and Chinese.

<u>PIN20-07-CCLD</u> - Suspension of all Annual Inspections to Allow Technical Assistance for Licensees Regarding the Coronavirus 2019 Disease (COVID-19)

The Department is suspending annual inspections for all Community Care licensed facilities to focus its resources on containing and mitigating COVID-19 impacts but will continue to conduct complaint investigations on a timeline based on the nature of the allegation(s). Each adult and senior care residential facility will receive a scheduled visit to provide technical assistance. Also in Spanish and Chinese.

PIN20-06-CCLD - Cancellation of all Community Care Licensing Meetings

This decision is in response to Governor Gavin Newsom's announcement recommending gatherings with 250 people or more should be rescheduled or canceled, and smaller events should proceed only if the organizers can implement six feet of social distancing in order to protect public health and slow the spread of COVID-19.

PIN 20-05-CCLD – Community Care Licensing Division E-Mail Address for Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) - Related Questions

CCLD has established a dedicated e-mail address available to all licensees, providers, and the public to use in asking questions related to COVID-19.

<u>PIN 20-04-CCLD</u> – Governor's Proclamation of a State of Emergency to Address Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19)

The Proclamation permits the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) to allow waivers within its jurisdiction to address the needs of community care facilities, child day care facilities, and residential care facilities for the elderly in response to the COVID-19 crisis. ADULT AND SENIOR CARE (ASC PINs)

PIN 20-17-ASC- Temporary Contracts to Increase Bed Capacity Due to Anticipated Surge in Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)

This PIN announces an opportunity for Adult and Senior Care licensees to assist in providing additional beds by entering into contracts to temporarily house COVID-19 positive individuals.

PIN 20-16-ASC-CCR- Waiver of Advance Notice Requirements and Information on Federal Small Business Lending for COVID-19 Crisis

This PIN announces that the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) is waiving various notice requirements for Continuing Care Retirement Community (CCRC) providers seeking to apply for loans related to COVID-19 relief.

PIN 20-15-ASC - Adult and Senior Care Facilities with Coronavirus (COVID-19) Positive Cases Available on California Department of Social Services Website

This PIN announces that information regarding licensed Adult and Residential Care Facilities for the Elderly with COVID-19 positive cases of persons in care and/or staff has been posted on the California Department of Social Services website. Also in Chinese.

PIN 20-13-ASC- Notification to Families When a Person Tests Positive for Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)

This PIN advises Adult and Senior Care (ASC) licensees to give notice to the families of all persons in care when a person in a facility tests positive for COVID-19.

PIN 20-12-ASC - Statewide Waiver for Medical Assessments Due to Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)

This PIN provides information on a statewide waiver for certain medical assessment requirements of all adult and senior care facilities in response to the occurrence of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) in California.

<u>PIN 20-09-ASC</u> - Notice of Tele-Inspections and Rapid Assistance and Support Team (RAST) Tele-Visits

In order to best protect our employees, avoid harm to the higher-needs populations and support providers, CCLD will implement "tele-inspections" for pre-licensing inspections, case management inspections and complaints that are not Priority 1 level allegations. Also in <u>Spanish</u>, <u>Chinese</u> and <u>Tagalog</u>.

Community Care Licensing has also assembled a Rapid Assistance and Support Team (RAST) to provide COVID-19 technical assistance to providers.

<u>PIN 20-07-ASC</u> - Prevention, Containment, Mitigation Measures, and Statewide Waiver for Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)

This PIN provides general recommendations for prevention, containment, and mitigation of COVID-19 for ASC facilities and guidance regarding statewide waiver for certain licensing requirements such as visitation, planned activities and building & grounds waivers.

PIN 20-04-ASC – Guidance on 2019 Novel Coronavirus or COVID-19

Facilities should prepare for possible impacts of COVID-19 and take precautions to prevent the spread of COVID-19 as well as other infectious diseases, including influenza and gastroenteritis. Please contact your <u>local health department</u> immediately if you have someone with a confirmed case of COVID-19 in your facility and/or suspect an outbreak in your facility. In addition, adult and senior care program licensees are required to report a suspected or confirmed outbreak of COVID-19 to your local Adult and Senior Care Regional Office, and the persons' in care authorized representative.

PIN 20-02-ASC - Information Regarding the Coronavirus Disease 2019

The World Health Organization (WHO) has identified and named the recent public viral outbreak of the coronavirus as the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). The coronavirus itself is a large family of viruses that, while not new, have different strains. The COVID-19 strain is a newly identified strain that causes respiratory illness similar to influenza.
