

COVID-19 Testing in Rhode Island

COVID-19 testing is available at some local pharmacies, medical offices, and State-run test sites across Rhode Island. To find the location closest to you, visit <u>covid.ri.gov/testing</u>.

Schedule an appointment for a free COVID-19 test at a State-run test site at **portal.ri.gov** or by calling **401-222-8022**.

Symptoms of COVID-19? Isolate at home and get tested.

If you or your child have symptoms, call your primary care provider or child's pediatrician. Ask if they do point-of-care testing or if they can schedule a test for you. Whether or not you're up to date with your vaccinations, it is important that you isolate at home and get tested right away.

COVID-19 symptoms include:

- cough
- shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- fever or chills
- muscle or body aches

- headache
- nausea or vomiting
- diarrhea
- runny nose or stuffy nose
- fatigue
- recent loss of taste or smell

sore throat

If you're a close contact of someone who tested positive, get tested 5 days after the last time you were with that person, even if you don't have symptoms. For information about quarantine, visit <u>covid.ri.gov/whattodo</u>.
