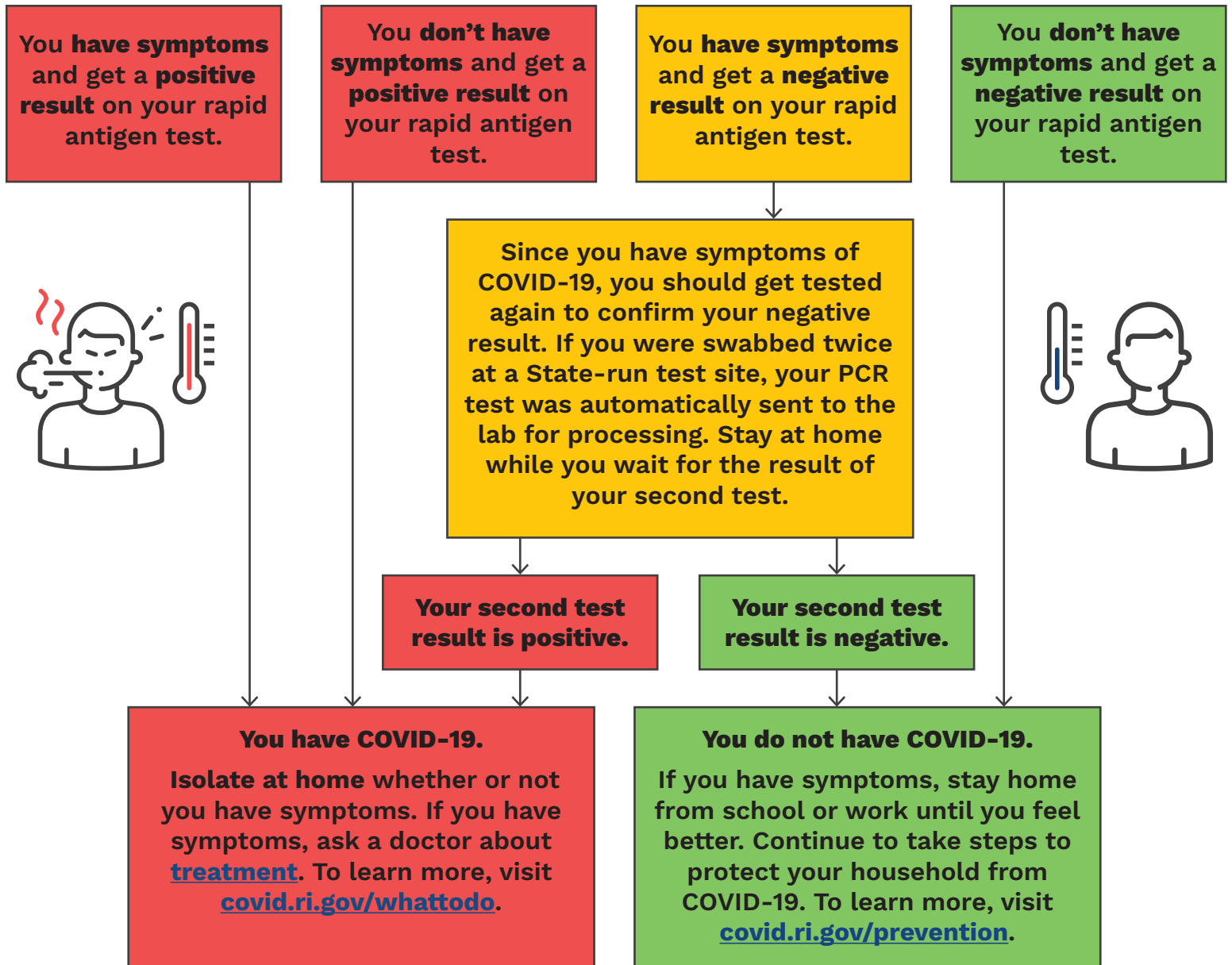


I got a COVID-19 rapid antigen test. Should I get tested again?

If you have symptoms of COVID-19 and get a negative result on a rapid antigen test, the Rhode Island Department of Health recommends you get tested again. Schedule a nucleic acid amplification test (NAAT) or polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test at a test site, pharmacy, clinic, or primary care office. If you recently tested positive for COVID-19, RIDOH does not recommend getting tested again for the following 90 days. Someone who has COVID-19 can continue to get a positive test result for up to 90 days. For more information, visit covid.ri.gov/testresults.
