
The Losses Caused By Hyperemesis Gravidarum

cDC: "...there is little evidence to suggest that overall maternal morbidity is decreasing. None of these estimates take into account women with complications who were not hospitalized...; therefore, they underestimate the true magnitude of maternal morbidity. Potential reductions in maternal morbidity depend on a greater understanding of their etiologies and patterns."



1 out of 4 HG pregnancies are aborted, die, or do not make it to term.

At least 10% of all HG pregnancies are terminated due to inadequate care.



Despite published reports that hyperemesis gravidarum has no impact on ultimate perinatal outcome, this study indicated that women admitted repeatedly have a more severe nutritional disturbance, associated with significantly reduced maternal weight gain and neonatal birth weight.

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

Costs During Pregnancy

Typical Cost of an Inadequately Managed HG Patient



Total cost of singleton pregnancy. JB, Maine. 2003. Based on Medical Insurance Summaries.

Annual Inpatient Hospitalization

Average Hospitalization Stay = \$7,100

Total Annual Hospitalizations = 60,000

Total = \$426M

Cost of Zofran = \$3,400/month

**Zofran reportedly 4 times more effective compared with the other top 10 drugs given which were reported to be effective by less than 50% of participants. (HER Foundation Survey)
