- Identifying, addressing and removing misconceptions and barriers in our organization, including process, practices, programs, and services.
- Creating accessible performances.
- Offering free community outreach projects such as Theatre Outreach Productions, Theatre Tours and Workshops, Dance in Schools and Brain Break Resources for Teachers, as well as paid Internship Opportunities.
