

A Destination Campus

Napa Valley College's tree-lined main campus sits on a 160-acre site overlooking the Napa River in the heart of the world famous Napa Valley wine-producing region. Napa Valley College offers outstanding facilities, from a world class Performing Arts Center to a state-of-the-art Library and



Learning Resources Center. The college's Viticulture and Winery Technology Program is centered at the Napa Valley Vintners' Teaching Winery and Trefethen Family Viticulture Center. Its 16-acre vineyard provides grapes for the college's award-winning NVC Estate Wines, produced and marketed by students. The college's Upper Valley Campus and Napa Valley Cooking School are located in St. Helena where many community education (non-credit) classes in art, food, wine, and foreign languages also take place. A variety of classes are also offered at off-campus locations throughout Napa County, including at American Canyon High School and in Calistoga. NVC's Small Business Development Centers are headquartered on the college's main campus with satellite activities throughout Sonoma and Napa Counties. Napa Valley College also boasts a 6.5-acre solar energy array that supplies power to the college's main campus.
