LOWER BASEMENT

Lower basement of the Garages houses several treasures of Rashtrapati Bhavan. These include various paintings and sculptures of the Vice-regal period. A 3D theater and a seven screen projection showcasing life in Rashtrapati Bhavan are also here.

Registration charges is Rs. 50/- per visitor. The registration charges are payable online and will be non refundable and non- transferable



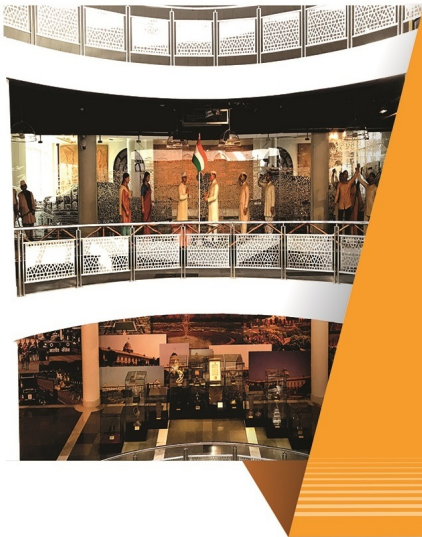

RASHTRAPATI BHAVAN MUSEUM COMPLEX

Rashtrapati Bhavan Museum tells the story of the legacy of Indian Presidents and the history of freedom struggle under one roof. The Museum showcases more than 2000 artefacts including rare paintings from British Era. The Rashtrapati Bhavan Museum is an event based story telling Museum showcasing the exquisite and invaluable artefacts symbolizing Art, Culture, Heritage and History.

The Museum Complex comprises of three heritage buildings. The first is the Presidential Stables, second is the Presidential Garage and the third one is the Clock Tower. Originally The Clock Tower was known as Band House built for band practice of the British Army. Through the years The Clock Tower served as the post office and also as residential quarters

The three structures were beautifully restored and brought back to past glory. Stables and Garage now serve as museum while the Clock tower is the visitor reception area

The museum in Stables was officially inaugurated on July 25th, 2014 by the Hon'ble President of India. This museum has created enclaves which house numerous gifts the Presidents of India received over the years

The Garage was transformed into a new museum and inaugurated on 25th July 2016 by Hon'ble Prime Minister. This repository sprawling over an area of 10,000 square meters showcases past as well as current Presidencies, regal ceremonies, rich flora and fauna of the Presidential Estate and much more. They offer visitors a complete package of art, culture, environment, heritage and history of Rashtrapati Bhavan

The Rashtrapati Bhavan Museum (Garage) has three floors, Ground Floor, Upper Basement and Lower Basement. A Mezzanine Floor is also part of the Museum which caters to children activities

GROUND FLOOR

At the entrance of this floor are displayed three carriages viz a Victoria, a Training and a Luggage Coach as well as a Mercedes Benz 500SEL, all of which were in use in various Presidencies and subsequently shifted to their present location.

The other display areas on the ground floor are dedicated to Making of Raisina Hill buildings. Further divided into ten smaller enclaves, it shows the preconstruction terrain of the Raisina Hill, construction stages of Rashtrapati Bhavan, its current aerial view, Parliament House, North Block and South Block. A scale model of Rashtrapati Bhavan with sculptures of important people associated with its construction can be seen.

This floor has a section with original letters, architectural drawings, furniture sketches and watercolors of Sir Edwin Lutyens, the famous architect of Rashtrapati Bhavan. Visitors will find here the distinctive, often quirky furniture designed by Lutyens—tables, benches and different types of chairs

Central area of the Ground Floor is being used to showcase the Freedom Movement and Legislative milestones. Through animated stage setting and interactive computer multimedia

techniques, this enclave showcases the important movements such as Nationalist Movement (1905-09), Morley-Minto Reforms, Jalianwala Bagh Massacre and other important events leading to freedom. Audio narrations for each section are also available.

Another display area on the right hand side of the entrance is related to the Indian Constitution. Right from drafting of the Constitution by the drafting committee, to getting access to important articles and all pages of the Constitution of India, this section has it all

UPPER BASEMENT

The Upper Basement is dedicated to the Presidents of India. It has holographic projections, three dimensional busts of Presidents speaking to visitors. Also on display are cabinets with personal belongings/memorabilia of former and current Presidents of India.

A display area showing the Virtual Reality allows visitors to walk out of Rashtrapati Bhavan with Mahatma Gandhi.
