



SCI support for the distribution of donated drugs in Ethiopia

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Background

Ethiopia has a significant burden of schistosomiasis and soil-transmitted helminths (STHs). Political momentum and donor advocacy is building behind large-scale control of many neglected tropical diseases (NTDs) in the country, including schistosomiasis and STHs. The Federal Ministry of Health recently launched the country's national NTD Master Plan in June 2013. In order to support the initiation of control against schistosomiasis the Ministry of Health requested donations of praziquantel and mebendazole to treat schistosomiasis and STHs respectively.

Merck Serono (via the WHO) have donated 3.5 million tablets of praziquantel (sufficient to treat approximately 1.4 million school-aged children) and Johnson and Johnson (via Children Without Worms have donated 6.8 million tablets of mebendazole (sufficient to treat 6.8 million school-aged children). These drugs are due to expire at the end of October 2013 so it is imperative that they are distributed before then.

Financial Support for Drug Distribution

The SCI has provided \$250,000 directly to the Federal Ministry of Health to support the distribution of these drugs in Amhara, Oromiya, SNNPR, and Somali regions (Dire Dawa and Harrar will support the distribution of the small amount of drugs they have themselves). Of this amount, £223,998 has been distributed to the regions to support these MDA campaigns (89.6% disbursed). In addition, the SCI has provided a grant of \$98,788 to the Nala Foundation to support treatment campaigns in four areas of Tigray region. All the available drugs have now been distributed to the regions, as per the Table below.
