What is Quality Improvement?

Quality Improvement Specifically Seeks To...

- Standardize processes.
- Standardize structures to reduce variation.
- Seeks to achieve predictable results.
- Improves outcomes for patients, healthcare systems, and organizations.

What is Quality Improvement?

Measures can be Used to Inform the Work of...

- Perinatal Quality Collaboratives (PQC)
- State or multi-state networks working to improve the quality of perinatal care.
- Maternal Mortality Review Commissions (MMRC)
- State- or city-wide committees to review deaths within one year postpartum.
